The Case of Policeman Anglis was taken up and Mrs. Waugh's Letter read Anglis denied the abusive language complained of in the Letter but acknowledged that he had some words with her on the night in question Mrs.

October 27th

Waugh's evidence was nearly the same as her written complaint and was partly corroborated by a witness named Mc Grath who was present in her house at the time from the evidence there is no doubt that Anglis quitted with Mrs. Waugh with whom he was formerly friendly as he acknowledged having drunk in her house he has been keeping a sharp look out for any violation of the Law having received instructions from his superior officers to watch the houses as there were strong suspicion that liquor was sold there on Sundays and after Eleven O'clock at night

The Committee under these circumstances reprimanded Anglis and dismissed the complaint according to the City Marshal record Anglis since he joined the force in 1874 has been reported three times for drunkenness and once for assault and was fined for each offence from five to Ten Dollars

Policeman Keating was called an anonymous letter was received by the Editor of one of the daily papers (who handed it to the City Marshal) stating that a policeman off duty on the 18th Sept. was drunk and fighting on the Street the City Marshal knowing that Keating was the policeman referred to reported the matter to the Committee the evidence in this case was altogether in favour of the accused Policeman Anglis was endeavouring to separate some persons who were quarreling when Keating came along and assisted him, several Witnesses made the same statement and all of them said that Keating was sober The complaint was dismissed Policeman Keating has been five years on the force and reported three times

Policeman Kuhn's case was the next Sergeant Francis stated that a prisoner was brought into the Station on the 7th October and was searched and a knife belonging to him was laid on the desk Kuhn came in took up the knife and refused to give it to the Sergeant and walked out of the Station the prisoner's fine was paid in the morning when he asked for his knife which could not be found when Sergeant Francis saw Kuhn again he asked for the knife Kuhn used abusive language to him and said he had not got the knife Policeman Nicherson heard Kuhn abusing Sergeant Francis

Policeman Kuhn admitted having taken up the knife and when he refused giving it back he was only chaffing he said that he went over to the desk and laid it on the desk before he went out

Sergeant Francis denied that he went to the desk as he saw him leave the room and walk out the door the knife was subsequently found under some dovers in the desk

Policeman Kuhn joined the force in 1873 and has been reported seven times for insubordination and neglect of duty and figuring sick.

Policeman Brumman has been reported twelve times since he has been on the force and has been several times fined he was one of the Police who left their beat for the purpose of arresting Man of War Sailors a short time ago.

Policeman Miles was not present when his case was called he has been reported three times within three months for drunkenness he was also one of the Police who left their duty to hunt up Man of War Sailors
