Report on proposed regulations respecting the extension of the Intercolonial Railway along the East side of Water Street to the new Deep Water Terminus submitted by Wallace Graham Esq on 21<sup>st</sup> July 1882

On the 31<sup>st</sup> May 1881 a few regulations were drafted in this office but they have not yet to my knowledge been before the City Council for approval. A copy of this draft is attached hereto and it has also been copied (with some alterations) into and forms part of the document submitted by Mr Graham, but how it came into his possession or to the knowledge of the Railway Department I am unable to say.

It is necessary to bear in mind that the regulations drafted in May 1881 had reference solely to the Railway Extension as it was then proposed to be made A plan of which signed by L. Schreiber Esq. Chief Engineer J. L. R. was at that time in the hands of the Mayor and a copy accompanies this report. The plan then indicated the Railway as turning or curving to the eastward off of Water Street at a point 230 feet to the north of Gerish Street and from thence running southwardly along the East side of the Street but not through the Street as is now contemplated

The Railway extension as it now exists occupies Water Street for a width of 15 feet and a length of about 300 feet near the foot of Gerish St. more than the plan submitted to the Mayor indicated would be required or taken

The regulations proposed and submitted by Mr Graham are inconsistent as they not only contain a description of the lands required as defined upon the plan of 1881 but they also contain another description embracing all the ground for a width of 15 feet on the East side of Water Street from a point 230 feet North of Gerish Street (which was the former Southern limit) to the south side line of the Granite Half property this is a length of about 850 more than it was ever contemplated would be required by the Railway Department and if they have

September 12<sup>th</sup> the right to take it now and different regulations will be necessary. It should also be stated that the width asked for in 1881 was 14 feet whereas the fence has been placed at 15 feet from the East side of the Street and the figures 15 have also been substituted for 14 in the proposed regulations.

On the 25<sup>th</sup> ultimo by directions from the Board of Works a communication was sent to the Resident Engineers of which the following is a copy

The alteration of the Board of Works of this City having been called to the fact that the Railway Department contemplate removing the railway fence South of Gerish Street and extending the track along the East side of Water Street to a point near the "Granite Wharf" I am requested to say that the railway fence now encloses the East side of Water Street for a width of 15 feet and a length of about 300 feet more than the plan submitted by your Department to the City Council in 1881 indicated or the City intended to convey and that no further encroachment on Upper Water Street for Railway purposes will be permitted until sanctioned by the City Council."

Mr Archibald's reply to this, which unfortunately has been lost, was to the effect that my letter would be referred to the Chief Superintendent but that as he understood the matter it is the intention of the Department to lay the track through Water Street as far south as the Granite Wharf as he asserts a recent Act of the Legislature empowers them to do

If this is to be done I am of opinion that the obstruction to traffic and the inconvenience which will be occasioned will be very great, and the regulations contained in the document submitted by Mr Graham while they are sufficient for the extension as it was designed last year cannot be made applicable to the further extension of the railway through Water Street without causing general dissatisfaction.

As I understand the matter the regulations should be prepared by the Railway Department and submitted to the Council for approval and if the rails are to be laid through Water Street to the Granite Wharf the following are the chief points which seem to me should be taken into consideration.

September 12<sup>th</sup>

1<sup>st</sup> The track to be laid level with the finished grade of the street

2<sup>nd</sup> The street to be paved from the East side up to the rails, between the rails and for a distance of about 3 feet west of the west rail in such a manner and with such materials as the City Council shall approve of and so that vehicles may run along the street and cross the rails without inconvenience. The pavement always to be maintained in good condition

3<sup>rd</sup> A suitable fence to be approved of by the City Council to be erected and maintained along the East side of Water Street from Gerich Street to Granite Wharf and no more of Water Street to be fenced off than is now enclosed by the existing railway fence

4<sup>th</sup> No Engine or car of any description to be left standing upon the street for any purpose

5<sup>th</sup> The speed of Engines or cars when passing through the unenclosed portion of the street is to be limited to not more than three miles per hour and no hunting to be allowed upon the street

6<sup>th</sup> The Engine bell to be kept ringing constantly while the Engine is passing through the unenclosed portion of the street and a sufficient number of watchmen or signal men are always to be on hand to warn persons upon the street and to prevent accidents

7<sup>th</sup> All fire hydrants and lamps fastened with to be removed to such positions as the City Council may direct and all connections with the same to be made good

8<sup>th</sup> All water pipes, gas pipes, sewers, drains, catch pits and gratings and any other works or structures on or under the streets which may in any way be injured, interfered with or rendered difficult of access are to be removed altered or rebuilt as the City Council may direct

9<sup>th</sup> All curb stones, gutter stones, blocks or other materials of value to be carefully taken up and deposited where the City Council may direct

