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All of the above concerns have either directly or through their Maritime General Agency paid the Insurance License of \$200.00 for the Civic Year 1926-27:

Tenders were also received from-

E.C.Fraser John Strachan & Co. R. Hamilton Pugh F.W.Dickie & Co.

None of these firms have paid the License fee for conducting Fire Insurance during the present Civic Year, the first three named do not appear on the Assessment Roll.

The rate quoted by all of the said Companies, with the exception of the Northwestern Mutual Fire Association, was \$1.35 per \$100.00 or a total of \$3,211.65 which in the aggregate is \$30.93 less than last year. The Northwestern Mutual Fire Association tendered for the total sum \$3,195.30 and claimed that their premium is subject to a return dividend at the end of the year and which for the two years that they had carried a portion of the insurance under Schedule has been twenty-five per -cent, a cheque for the present years dividend having been just received.

Respecting the above tenderers-All of the same with the exception of Mr. E.C.Fraser, participated in the above insurance for the current year now expiring. If the Committee do not wish to take cognizance in respect to the Companies that have not paid the License fee for the present year or the offer of the Northwestern Mutual fire association I would recommend that the total schedule \$237,900.00 be divided pro-rata among all the firms tendering at the rate quoted, namely \$1.35 covering the period May 1st 1927 to May 1st 1927.

For several years the services of Messrs A.M. Jack & Son have been accepted for the distribution of the premium and collection of the several policies and they again offer this year to perform a similar service and as this avoids considerable confusion especially should a claim for loss arise. I would also recommend that a cheque for the full premium be made payable to said firm, the distribution to be by them as heretofore to the firms who have been awarded the insurance.

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Last year we had to take gravel and screen it in order to get suitable material, which added to the cost of the work. The next lowest tender is Musgrave & C. \$1.30 this is practically the same material.

The best sample that has been submitted is the Terminal Beach extra coarse, which would prove a satisfactory material in connection with street oiling and while I am very loath to recommend any but the lowest tender, this is a case where in view of the superiority of the product for our purposes, it would seem necessary to accept the highest tender.

I would recommend that the contract for sand be awarded to the Lawrencetown Sand & Gravel Co., and the contract for gravel to Hendry Limited.

Sir:-

I have a request for the extension of sewer and water on McDonald Street. Mr. Earl F.Whyte proposes to erect a new house on the east side of the street. These services are already ext nded to within twenty-five feet of the proposed building.

The extension will require about twentyfour feet of eighteen inch sewer pipe and the same of six inch water pipe. The estimated cost of the sewer is \$128.00 and of the water pipe, if extended in the same trench, \$72.00. The cost of the original extension was \$472.45 and there are two owners paying a bond rate of \$16.56.

If the water extension is made the cost should be added to the original cost and the interest at 6% divided into three parts which will reduce the yearly rate to the present water takers to \$10.88

I would recommend that the extensi on be made provided the owners sign a bond for \$10.88 water rates, which rate is recommended to be fixed by the City Council.

# AN ORDIMANCE RESPECTING THE LICENSING OF BICYCLES IN THE CITY OF HALIFAX

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Halifax as follows:-

1. No Bicycle shall be operated on any street of the City of Halifax in respect to which a permit and number plate has not been granted as provided in this Ordinance

2. Such permit shall be granted by the Ohief of Police and shall permit operation of a bicycle specified therein, until the 30th day of April next succeeding.

3. The permit shall specify the owner of the bicycle and the size and make of the bicycle and the number of the permit.

4. The f ee for such permit shall be One Dollar

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Together with the permit there shall be granted 5. to the applicant therefor , a number plate with a number corresponding to that on the permit, marked thereon and such number plate shall be kept displayed in a conspicuous place on the rear frame of the bicycle.

6. If a bicycle in respect to which such permit and number plate is granted, is sold or exchanged during the continuance of the permit, a fresh permit may be obtained without cost, with a similar number and the number plate may be attached to any bicycle subsequently bought or exchanged by the owner of the bicycle in respect to which permit was granted.

- 7. Every person who
  - (a) Operates on any street in the City of Halifax a bicycle in respect to which a permit has not been granted, or
  - (b) operates on any such street any bicycle to which is not attached as aforesaid a number plate

shall for every day on which such offence is committed be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Dollars, or in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one week.
