A meeting of the City Council was At the above named hour held this evening. there were present His Worship the Mayor and Aldermen Mitchell, Dickie, Stech, Smith, Donovan, Redmond, McDuff, Cragg, McInnes, Corbin, Rains, McDonald, Mullane, O'Toole, Drysdale, Smeltzer, Probert and Adams.

The meeting was called specially to consider the Civic Estimates for 1930-31, to proceed with business standing over and the transaction of other business.

CIVIC ESTIMATES 1930-31

Read report of the Finance Committee covering the estimates for the Civic Year 1930-1931: Committee Room, City Hall, February 24th, 1930

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Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Finance beg to submit its report on Civic Estimates for 1930-31.

The estimates prepared by the several departments having supervision over the expenditures were submitted to your Committee.

Your Committee have gone carefully into the various items of expenditure and have deleted all increases to salaries recommended by the several It is proposed to recommend in the Committees. matter of salaries that an adjustment be made by a special committee to be appointed by the Council.

Exception was taken by some members of your Committee to the changes made in several of the departments. These will be noted as the schedules are read.

Schedule "A"- Joint Estimates Municipality of Halifax \$52,801.71 Decrease of \$1,997.39 over last year. Schedule "B"- Public Schools \$628,788.18 Increase of \$21,534.44 over previous year. Schedule "C"- City Home \$67,012.90 Increase of \$68.90 over previous year. Alderman Corbin and Mullane dissenting from the Committee is decision to delete an increase of \$60.00 per annum to each of the nurses in the Schedule. Schedule "D"- T.B.Hospital \$28,773.00 An increase of \$1,933.00 over previous year. Schedule "E"- Public Gardens and Common\$14,000.00 A decrease of \$80.00 over previous year. Your Committee have deleted all increases of salaries but have increased the Superintendent's house allowance by \$200.00 \$4,000.00 Schedule "F"- Point Pleasant Park An increase of \$150.00 over previous year for the purchase of new trees. Schedule "G"- Citizens' Free Library \$4,040.00 An increase of \$100.00 over previous year in the maintenance account \$29,342.50 Schedule "H"- City Health Board An increase of \$2,334.23 over previous

Your Committee have placed in item of \$600.00 in the maintenance account for travelling expenses of the Dairy and Food Inspector.

Alderman Corbin dissenting from the action of the Committee in deleting an increase of \$200.00 recommended by the Health Board to the Secretary.

In view of the action of the Committee with regard to the salaries of other departments it was decided to defer action on these applications until a committee is appointed by the City Council.

The following Resolution moved by Alderman McInnes seconded by Alderman Stech was adopted:

RESOLVED that this Committee recommend to Council that an amount of \$10,000.00 be included in this year's estimates and that legislation be obtained to ratify the said estimates, and that such amounts be used to adjust the salaries of any city employee, to be decided by Council after an investigation to be held by a Special Committee to be appointed, forthwith and that such Committee set up a scale of salaries and wages to include annual automatic increases until a fixed maximum is reached.

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The City Collector also submits an application for an appropriation for an additional stenographer in his department . No action was taken on this matter.

I enclose herewith amended copy of This amended copy was given to the our Estimates. City Auditor, together with an explanation of the differences and we are at a loss to understand why he did not give this information to the Finance Committee.

The difference in Dental Inspection was the ten percent cut from Dentist's slary which was put back, but not provided for in Estimate. The difference in Maintenance was an amount of \$3,669.00, Furniture for new addition, St.Patrick's. Girls' School, which was taken off the Estimate and placed in Capital Account. Both very natural mistakes and as they do not in the least effect the Estimate for this year, we fail to appreciate the unnecessary personalties introduced by Alderman Oragg.

> RESOLVED that legislation be sought to authorize the City to borrow an additional sum, not to exceed forty thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars,(if necessary) towards the construction of an airport.

WHEREAS it has been demonstrated that a suitable Airport cannot be built in Halifax for \$150,000-

AND WHEREAS this amount voted by the taxpayers in April 1929, has been proved to be inadequate and the information supplied to the ratepayers prior to the plebiscite was inaccurate and insufficient,

AND WHEREAS the matter in the first place was submitted to the ratepayers for decision,

AND WHEREAS public opinion has become confused by agitation that was not fully aware of the regulations of the City Charter and the legal limitations of the City Council.

AND WHEREAS the City Council cannot expend beyond the amount authorized by the Legislature,

AND WHEREAS the information now at the disposal of the Oity Council indicates that the cost of a modern airport, within the city limits, reasonably adequate to meet the requirements of modern air transportation, will cost upwards of \$200,000 or upwards of \$50,000 more than authorized by the citizens of Halifax in a plebiscite on the subject.

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THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a statement should be issued showing the estimated capital cost, together with the annual carrying and operating charges and probable receipts, if any, for the information of citizens generally. This should be made by the Board of Works through the City Council, and published for the information of all conderned

BE IT THEREFORE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the necessary legislation be obtained to permit of an expenditure of \$200,000 for the building of an airport, but no expenditure to be made until the subject is again submitted by way of a plebiscite to the ratepayers of Halifax

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that legislation be obtained authorizing the City Council to hold such plebiscite, this plebiscite to be held on the civic election date of this year.

#### Dear Sir:

In connection with the renewal of battery plates for Fire Alarm System provided for in the estimates for next civic year I had anticipated the present plates safely carrying the system along until that time but the first signs of trouble developed last night and in my opinion it is necessary to place an order for these plates at once so they may be at hand as it is possible they may be needed at any time and are not stocked in the City. A complete failure of the battery would paralyze the whole system.