10<sup>th</sup> The Railway Department to provide efficient drainage for all the water that may fall upon the Eastern side of the street and to be responsible for damages of any nature whatever which may be occasioned by reason of the said extension

Gentlemen

In pursuance of the resolution of the Council of 12<sup>th</sup> inst. I have considered the report of the Board of Works and the Act of the Legislature of Nova Scotia passed in April 1881 which provides that "The said Railway (Intercolonial) or a branch thereof may be extended from any point on said Upper Water Street to Northward of said water lot (City lot) along the eastern side of said Street to the Wharf known as Granite Wharf under such regulations as may be approved of by the City Council for the protection of the public" and am of opinion that the legal rights acquired by the Dominion Government under said Act are as follows.

That the Government has the right to extend under certain regulations, the Intercolonial Railway down the eastern side of Upper Water Street to Granite Wharf

The said right is an easement or right of way only and should be exercised under regulations approved of by the City Council so as to interfere as little as possible with the public use of the Street. The Government has no right to the exclusive use of any portion of the Street or to fence off any part of it unless the regulations permit it to be done.

The regulations refer to the construction of the road and not merely to its operation after construction, and are for the protection of the rights of the public to the use of the Street, as well as the prevention of accidents from the trains passing over it. and such regulation can be formed so as to embrace the points suggested by the City Engineer in his report to the Board of Works, if they meet with the approval of the Council

The regulations should have been prepared and submitted for approval before the extension was commenced and it is very doubtful whether the Government has any right to extend the railway over any part of the Street until this has been done.

Your Committee divided the main subject into the following subdivisions:

1<sup>st</sup> The Water Supply for Fire purposes 2<sup>nd</sup> State of apparatus 3<sup>rd</sup> Fire Alarm Telegraph. 4<sup>th</sup> Personnel of the Fire Department.

**1<sup>st</sup> Water Supply** The City Engineer states as his opinion that with proper attention to the concentration of water into the district threatened the Fire hydrants can be relied on to any extent, and in general when the pressure is on the work of the Steam Engines can be limited.

The Engineer recommends that a sufficient number of men connected with the Water Department of the City be thoroughly trained in the system of concentration and in the knowledge of the various pressures at all points of the City.

On this point your Committee would advise that the City Council instruct the City Board of Works to carry the recommendation of the Engineer into operation and take the necessary steps to have a sufficient number of the permanent employees trained in the rapid and skilful concentration of water for the use of the Fire Department.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> State of the apparatus

The Board of Firewards report the apparatus in possession of the Fire Department with few exceptions to be in good condition and serviceable. The several Engines and Hose carts are considered sufficient for the present wants of the Department and with a few hose sleds now being prepared for winter use the several stations may be considered as fairly supplied in these particulars.

The Firewards state that they require from 1000 to 1500 feet of rubber hose immediately some having been lost at the Poor House Fire and also they at once require a proper Ladder Waggon to supersede the present cumbersome hand carts and are of the opinion that a proper Ladder Waggon is the great want of the Department as though there seems to be an ample supply of ladders of a good quality the locomotion of the same is of the crudest description.

Your Committee would that authority be given to purchase say 1000 feet of approved rubber hose, and that plan and specifications of a suitable Ladder Waggon be obtained and tenders asked for the immediate construction of the same also that the Firewards be instructed to arrange for its conveyance to and from Fires. Your Committee also recommend that shorter ladders with a number of light ropes with fastenings be provided to be used as fire escapes.

Pending expected reports from the City Engineer on the subject of fire escapes also reports from His Worship the Major and Alderman MacLoy your Committee will not make further recommendations with regard to apparatus till after their returns.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Fire Alarm System

The Board of Firewards and Heads of the Fire Department state that the present system of giving alarms is

1<sup>st</sup> A systematic revision of houses and stations where alarm boxes are located so that Keepers of Keys should be made interested in assisting for speedy giving of alarms.

2<sup>nd</sup> That the number of the house where the key is to be found be painted either on or near the box and in luminous paint if possible so that it may be read easily at night

3<sup>rd</sup> That night bells be provided for engine houses where Keepers live to facilitate the giving of alarms.

