In consequence of a discussion that took place at a Meeting of the City Council early last month the Chairman convened the Police Committee together for the purpose of ascertaining the present standing, efficiency and general conduct of the Force: as also to enquire whether the necessity existed for additional policemen to the south end of the City.

Your Committee have held several Meetings and proceeded with the examination of a large number of Witnesses embracing the City Marshal, Deputy Marshal and Sergeants of Police

As the result of a thorough and careful investigation your Committee beg leave to report as follows:—

That as appears from the evidence produced the Police Force is at the present time in a satisfactory state of efficiency well qualified the men satisfactorily performing the duty under proper discipline

No New cases either of intemperance drunkenness, or neglect of duty have been reported since the cases already dealt with and disposed of by His Worship the Mayor

No outside evidence was offered or tendered to the Committee altho the fullest opportunity was given for the production of any evidence if parties deemed it

Your Committee would recommend the vesting the exclusive management of the Police Force in the hands of the City Marshal with sole power to appoint, suspend or dismiss The Marshal to be directly responsible to the City Council for the good conduct and efficiency of the Force

That hereafter the Policemen to be appointed shall be not less than 5 feet 7 inches in height and shall be required to pass satisfactory Medical examination by the City Medical Officer

That men who have been a long time in the force, and who by reason of long service have become less able than formerly to perform both day and night duty should be assigned the lighter duties of Messengers &c

Divisions shall change the Sergeant to remain on their accustomed beats

That your Committee have under their consideration and will be prepared to report whenever they receive information which they have asked for as to the propriety of adopting "Hell-Tales" by which the Police will be compelled to present themselves at given points during certain hours of the night

With reference to the protection required at the South end of the City your Committee are satisfied that in order to give the needed protection to that end of the City at least two additional Policemen will be necessary

Your Committee would recommend that the City Council should at the earliest period practicable restore to the members of the Force the ten per cent which is now deducted from their pay

That Legislation will be required to carry out many of the foregoing suggestions That until such Legislation is obtained Your Committee would suggest that all cases of misbehavior shall be reported to the Police Committee to be dealt with

Your Committee believe it to be their duty to suggest such changes in the force that will be a guard and protection to the lives and property of the Citizens and that this is the proper line to initiate necessary changes and improvements As far as consistent with the public interests all the offices (with the exception perhaps of the City Marshal who acts as City Sheriff in executing the process of the City Civil Court) should be open as a reward to the men for good and faithful service and that in every case personal merit intelligence zeal and activity above should be the ground of promotion

Your Committee also recommend the acceptance of Policeman Connolly's resignation
