1st That the annexed Report and the recitals therein stated in so far as they extend - fairly expresses the wishes of the Council.

2nd That the said Council and Board of Trade do not in any measure waver or recede from their previously expressed claim that a short commercial Railway should be subsidized by Parliament, which claim has been recognised and conceded by Parliament

3rd That all due efforts be put forth by said delegation to secure a subsidy to be granted to the Harvey Salisbury Branch and to that proposed by the Grand Trunk Railway.

2 In reference to the communication from the Secretary of the Governors of Dalhousie College herewith returned the Committee recommend that inasmuch as the proposition to pay the College the \$500.00 was made and based on the settlement of the law suit in connection with the Grand Parade and as an off-set to their claim for the land and inasmuch as the City has since bought out the right and title of the College to the portion of the Parade vested in them by the Act of 1883 and further as the College has not applied the grant in the manner in which it was originally intended to be applied the Council should ask the Legislature to repeal the clause in question and authorize the council to pay said sum of \$500.00 per year to the Victoria Art School under the proposed clause in the draft act submitted with this Report. It appears to have been the intention of the Council tho' not so expressed in the act that the grant when made

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to the College should be applied solely for the benefit of instructions to mechanics

3 In the matter of the application of Mr Fielding as Solicitor for Max Hoboken for a return of a fine paid in the Police Court the Committee recommended that His Worship the Mayor be authorized to draw a warrant for the amount of the fine and costs paid the City on presentation of an order from the County Court Judge or a certified copy of the same directing such refund.

4 The Committee submit herewith the draft act from His Honor the Recorder referred to the Committee and have incorporated therein a clause appealing all tax exemptions in the City in accordance with the prayer of the petition from J. T. & A. H. West and other citizens referred to the Committee for that purpose.

5 The Committee have also incorporated in the act a clause authorizing the Council to borrow \$400,000.00 for sewerage purpose in accordance with the resolution passed by the Board of Health

6 The Committee have authorized the Recorder to add to said draft act provisions in regard to plumbing and inspection of water pipes and water closet fixtures which the Committee recommend to favourable consideration of the Council as necessary for sanitary purposes and to prevent the waste of water.

7. The Committee recommend that the provisions in the draft act allowing tenants who are not assessed in their own names to vote on a certificate from their Landlords should be struck out as one not keeping with the other provisions of the assessment act and as likely to lead to abuse so far as the franchise is concerned
