SCHOOL ESTIMATES 1931

Read report of the Finance Committee covering estimates for public schools for the Oivic Year 1931;

Committee Room, City Hall His Worship the Mayor, Jan.21st, 1931 and Members of Oity Council.

Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Finance beg to report that at a meeting held this day the estimates of the Board of School Commissioners for 1931 amounting to \$468,714.08 submitted to the City Council on the 15th inst., were duly considered.

Your Committee has gone carefully into the various items of expenditure and find that the increases made in several of the items are necessary by reason of the addition of new school buildings, and the proposed erection of another four roomed school building to relieve the over-crowding in Oxford Street and Chebucto Road Schools.

Your Committee recommend that the estimates as submitted amounting to \$468,714.08 being an increase of \$26,252.93, over the previous year be now approved and included in the civic estimates for Respectfully submitted, 1931-32. E.J. Oragg

Gentlemen:

I hand you herewith, by order of the Board of School Commissioners, copy of the estimates for 1931-32 as approved by them and in accordance with resolution adopted by them at their meeting January 13th:

> RESOLVED that the Estimate as herewith be adopted and that a copy thereof be transmitted to His Worship the Mayor, with the request that the Oity Council include in the general assessment of the City a sum sufficient to yield Four Hundred and Sixty-eight Mhousand, Seven Hundred and Fourteen Dollars and Eight Cents (\$468,714.08) that being the amount required for the support and maintenance of the schools under the charge of the Board for the year ending April 30, 1932, and in accordance with Chapter X11 Section 900 and following, City Charter, and amendments".

This amount does not include interest on debentures issued for the schools by the Oity itself nor an amount to supplement pensions paid to retired teachers.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING CHEBUCTO ROAD

Read report of the Finance Committee

on the application of the School Board for permission to crect a four room school building on a lot of land owned by the School Board on Ohebucto Road:

Halifax, N.S., January 14, 1931 His Worship the Mayor, and Oity Council, Halifax, N.S.

Gentlemen:

I am directed to advise you, that, at a meeting of the Board of School Commissioners for the City of Halifax, held yesterday, it was unanimously decided to apply for permission to -514-

erect a four-room School Building on a lot of land owned by the School Board, on Chebucto Road, near the City Airport. This School Building would be so constructed that, as occasion arose, it could be enlarged. The Estimated cost of same, including furnishings, eto., would be \$59,000.

The Board has been approached by citizens residing near the Arm Bridge, protesting against their children having to travel such long distances to the nearest School, which they claim to be a hardship, especially during the winter months.

We would therefore respectfully ask that your honoured Body give early consideration to this request, as the need is urgent.

A meeting of the City Council was held this evening. At the above named hour there were present His Worship the Mayor and Aldermen Dickie, Stech, Donovan, Redmond, Cragg, McCarthy, Rains, Shields, O'Toole, Drysdale, Probert and Adams.

The meeting was called to proceed with business standing over and the transaction of other business.

His Worship the Mayor submitted and read the following letter from Alderman McInnes:

Halifax, N.S., Feb.5th, 1931

Dear Mr. Mayor:

In view of the fact that Alderman Daley and myself will probably be absent from the City during the next meeting of the City Council, I would respectfully request that no business be dealt with except routine business, as there are several important matters on the agenda in which we are both interested.

Alderman Dickie has given notice of motion for the appointment of Robert A.Reid in connection with the telephone rates, and I feel that this is a matter upon which the only two solicitors in the Council should have an opportunity of explaining the situation.

The ordinance for the weighing of coal should not be dealt with in our absence, as we feel that we are more familiar with this situation than the majority of the members of the Council.

I also feel that the extension to the Oity Home should be held over as I am doubtful if we can justify to the citizens the keeping of 350 inmates for the Municipality and ask the citizens to spend \$75,000. for an extension to keep our own people.

I am not altogether satisfied that a portion of Camp Hill should be given to the Victoria School of Art, but I feel certain that we

should give them a piece of land some place in the Oity, and it should be an easy matter for the engineer or the Works Committee to decide upon a strip of land which is not required for other purposes.

In view of the fact that Alderman Daley and myself will be absent on Gity business, I feel that you can justify leaving all matters excepting routine business over until a later meeting.

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Read letter O.P. Riddle, General

Secretary of the Railway Association of Canada asking the Council to fix the dates that Daylight Saving Time

would come into force with respect to civic

activities:

Montreal Que.Feb. 5th/31

His Worship the Mayor, Halifax, N.S.

Dear Sir:

For the past several years it has been the practice of the majority of large centres in Eastern Canada to change from Standard to Daylight Saving Time on the date Spring train schedules go into effect on the Railways, and revert to Standard Time on the date Fall train schedules become effective.

This year the Spring schedules go into effect at 12.01 a.m. April 26th, and the Fall schedules at 12.01 a.m. September 27th. Daylight Saving Time will be in effect in the large centres in the Eastern States during this period, and for the convenience of the travelling public it is most desirable that cities in Canada adopting Daylight Saving Time should put it into effect for the same period.

It will be very much appreciated if you will be good enough to have the matter given consideration by the City audhtorities, and advise action taken.
