according to the report and that some arrangement be made
with the Street Railway Company during the construction of
the portion on Inglis Street.

Proposed new sewer Victoria Road
from Inglis St. (Northwardly.)

From an interview with some of
the petitioners I understand that if the new sewer is carried north-
wardly from Inglis St. a distance of about 580 feet it will answer
all their purposes.

A sewer 18x12 will answer in
this locality but its construction will necessitate taking up
the existing 15 inch earthenware pipe on Inglis St to the east-
ward of Victoria Road and constructing a sewer 36x24 in its
place; to discharge into the Freshwater Brook culvert in Flea-
sant Street a distance of above 300 feet.

The total estimated cost of the
whole work is \$3,500 and the estimated return in sewerage
rates \$1,820.

The construction of the Inglis St
sewer will probably necessitate the stoppage of street cars in
that locality while the work is in progress.

Whereas the Liquor License Act
of 1886 was passed by the Legislature of Nova Scotia against the
protest of this council that the same was not adapted to the
conditions of the business it was designed to regulate with
in the city of Halifax and that the same would not fully carry
out the object of good government. And whereas this Council has
good reason to believe from the evidence adduced before its Committee
by its memorialists that the opinion of this Council have
been borne out by experience. and whereas this Council is and has
been always prepared to promote and carry out all legislation
touching the maintenance of law and order within the city of
Halifax and whereas this Council has reason to believe that
the provisions of said liquor license Act are not designed in the
best interests of good government and in themselves tend in a
large measure to defeat its own object.

Now therefore be it Resolved that the
memorial of the W.L.O.T Union and the evidence adduced in ratification
of the same and all purposes touching the same be referred back
to the Committee of Laws and Privileges with instructions to take
into consideration the provisions of the said License Act and to
report to this Council whether the same are designed to conserve

Widening Lockman St. from Cornwallis to North St.

The minutes of Council on this matter is attached hereto.

On the accompanying plan I have marked off in pencilled lines the position of the Eastern side of the street if it is widened to 60 feet and also a new 60 feet approach to the Railway Station. It will be seen that there are three buildings which need not be interfered with and three others where the porches only will be cut off.

The assessment books show the total assessed value of the properties interfered with to be about \$176.000. If expropriated it is likely that this valuation would be considerably increased yet it would appear to me to be the best policy where any property is seriously injured to buy up the whole lot and resell the portion not required. If on the other hand only the land actually needed is taken and the

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damages are appraised in the usual way according to my estimation they will amount to about \$150,000.

My estimate of the work required to be done is as follows.

The City to contribute \$100,000 toward the purchase of the same with the proposal that the said Government give the City of Halifax sufficient land to widen Lockman Street to a width of not less than 70 feet.

Moved by Alderman Mosher seconded by Alderman MacIntosh to which the following amendment was introduced.

Whereas it has come to the Notice of the Council the railway accommodation in and about the City of Halifax is not sufficient for the increasing Traffic of the City.

And Whereas the Streets of the City have been greatly injured and partly destroyed by the Railway Extensions in the past and decreased the value of the property on the Line thereof. And whereas it is desirable that the Streets and the Railway accommodation now existing should be enlarged and improved upon

Therefore Resolved that the Council petition the Governor General in Council to have the Dominion Government placed sufficient sum in the Estimates for this year to purchase that portion of land situated between Water Street on the East Cornwallis Street on the South, Lockman Street on the West and North Street on the North. The City to have a Street Seventy feet in

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in width on Lockman Street and to contribute toward the above undertaking the sum of One hundred and Seventy Thousand Dollars to assist in improving the Streets and having the Railway terminus located within the City and on the above named lands.

Further Resolved that the Resolution be amended to provide that the memorial to the Governor General set out that the Council has applied to the Legislature for permission to borrow \$170,000 for the widening of Lockman Street and that the City is willing to contribute that sum if the Government will take the Blocks indicated and give the City the Street of 70 feet width required and that His Honor the Recorder be instructed to suggest to House of Assembly that the bill now before the House be amended so as to allow the appropriation for the widening of Lockman Street to be paid to the Dominion Government in the event of the Dominion taking over said Blocks.

