City Auditor's Office, Halifax, N. S. Feb. 21st, 1929.

The Chairman and Members, The Finance Committee, CITY HALL.

Gentlemen:-

, You have before you a report from the City Assessor relative to certain staff changes which will be made necessary if an increase in the estimate of revenue to be derived from Poll Taxes is approved. In 1928-29 this revenue was set up in the Estimates at \$5,000.00, and it is my intention to set it up in the 1929-30 Estimates at \$16,000.00

If this additional revenue is to be secured - and I see no reason to the contrary, and why it should not continue to grow if proper attention is given to the matter -, it should be placed in charge of a competent man who will be able to devote practically his whole time to it. His chief duty will be the preparation of the preliminary Roll as well as adding additional names as secured.

It is my recommendation that Legislation be secured making liable for Poll Tax all persons (in the ordinary course now liable) who are residents of and employed in the City from January 1st., to August flat of any year, such persons to be deemed residents after a period of one month.

The City Assessor has made a recommendation to appoint Mr. Corbett chief clerk at a salary of \$1,800.00 per year, Mr. Corbett's duties embracing the preparation of the Poll Tax Roll.

When this matter was discussed at first it was thought that to place the amount in the Estimates at \$15,000.00 would be a fair estimate. If Mr. Yates, who is at present collecting Poll Taxes on a 15% basis continues on this basis, then of course his commission would first be deducted from the gross revenue. Accordingly it is as broad as long to place the amount in the Estimates at \$15,000.00 and continue to pay the commission or place the amount in the Estimates at \$16,000.00, and pay Mr. Yates a salary. I recommend the latter, particularly in this employee's case, as he is a capable and very energetic worker and will, I feel, sure, succeed in reaching the objective we have set up if it is possible to do so. I would recommend therefore that he be employed at \$1,200.00 yearly.

It is relevant to this question to point out that the Housing Commission has made a request for a full time stenographer. I have heard official complaints that their work is seriously hampered because this service is not available. I would remind your Committee that we are now supplementing previous estimates to this Commission and the total appropriated, including the 1929-30 estimate, will reach \$35,000.00. If, therefore, definite results would be secured by granting this request I would consider it good policy to accede. On the other hand the Housing Commission has placed an amount of \$750.00 in their estimates for this purpose when the present salary paid the stenographer by the City and the Housing Commission combined is \$600.00. It appears obvious to me that the stenographer now performing this service is not having her experience considered, and that a stenographer whose experience is commensurate with the reduced salary could better be employed. In connection with this situation I would strongly recommend that Miss Rose Zwerling, stenographer in the Housing Commission Office (who also devotes part time to the Auditor's Office) be promoted as stenographer in the City Assessor's Office. The present salary of the stenographer in the Assessor's Office who will be promoted to clerk is \$1,100.00 and I would recommend that Miss Zwerling be employed at the rate of \$960.00 annually. This recommendation is agreeable to the Assessor. As it is necessary that the Auditor's Department have the services of a stenographer to perform work which will no longer be done by the stenographer in the Housing Commission Office, I would ask that the stenographer in the City Clerk's Office accept these additional duties which consist mainly of the numerical sortation of thousands of paid coupons, the verification of outstanding taxes, and correspondence. As the City Clerk's stenographer would be accepting additional duties and responsibility I would recommend that her salary be increased \$120.00 per annum.

If your Committee concurs in these recommendations it will represent the undernoted changes in the Estimates.

Gentlemen:-

During the civic year just passed a radical change was made in regard to "Poll Tax Assessment" This change entailed a considerable amount more work in this Department. Five thousand poll tax bills were sent out and four thousand one hundred and eighty-four (4184) names placed on the rolls which should yield the sum of \$37,890.00.

In the matter of Special Assessments we have made during the past year three hundred and eightyfour such assessments which would produce approximately \$12,000.00. These require special attention and occupy a considerable amount of time in handling in the office, as they have to be sent out, placed on the rolls and handed to the City Collector for collection.

In order to do this work efficiently, I would recommend the following changes in this Department:

(1) That Mr. Corbett who has been in this Department for the past thirteen years be made Chief Clerk and be given full charge of Poll Tax Assessments. He would also attend to the Special Assessments, with power to make any necessary adjustments and have general supervision over the office work while we are absent therefrom making our assessments.

- (2) That Miss Thomson be promoted to clerk.
- (3) That a stenographer be appointed.

Should these changes be made, I would suggest that in view of added responsibilities Mr. Borbett's salary be made \$1,800.00 per annum, and that Miss Thomson's salary be increased \$100.00 in view of her promotion. In connection with Miss Thomson's salary I might point out that last year when changes were made in salaries no increase was granted her at the time. During this year \$100.00 was given her which was \$100.00 less than given to the others.