4<sup>th</sup> That the stoker in the Queen Street Alarm Station be sheltered from the weather and the tower be made water tight

5<sup>th</sup> That steps be taken to increase the number of alarm boxes especially on buildings in which large numbers of people live or work such as Hotels, Factories, Barracks, Hospital &c

#### Personnel of the Fire Department

In the opinion of the Firewards the volunteer system is considered at present as suitable to the needs of the City and they recommend an additional grant of \$100 to the Hook and Ladder Company to enable the members to give more time to perfecting themselves in their duties

It will be satisfactory to the City Council to know that an examination of the minutes of the Board of Firewards shews that every request made by the Board with a view of perfecting the apparatus and work of the Fire Department (with the exception of the Ladder Wagon) has been acceded to the Council

Your Committee think a third Engineer should be provided to work the third Steamer as they are of opinion that the sum of \$800 is ample for the three engines

The cost of fitting up stalls and making the needed alterations in the Engine House to provide stabling for horses would be about Five Hundred Dollars and the providing of sleeping apartments for Engineers in the Stations would be about Three Hundred Dollars

The provisional contract for supply of horses to drag the engines to and from fires is \$600 subject to ratification

December 20<sup>th</sup> To The Mayor and Aldermen  
of Halifax

The Delegation appointed by your Council proceeded to Ottawa and there met the other Delegates from the various Provinces of the Dominion except British Columbia and Manitoba. On our arrival the Convention met at two o'clock P.M. and continued in session with but a short intermission for twelve hours continuously, discussing the various questions submitted to it in relation to Vital Statistics.

After a long discussion the first four of the following resolutions were passed by the Convention:

Resolved: That in order the better to prevent disease and preserve human life it is advisable that the Dominion Government should organize and sustain a uniform system of vital statistics for the Dominion;

Resolved: That as immediate action is necessary the Federal Government be invited to initiate at once a system of vital statistics where organized local Boards of Health are established, so that statistical information may be utilized by these bodies;

Resolved: That as Provincial legislative action is necessary it is suggested to the Federal Government that it communicate with and secure the cooperation of the Provincial Government to pass such legislation as will harmonize with and obtain the object of the preceding resolutions.

Resolved: That it is desirable that a central bureau of Vital Statistics be established and if found to be within the Province of the Federal Government a comprehensive system of health returns;

Resolved: That inasmuch as it appears by the British North America Act matters of public health are regulated by the Local Governments this delegation has not included it with the subject of Vital Statistics nevertheless they are of the opinion that it would have been better had it been placed under the direction of the Federal Government, and beg to suggest that an effort be made to obtain an amendment to the constitution in that direction.

The fourth Resolution led to a great deal of discussion many members of the Convention feeling that the question of public health was one within the powers of the Local Legislatures only, while others considered that that burden should be assumed by the Dominion Government.

The next morning the Delegates met for breakfast, by request when the question was again discussed and the last of the foregoing resolutions was passed with the understanding that negotiations should be opened between the Dominion and Local Governments with the intention of obtaining the views of the various Local Governments on the question and if they were willing an Imperial Act should be passed transferring Public Health to the Dominion.

1882

December 20<sup>th</sup> Dominion Government, or the latter agreeing to assume that responsibility, but if the consent of the Local Legislatures could not be obtained then that the Dominion and Local Legislatures should pass such laws as would harmonize and enable both subjects to be carried out.

After this conference the Delegation was convened again with a view of hearing a scheme proposed by Dr. Tache, the Deputy Minister of Agriculture to carry out as far as possible the object of the Convention.

That scheme proposed to divide \$15.00 among all the cities of the Dominion the population of which should not be less than 25,000, and having Boards of Health the amount apportioned to each city to be handed to the Board of Health of such city and expended under its direction. one fourth of the amount so given is to be paid by the Board to any Medical Officer appointed by it for his services in collecting and making a return to the Dominion Government of Vital Statistics and the balance spent in expenses connected therewith. The amount that will be received by this Council will be about \$750<sup>00</sup> which we understand will be considerably increased next year.

We understood that it was the intention of the Minister of Agriculture to make rules & regulations for collecting the statistics under section 28 of the Act of 1879. Under those regulations and also by section 34 of the same Act the Minister will be empowered to cause special statistical investigations as regards disease in various parts of the Province its cause, and to take steps to prevent its spreading if the latter duty is within the power of the Dominion Government and it is this difficulty that will prevent the great advantages which would otherwise accrue the duty of preventing the spreading of disease being within the power of the Local Legislatures.

While at Ottawa a Dominion Sanitary Association was formed

In re Master

This was a proceeding in the Insolvent Court to test the right of the City to have the amount due for Taxes by Insolvent persons paid in full out of their estates under sections 341 and 342 of the City Charter. The Majority of the Court has decided that these sections were repealed by the Insolvent Act and that the City would have to claim pro rata with the other creditors. The chief Justice dissented. With all due deference to the judgment of the Court I humbly think that it is erroneous and would not be sustained and if the Insolvent law was still in force I would strongly advise an appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada. But as the amount is small and no other question can arise unless indeed a new insolvent law is passed it may not be worth while to incur the expense of an appeal. I should like to know in the course of a few days what you think best about it.
