EVENING SESSION-8.10 P. M.

MAY 3rd, 1893.

A meeting of the City Council was held this evening, Present :--His Worship the Mayor, Aldermen Wier, Wallace, Hamilton, Allen, Mosher, Eden, Hubley, Morrow, Duggan, Ryan and Outhit.

The Council was summoned to receive the returns of election for Mayor and Aldermen, held 26th April, ult. To proceed with business standing over and the transaction of other business.

The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed.

Read Return of the City Člerk, covering the nomination papers of M. E. Keefe, for the office of Mayor of the City of Hallifax for the Civic year, 1893-4, he being the only candidate for that office.

The City Clerk now declares M. E. Keefe, Esq., to be duly elected Mayor of the City of Halifax, for the Civic year 1893-4.

Read Return of Alderman Boak, Presiding Officer, Ward No. One, showing William J. Stewart to have received the higest number of votes, and to have been publicly declared elected an Alderman of the City of Halifax for Ward No. One.

Read Return of the City Clerk covering the original nomination paper of William Dennis of the City of Halifax, Journalist, he being the only candidate for the office of Alderman for Ward No. Two.

His Worship the Mayor declares William Dennis to be elected Alderman for Ward No. Two.

Read Return of City Clerk covering nomination paper of Thomas Mitchell of the City of Halifax, Merchant, for the office of Alderman for Ward No. Three, he being the only candidate nominated for said office.

His Worship the Mayor declares Thomas Mitchell to be elected an Alderman for Ward No. Three of the City of Halifax.

Read Return of Charles S. Lane, Presiding officer for Ward No. Four, showing E. W. O'Donnell to have received the highest number of votes, and to have been declared duly elected an Alderman for Ward No. Four of the City of Halifax.

Read Return of Miner T. Foster, Presiding officer for Ward No. Five, showing William McFatridge to have received the highest number of votes, and declaring him duly elected as Alderman for said Ward No. Five.

Read Return of Saul Mosher, Presiding officer for Ward No. Six, delaring Isaac Creighton to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Alderman in said Ward.

His Worship the Mayor declares the foregoing—William J. Stewart for Ward No. One, William Dennis for Ward No. Two, Thomas Mitchell for Ward No. Three, E. W. O'Donnell for Ward Four, William McFatridge for Ward No. Five, and Isaac Creighton for Ward No. Six, to be duly elected Aldermen of the City of Halifax.

The said William J. Stewart, Esq., for Ward No. One; William Dennis, Esq., for Ward No. Two; Thomas Mitchell, Esq., for Ward No. Three; E. W. O'Donnell, Esq., for Ward No. Four; William McFatridge, Esq., for Ward No. Five; Isaac Creighton, Esq., for Ward No. Six, having taken and subscribed the Oath of Allegiance, the Oath of Office as Aldermen, as well as that of Justice of the Peace for the City of Halifax, sign the Roll and take their seats as Aldermen of the City of Halifax.

Moved by Alderman Mosher, seconded by Alderman Wallace, that the City Clerk be directed to notify the Honorable the Provincial Secretary of the election of Michael E. Keefe, Esq., to the office of Mayor, for the civicyear 1893-4, and to respectfully request His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor to name a time and place to swear Mr. Keefe into office. Motion passed.

#### MOIR VS. THE CITY OF HALIFAX AND OTHERS.

April 19th, 1893.

The Council well recollect this was an action brought by the plaintiffs against the City and Alderman Pickering for blowing down the brick walls of his confectionery building.

At the trial Judge gave a verdict for the defendants, but in case his judgment should be reversed by the full court he assessed the damages at \$3300.

I am glad to inform the Council the full Court a few days ago after argument gave judgment in favor of the City and Alderman Pickering and saved the City the \$3300.

#### IN RE DR. DEWITT'S CLAIM.

#### Halifax, N. S. April 24th, 1893.

Dr. DeWitt makes a claim against the City, for \$61.00, for services performed to persons brought into the station by policemen, requiring immediate attention. It is the duty of the City Medical Officer, to attend to persons brought to the police station and requiring immediate medical attendance.