Council Chamber

31 March 1890

At a meeting of the Committee of
Laws and Privileges held this evening present Alderman Pearson,
Hamilton, Ruggles, and Lyons (Chairman)

The Committee considered the petition of the citizens favouring High License and the Resolution of the Council referred to the Committee, and were favored with an expression of opinion on the subject of License Laws in general and the License Act of 1886 in particular from a large number of citizens who addressed the Committee.

The Committee recommend that a City Liquor License Act be prepared at once, after the model of the Dominion License Act of 1883 and submitted to the Legislature at its present session. The scope and provisions of the Act to be as follows:-

1st All Licenses for the City shall be granted by and subject to the control of a License Board to consist of His Honor the Mayor and His Honor the Recorder of the City for the time being and such third person as shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council. The Board to be paid \$6000 in full for their services and to have the appointment subject to the approval of the Council of an Inspector of Licenses who shall also act as Secretary of the Board and be paid a salary of \$12.00 and hold office until removed by the Board.

2nd The Board to have power to grant Hotel or Saloon Licenses not to exceed 48 in number for the whole City & in a ward to persons who keep Hotel or Eating houses, under which the Liquor is to be drunk on the premises and the holder of the license is not to be permitted to carry on any other business besides keeping such hotel or eating house. The fee for such license to be \$300.00 and the licensee to keep up a sign over the principal entrance Licensed to sell spirituous and fermented liquors to be drunk on the premises.

3rd The Board also have the power to grant shop licenses to the number of 60 in all (in a ward) under which

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liquors shall be sold in quantities not less than a quart unless in sealed bottles or flasks which shall not be drunk or opened on the premises. No glasses or other facilities for drinking shall be allowed to be kept in said shops. Licensed shops shall not connect with any other shop or room in which groceries or other merchandise are sold. The fee for shop licenses to be \$200.00 and the licensee to keep up a sign over the street entrance licensed to sell spirituous or fermented liquors not to be drunk on the premises.

4 The Board to have power to grant any number of wholesale licenses under which liquor is to be sold only in the original package and in quantities not less than a quarter case or 10 gallons. The fee for such license to be \$250.00.

5 The hours for closing licensed places to be 6 P.m. On Saturday and 10 P.m. on other nights

6 Licenses to be granted on the petition of three-fifths of the rate payers assessed for real or personal estate residing in the polling district in which the house to be licensed is situate. The City Collector to prepare lists of the persons qualified to sign in the district and no person to be qualified to sign in any other district than the one in which he resides. The Collector's lists to be conclusive as to the number and names of the persons authorized to sign.

7 All applications for licenses to be made before the 1st April in each year and the license to take effect from 1st of May following. The holder of the license to be entitled to a continuation for other years on payment of the license fee without a new petition unless petitioned against or reported against by the Inspector.

8 The clause in the Dominion Act in reference to the adulteration and inspection of liquor to be incorporated in to the City Act.

9 No liquor to be sold in the City without license under a penalty of \$100.00 or 3 months imprisonment for the first offence and imprisonment without the option of a fine for the second and all subsequent offences. License holders selling otherwise than at times and in the manner prescribed by their licenses to be treated as unlicensed sellers besides liable to have their licenses forfeited.

10 Any two of the license Commissioners to be a quorum and competent to perform any duty or act required to be done by the Board. The Inspector to report any breach of the act by a license holder to the Board who are to have power at any time on notice to the licensee to declare his license forfeited --- in which case he will be ineligible to make application for or hold a license until the expiration of one year from the date of forfeiture.

All prosecutions under the act to be carried on under the provisions of the Dominion Summary Conviction Act and the procedure of that act to apply and be followed in all cases.

Read following Resolution submitted by Alderman Lyons by way of Notice.

