Halifax Graving Dock Company (Limited) be favorably considered by this Council and that if the details can be satisfactorily arranged an agreement be entered into with the said company to construct a permanent granite faced Graving Dock of not less than 580 feet in length, and 100 feet in width in the clear inside measurement at coping level with at least 30 feet draft of water over the sill at entrance at high water ordinary spring tide and in other respects to conform with the requirements of the City Council.

The said agreement to set forth among other things that the City of Halifax will contribute a subsidy of \$10,000 per annum for 20 years to the said company in conformity with the Act of the Local Legislature in relation thereto. The agreement not to be considered completed until plans and specifications have been approved of and signed by the City Engineer on behalf of the City.

Further Resolved That the Mayor the Recorder, Alderman Sedgewick and the City Engineer be a Committee to draft the agreement and that they be requested to submit the same to this Council for approval at its next Meeting. Moved by Alderman MacLellan seconded by Alderman MacInnes.