On the 22nd day of September, 1890, Dr. DeWitt was appointed temporarily Assistant Medical Officer, and on the recommendation of the Sanitary Committee the work was divided between them, and the C. M. O. was to attend at the police station.

It was while he was Assistant City Medical Officer, that Dr. DeWitt performed the services at police station, for which he has charged and was no part of the duties assigned him, but should have been performed by the C. M. O., and I presume would have been if called upon. Independent of other serious difficulties. I am of the opinion that Dr. DeWitt has no claim on the City, for the services claimed.

Read 1st clause of said report relative to the appointment of Chief of Police.

Read applications for the position of Chief of Police from the following: G. S. M. Gibson. Peter O. Carroll, Henry D. Rankine, Richard Rawlings, John Naylor, Nicholas Power, and John O'Sullivan.

Alderman Ryan nominates W. F. Pickering for said position of Chief of Police. His Worship the Mayor asks the opinion of His Honor the Recorder as to whether all those, whose names are before the Council for the position of Chief of Police, are eligible for election to that office.

His Honor the Recorder submits a reply in writing, giving as his opinion that Section 219 of the City Charter applies to a person appointed to the office of Chief of Police who is not already a member of the force, and it does not apply to a person promoted from the force to that position. The Council can appoint any one if he complies with Sections 219 and 220 of the City Charter.

#### IN RE APPOINTMENT OF CHIEF OF POLICE

#### May 3rd, 1893.

A question has arise as to whether Section 219 of the Charter, requiring that no person shall be appointed a member of the Police Force, who is more than 30 years of age, &c, applies to the appointment of a Chief of Police, under the new Act. Will the Chief of Police after election, become a member of the force.

As all the powers and duties imposed upon the City Marshal, under the Charter, have been transferred to the Chief of Police, it becomes necessary to enquire what is the status of the Marshal. The Charter declares the City Marshal shall be the High Constable of the City, and as such high Constable he has the control of the police, and is responsible for the good order and peace of the City, and before entering on his duties he must be sworn into office. Within the City he has all the powers and authority in all matters, criminal, and in case of breach of the peace, and for preserving quiet and good order that the Sheriff and Constables have within their jurisdiction.

This clearly shows that he is not a mere executive officer, whose sole duty is to superintend the police and see that they perform their duty, but the law has conferred upon him all the powers and duties of an ordinary police officer, to arrest on a criminal charge, breaches of the peace, and preserving the quiet and good order of the City, and for that purpose he has all the power of a Sheriff or Constable, and being a Constable or Police Officer with all the powers as such he belong to and forms part of the force, but is placed at their head exercising control over them, and the seeing that they perform their duty. It is just as much the duty of the City Marshal to arrest for a crime committed in his presence, as a policeman. It must be remembered also that the City Council can regulate by ordinance the duty of the Marshal and the Police, again proving that he is not a mere executive officer but a member of the force, and any person assulting or interferring with him in the discharge of his duties, would be liable to be indicted just the same as if the person interferred with a policeman in the discharge of his duties.

It has been said that Section 206, speaking of the police force being inspected by His Worship the Mayor and fining all policemen who neglect to appear, &c., does not mention the Marshal. That is true; neither does it mention the Deputy Marshal or the Sergeants, and it cannot be doubted that they are policemen and would be liable to the fine.

But it has been said that because he is Chief of the Police he is not a member. I cannot understand this argument. He is of the force and belongs to it and is chief of it. It might just as well be said of a captain in the army that he does not belong to the army or is not a member of the regiment to which he has been appointed.

But if I had any doubts on the subject, they are dispelled by the Police Superannuation Act, Chapter 52 of the Acts of 1888, enacted that the Police and Superannuation regulations passed by the City Council were made law, and then follows the regulations from section 219 to 240 of the Charter. By those police regulations, the City Marshal is required to pay into the

By those police regulations, the City Marshal is required to pay into the police superannuation fund \$3.00 a month, and any officer who has been injured in the discharge of his duties may retire after 10 years' service, and any officer who has contributed to the fund may retire after 25 years' service, or the Council may superannuate any officer who is perminently incapacitated.

Can it be doubted that these regulations do not apply to the City Marshal, and proves conclusively that he belongs to and is a member of the police force.