Whereas the City Council of Halifax by resolution passed on the 11th and 28th day of June 1888 after due deliberation decided to take over and hold as City property and manage as a civic institution the City and Provincial Hospital under the Public Charities Act of 1886 the said Act thereby vested said Hospital with the grounds and appurtenances in fee simple in the City of Halifax or and after the 1st day of July 1886

And whereas at a Special Meeting of the City Council called at the instance and on the request of the Honorable William S Fielding the Provincial Secretary of Nova Scotia on the 30th day of June 1886 the said Provincial Secretary on behalf of the Government of Nova Scotia attended in this Council Chamber and prevailed on the City Council to enter into an agreement to hand said Hospital and Grounds over to his government on the understanding and agreement that the claim of the City of Halifax for compensation for said Hospital and grounds should not be effected or prejudiced by said transfer and agreement.

And whereas at the arbitration afterward held under said Public Charities Act of 1886 the Arbitration Mr Long and the City's representative dissenting agreeably to the Contentions of the Honorable Mr Longley the Attorney General of the Province and Counsel for the Government at said Arbitration refused to consider the City of Halifax claim for the value of said Hospital and grounds as not within the jurisdiction of said arbitrators or scope of said arbitration an award made an award on the 5th day of March 1887 against the City of \$59,000.00 in connection with the Poor Asylum and other matters leaving the City's claims for compensation under the agreement with the Hon Mr Fielding on the 30th day of June 1886 unsettled and undecided

And whereas this Council under resolution passed at a Meeting of the Council on the 11th day of March 1887 prepared and submitted to the Government of Nova Scotia through the said Honorable Provincial Secretary a Memorial setting out all the facts and claiming that the City of Halifax was entitled to at least \$83,000.00 for money actually expended by the City of Halifax on said Hospital and for the lands owned by the City which passed with the same and asked said Government if it disputed the amount to agree to another arbitration or to state a base for the Courts to settle the same.

And whereas the said Government of Nova Scotia and the Provincial Secretary have not yet replied to said Memorial or favoured this Council with any answer to the same.

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And whereas the said Government of Nova Scotia has since the making said award of the 5th of March 1889 - compelled the City of Halifax to pay the Province of Nova Scotia the said sum of \$150,000 ⁰⁰ for Hospital so unjustly awarded against the City less the sum of \$38,000 ⁰⁰ for Hospital Debentures which form part of the funded debt of this City and on which the City of Halifax is compelled to pay interest for all time.

And whereas the Legislature is now in session and the Government of Nova Scotia ought to be pressed to do justice to the City of Halifax in the matter of compensation for the Hospital and grounds which it has taken from the City of Halifax without payment.

Therefore Resolved that the City Clerk respectfully call the attention of the fact that the Council have been favoured with no answer as yet to the memorial presented to his Government over three years ago and that he has by means of coercive legislation compelled the City to pay the amount of the award against the City and that it would be only just that his Government should now pay the City the amount of its claim for said Hospital and grounds \$88,000 ⁰⁰ or agree to an arbitration to settle the amount honestly due or to state a case between the City and the Government covering the matter in dispute and giving power to the Court to do what may be agreeable to Equity and good conscience in the matter or if his government repudiates any liability under representations and agreements made at the City Council meeting on the said 30th day of June 1886 he will be good enough to so notify this Council.

Further Resolved that a copy of this resolution accompany such communication to the Provincial Secretary.

At a meeting of the Committee of Law and Privileges held this evening present Alderman Hamilton, Mosher, and Lyons (Chairman)

The Committee held an investigation an

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to the matters effecting the certified lists and the communication of Mr J.D. Murphy under the Resolution of the Council of the 9th of April last and have to report as follows:-

The Committee after hearing statements and explanations from Mr Murphy, Capt. Gordon, Recording Secretary Doyle of the Union Engine Company the Secretary of the Union Axe Company Mr Nicholas McGrath, and the City Collector find as follows:-

1 That 18 members of the Union Engine Company whose names are given on a list herewith annexed handed in by Murphy have been entered forwards other than those in which they reside and that seven other members whose names are also on said list were not six months in the Company at the time the list was returned on the 1st of March as required by law.

