Sir,—I beg to report respecting the accompanying petition of H. G. Bauld for water extension on Pleasant Street; that 286 feet of 6-inch pipe will be required to supply the houses he proposes to erect. The extension will be on the low service system. The estimated cost is 623.40, including service pipe to houses.