For these and other reasons, I am clearly of opinion that Section 219 of the Charter applies to a person appointed to the office of the Chief of Police who is uot already a member of it, and it does not apply to a person promoted from the force to that position. The Chief of Police, under the new Act, has the same duties, authority and statutus as the City Marshal formerly had. I have seen the opinion signed by three learned gentlemen to the contrary, and it is for that reason I have carefully considered the question.

On looking at their opinion, it will be observed that they only incline to the opinion that Section 219 does not apply to the (ity Marshal.

I enclose the opinion of the three gentlemen referred to for the information of the Council.

SIR,-In accordance with the accompanying resolution of Council I beg to report respecting the sewer construction during the coming season :-

There are a great many sewers on the Order Paper, every one of which should be built and as soon as possible. Under the circumstances, the construction of all the sewers on the Order Book is out of the question. I would therefore recommend that the following sewers be constructed this year and in the order named : De Wolf's Wharf outlet, Prince Street outlet, Marine & Fisheries Wharf outlet, Gottingen Street Sewer from Cunard to Uniacke Street, Hollis Street Sewer from Sackville Street to the Halifax Hotel, Granville Street, from Duke to Buckingham Street, Lower Water Street, from Prince to Salter Street, Agricola Street and Macara Street, Salter Street from Barrington to Water Street, Granville Street, from Sackville to Blowers Street, Blowers Street from Granville to Grafton Street, There are other sewers which are badly needed, but none more necessary than those named. One sewer, that for James Street, was ordered to be done as soon possible, but it would not be advisable to construct it until the Gottingen Street Sewer is finished. Hollis Street Sewer is not on the Order Book, but the old drain under the gutter is very offensive and is being continually choked up. There have been many complaints respecting this sewer and one notice of action for damages, and should be one of the first constructed.

The members of the Council assembled at 11 o'clock this day, for the purpose of hearing the application of the City Council of Halifax under Chapter 58 of the or nearing the application of the City Council of Halliax under Chapter 58 of the Acts of 1891, entitled: An Act to consolidate and amend the Acts relating to the City of Halifax, and particularly under Section 437 of the said Act for authority to take and expropriate certain lands belonging (1) to the trustees of the late Patrick Power; (2) Edward Walker; (3) William Miller; (4) James Walker, M. D., and (5) the Misses Mary and Bridget Hennessey, as shown on a duplicate plan of said lands marked Right of Way and Land Plan new Low Service Main num-bered thereon 3, 6, 7, 11, and 12 submitted by the City Council for the considera-tion of the Governorin-Council. tion of the Governor-in-Council.

The Council upon inquiry find, that as respects the lands owned by the Trustees of the late Patrick Power, Edward Walker, William Miller and the Misses Hennessey, the requirements of the Statute have not been complied with by the City Council, and they therefore recommend that as respects these lands the application of the City Council be dismissed.

The Council proceededs to inquire into the correctness of the plan, and into the truth of the allegation of the application as respects the property of James Walker, M. D., marked on said plan as number 11, and described as follows — All that lot piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the northwestern part of the City of Halifax, the said land being more particularly described as follows :—Beginning at the northwest corner of Longard Street and Young Street; thence running westerly along the north side line of Young Street to the northeast corner of Kempt Road and Young Street; thence northerly along the east side line of Kempt Road, a distance of 600 feet, thence easterly to the west side line of Longard Street, a distance of 376 feet more or less, thence southerly by the west side line of Longard Street a distance of 575 feet to the place of beignning. The whole lot being numbered 11 on a plan entitled : "Right of Way and Land Plan," signed by F. W. W. Doane, City Engineer, dated April 2nd, 1892, and ou file in the City Engineer's office at Halifax.

The Council find that the notice of the application was not given by the City Council to the said James Walker, M.D., within the time specified by the law, but the said James Walker received said notice, and by written endorsement thereon, agreed to accept it as a notice within the specified time.

The Council being satisfied as to the correctness of the said plan, and the truth of the allegations of the application as respects the property of James Walker, M.D., respectfully recommend that the taking of the property of the said James Walker, M.D., hereinbefore described by the City Council of the City of Halifax, be approved under the provisions of the said Section 437 of the said Chapter 58, of the Acts of 1891.
