Policeman Anglis was charged by several Soldiers of the West Riding Regt. with being drunk and unnecessarily interfering with them on the Streets of the City. Annexed hereto is the evidence of the complainants in support of the charge. The accused denied all their statements and produced two witnesses who testified that the Policeman was sober and that several soldiers were disorderly on the Street but could not identify any of them.

Policeman Wilson was arraigned for being drunk on duty on the night of the 2nd inst. Sergt. Nickerson said the accused was very drunk, staggering and unfit for duty, corroborated by the City Marshal. Admitted by accused, Ald. Bechler and O'Brien moved he be fined Ten Dollars. To this the Chairman dissented and recommended the dismissal of the accused.

At a meeting of the Committee of Laws and Privileges held this evening present: Aldermen Pearson, Smith, Mc Pherson and the Chairman.

The Committee considered the following matters referred to the Committee by the Council and recommend as follows:

1 That permission be given to the Board of Trade of Halifax to use the Coat of Arms of the city as a portion of the official seal of said Board.

2 That Charles Mc Barthy and William R. Bogswell be appointed Coal Measurers.

3 In reference to the Provincial Secretary's letters of the 15th February and 22nd March of the present year the Committee can see no reason for the Council doing anything further in the matter than it has done in the past protesting against the injustice of the claim and asking that the city's claim for compensation for the Hospital and grounds be referred to arbitration or the Courts, freed from the adverse and one sided legislation of the past few years.

Mr. Fielding is in error in saying that the Council has not protested against the legislation on this subject and pointed out good reasons to his Government why the Act of 1888, he refers to, should not be complied with.

In March 1887 the then Rec-order, Mr. Sedgewick prepared a special report, setting out all the

1889.

April 2nd the facts in connection with the unjust award that had been made against the City and recommending that no steps be taken to pay the amount of the award and the Council unanimously approved of the same and sent a memorial embodying the same and the views of the Council to Mr Fieldings Government asking that the Province compensate the City for the present Hospital and grounds and that such compensation be fixed at \$83,000.00 to which memorial no formal or satisfactory response has ever been given.

Last season when the Act of 1888 to which he refers was introduced into the Legislature the Council passed a unanimous resolution setting out the facts again and protesting against the passage of any such Act as it was not just to the City, since then a Special Committee from the Council waited upon the Government to explain the City's reason for not paying the moneys claimed under that Act.

As it was at Mr. Fieldings instance and after having a personal explanation with him that the City Council on the 30th June 1886. agreed to hand over the Hospital to the Government after having at a previous meeting decided to accept it under the Public Charities Act and carry it on as a civic Institution and as Mr. Fielding assured the Council of that day that the right of the City for compensation for the Hospital should not be prejudiced by the transfer, the Committee consider that his Government is morally bound to refer the matter to Arbitration or to the Courts if the Government considers the price put upon the Building and grounds by the City \$83,000.00 as excessive

It may be that the Government by its own Act of 1888 and by its previous Act of 1886. is in a position under the guise of Law to work an injustice to the City by compelling the payment of the amount claimed by these Acts but the Council must in the interest of the citizens of Halifax protest against any such Act and refuse to be a party to paying the Government any sum under the late Arbitration until compensation is made to the City for the property which under the Public Charities Act of 1886 passed to the City and which the City subsequently transferred to the Government on the understanding and agreement that it was to be paid for.
