Read Report from His Honor the Recorder in the various Memorials presented against the selling liquor by license in Ward No Six

Recorder's Office
April 30th 1883

Dear Sir

I have read over the Memorials from the several Churches and Temperance Bodies on the subject of licenses which were submitted to the City Council on the 20th inst. but have been unable to find any authority to sustain the contention of the Memorialists which is as I understand it, that no licenses can be legally granted in the city unless the petitions have been filed with the City Clerk before the 15th March last. By Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1874 the City Council is empowered to grant licenses upon the recommendation of the License Committee concurred in by two thirds of the Committee accompanied by a petition &c: there is no time fixed for granting or authorizing the licenses and the City Council can do so at any meeting on the report of the License Committee.

Chapter 18 of the Acts of 1877 provides that "the petitions for licenses shall be deposited with the Clerk or at the office of the Town Council as the case may be, at least one week previous to the time for authorizing the granting of such license".

In the City of Halifax there is no time fixed for authorizing the granting of the licenses and the law is complied with if the petition is filed at a sufficient time before the Meeting of the City Council at which it is to be considered.

There is no reference in the license law to the 15th of March that is a date fixed by the City Council on which all licenses terminate in order to avoid difficulties and complications that would arise if every license was to be in force twelve months from the date of issue.

Besides this it is extremely doubtful whether the provision in the Act of 1877 refers to the City of Halifax at all, for Section 2 of Chapter 12 of the Acts of 1879 provides that no application for license shall be entertained by the City Council unless the petition is filed with the City Clerk and notice posted for at least ten days previous and a subsequent section repeals all existing enactments.

Although all the licenses expired on 15th March, the holders of old licenses have for some years past been allowed time to put in their petitions, and to continue the sale, with the understanding that the petitions would be perfected in a reasonable time and in order to stop this the License Committee passed a resolution requiring that petitions for the renewal of licenses should be put in before the 1st March and if that was not done proceedings should be taken after 15th March for breach of the licenses. This resolution was approved by the Council and has probably led to the presenting of the Memorials in question. That resolution could not alter the law in respect to licenses or prevent any person from obtaining a license on the ground that his petition was not filed before 1st March but in accordance therewith proceedings should be taken to stop the sale of liquor by all persons who have not taken out a license for the present year.

Report on a letter from Messrs Mottor & Langley threatening an action against the City by reason of alleged damage to property on Lumpool Road owned by Dr. E. Jennings

I have carefully examined the ground where it is stated that the damage had been occasioned and can find no traces of any damage whatever except at a point where Dr. Jennings or his tenant had placed a private bridge across the street ditch. This bridge caused a stoppage of the water which overflowed and ran across the sidewalk onto the Doctor's grounds but I cannot see that the City is in the smallest degree liable. To the East of these grounds is a field which is also owned by Dr. Jennings. This field is now in a soft and boggy condition owing to two causes. 1st the absence of drainage and 2nd from the fact that the water from the adjacent property flows over it. The City is in no way responsible for this.

I have therefore to report that Dr. Jennings claim is in my opinion without foundation and that his property if unfit for occupation as asserted has not been rendered so by any work or action done or taken by the City. It is true that there was a flow of water down the street ditch last Autumn, which came from an under drain along side of the water pipe; but this flow of water did not to my knowledge cause any damage and it was diverted back to its old channel very shortly after it made its first appearance.