2 That after said list had been returned and in the possession of the City Treasurer and within the last ten days that five alterations or corrections have been made in the certified list and one name that of Thomas Whittaker has been added thereto.

3 That the list of the Axe Company the purporting to be signed and certified to by the Secretary Mr McGrath was not prepared or certified or signed by him and does not purport to be verified by his affidavit but by the affidavit of the Captain.

4 The explanations offered on the part of the officers on these points are:- that the first lieutenants of the different divisions hand in the names of the men with the wards in which they reside or desire to vote and the Recording Secretary has no means of verifying the correctness of the residence in the ward and does not do so; that as to the names of new members the Secretary was not aware of the limit of the time being six months before the deposit of the list; and as to the alterations and addition to the list that they were made on applications to the Mayor and with His Worship's permission and in accordance with the usage of previous years. As to the Axe Company's list the Secretary at the time was laid up at home very sick and had met with an accident that prevented him from writing and the Captain of the Company Mr Armstrong got his book from him and prepared the list. The Committee acquit Captain Armstrong of any intentional wrong doing in the matter and are satisfied that the Captain thought that he was doing no more than his duty in so preparing the list and putting it in.

5 The Committee regret that they had not the assistance of His Honor the Recorder, who was required under the Council's resolution to attend the investigation at their meeting as the questions involved are purely questions of law and would recommend that His Honor submit in writing his opinion on the following points for the information of the Council before its next meeting.

a. Are both or either of the lists returned to the City Treasurer void by reason of the irregularities or defects above referred to.

b. Are the firemen returned for wards in which they do not and did not at the date of the return of the list reside entitled to vote in the wards for which they are returned or for the wards which they should have been returned or at all?

April 19/90

c. Are the Firemen whose names are returned but who were not members of the Company for the full period of six months before the 1st day of March last entitled to vote at the approaching civic election?

d. Can a member of the fire Company who resides in Dartmouth or elsewhere outside the City be lawfully put on the list for any ward in the City and if so returned is he entitled to vote?

e. Can the list be lawfully altered or added to by the officers of the Company or anybody else after having been certified and verified and filed with the City Treasurer; and if not does the fact of the Mayor's permission or consent render the alteration or addition lawful.

The Committee would further recommend that the City Collector be instructed to prepare and correct his lists for the presiding officers at the approaching civic election in accordance with His Honor's opinion on these points.

6. The Committee recommend that in future that the residence of each fireman returned giving the street and number of the house be given on the certified list in addition to the ward in which he is entitled to vote and that the City Treasurer before receiving such list or filing it as the certified list, submit the same to His Honor the Recorder to see that it is properly certified and verified as the law requires as the present lists seem very informal in these respects.

7. In reference to the names of John Bruylants and Edwin Wagstaff having been placed on the voter's list for Ward 2, the City Collector stated that His Honor the Recorder came to his office on the 7th instant and instructed him under the resolution directed the Recorder to instruct the Collector how to act on the matter the Committee did not consider the matter but consider that it would be more satisfactory for to put his instructions in such matters in writing.

A similar petition to this one has been I

think presented twice before to this Council on the same subject. My predecessor in office as well as myself have already given an opinion which has been adopted by the Council that it could not commute the rent for the lot held by Mr. Hart Lots 21, 22, and 23 were originally leased to one Henry GrosKill by independent leases, and these lots have been from time to time cut up and sold to different parties, and at the present time no part is the purchaser or of part of lot 21 and 22, the original line between them being almost the center of his lot. If the present owners of lots 21 and 22 would combine as other owners have done there would be no difficulty in committing these two lots, or if the owners of either of these lots as they originally stood would continue, there would be no difficulty committing but until that is done the City Council is not in a position to commit a portion of two lots for the benefit of Mr. Hart

It would be impossible to ascertain from

Mr. Hart the amount of rental upon which to base the commutation and in doing so the Council would be relieving the lessees and placing the City in a very awkward position as regards these lots. If the Council in its wisdom deems it proper that the present owners of the lots originally leased should be commuted it would be well to apply to the Legislature for power to do and the terms upon which the same should be commuted.
