His Worship the Mayor asked if Tidewater Construction Company had ever submitted a bid before to which the Commissioner of Works replied that he did not think so. He then explained the system for the benefit of the members of Council and defended the present method of calling for tenders.

Again, in reply to a question from His Worship the Mayor, the Commissioner stated that it was common practice to apply unit prices to an uncertain quantity of work in a twelve-month period. The Commissioner, referring to additions to the contract, stated that that is one of the reasons why the unit prices are an advantage and the contractor benefits in this respect.

The following letter from Local Union #108 was submitted and read:

Halifax Civic Workers' Union Local 108

May 10, 1961

His Worship the Mayor and Members of the City Council.

Dear Sirs:

It was with considerable shock and dismay that Local Union #108, Halifax Civic Workers, learned that the Works Committee has recommended that all 1961 sewer installations be contracted out leaving little or no work of this nature for City Field employees.

In past years sufficient sewer work has been retained to provide as full employment as possible to City employees.

During the past several years Mr. West, Commissioner of Works, has proven that the highly trained and efficient City Field staff has been able to carry out this work faster and at less cost than contractors.

There may be some excuse for contracting out work that can be done more efficiently or cheaper by contractors, but certainly it is unfair to both the citizens and the City Field employees to contract work that can be done better and at a lower cost by City workers.

At a time when a considerable portion of the City Field employees have been without work for some time, and in view of the fact that this Union has been constantly pleading with the City to provide as full employment as possible, and as called for by the Union working agreement, we feel that this further attempt to reduce employment of City Field workers should be given a closer look at by the City Council who would be very remiss in their duty to the citizens and in their treatment of a loyal senior work force if they accept the recommendations of the Works Committee and fail to provide the usual amount of work to the City Field employees.

A delegation of this Union will be attending the Council meeting to report to a special committee of this Union the actions taken by City Council on the above matter.

Trusting you will give this matter your closest consideration, I remain,

The City Manager agreed with the proposal that a portion of the sewer work be done by City staff and that he had ascertained that a nucleous of eight skilled and trained personnel were available for this type of work, but the **crew** was increased from fifteen to eighteen depending upon the amount of sewer work undertaken.

Alderman DeWolf referred to the fact that of \$250,000.00 worth of sewer contract awarded in 1960, the contractor only performed work to the value of \$44,000.00 and that Council was not advised of the procedure of assigning work to be done.

The Commissioner of Works advised that only one tender for sewer work had been received last year and had been awarded with the understanding that City forces would do a portion of the work. Assignment of the portions to be done by the contractor and the City, had been made after consultation with the former City Manager.

Alderman DeWolf felt that Council should have been advised of this procedure as a matter of courtesy.

MOVED by Alderman O'Brien, seconded by Alderman Healy that the motion be amended as follows: that the tenders for sewer trenching work for Aikens Avenue and Lady Hammond Road be referred to the City Manager for consultation with the Commissioner of Works in the light of the letter received from the Civic Workers' Union, Local #108, and report to the Committee on Works his recommendation.

The motion was put and resulted in a tie vote, seven voting for the same and seven against it as follows:

At this time, His Worship the Mayor, on behalf of Council, extended thanks to Alderman Ferguson as the City's representative on the various undertakings in connection with this trip.

BY-LAW RE: INSPECTION OF MEATS

Alderman Trainor requested information as to the status of the By-Law respecting the inspection of meats.

The matter was referred to Doctor Fogo to prepare a report for sub-

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mission to the Public Health and Welfare Committee.

BICENTENNIAL HIGHWAY ENTRANCE

Alderman Trainor referred to the Progress Report No. 4, dated May 8th, and read the second-last paragraph on Page 1 as follows:

"Mr. Wickwire says routing of truck traffic would have to be worked out by the City. If you stop them in one place, he says, you might be annoying people some other place."

He said he had not seen any proposed plan but the report referred to the approaches to the ramps. The Consultants have been working on this project for only one month and the senior partner is already throwing things back into the lap of the City.

Subject: Hillcrest Motors Ltd. (Ideal Aluminum Products Limited) Waiver of Certain Covenants

City Council agreed to sell land located at the Exhibition Grounds to Ideal Aluminum Products Ltd. as a site for manufacture of aluminum products. Although Ideal Aluminum was to occupy the site, they requested the deed to be in the name of Hillcrest Motors Limited. Subsequently a deed was drafted, conveying the property to Hillcrest Motors Ltd. with Ideal Aluminum Products Ltd. joining as a party because of the restrictive covenants.

One of the covenants was to the effect that the building to be constructed on the site would only be used in the manufacturing of aluminum products.

When Hillcrest Motors Limited approached the prospective mortgagee (Canada Permanent Mortgage Corporation) for assistance in the construction of the proposed building, the mortgage company refused to enter into a mortgage

agreement because of the restrictive covenant limiting the use of the building to the manufacture of aluminum products. They requested that this covenant be lifted.

While the City could agree to widen this covenant so as to limit the use to primary industry or secondary manufacturing industry, this would still not be acceptable to the above mortgage company.

The City of Halifax and Hillcrest Motors Limited entered into transaction in good faith. If, due to the covenants, Hillcrest Motors cannot finance their proposed construction, then the only solution would be to have them reconvey the land to the City and the City refund them the purchase price.

A letter was submitted from the President of the South Shore Tourist Association requesting permission to erect a sign naming Highway No.3 as "The Ocean Highway", at the Armdale Rotary as an aid to tourist promotion, the responsibility for the erection of such sign to be that of the Association.

MOVED by Alderman Ferguson, seconded by Alderman Macdonald, that approval in principle be given to the request, subject to the specification, design and siting of the sign being approved by the Tourist Committee and Planning Staff. Motion passed.

VACANT LAND - CORNER CONNAUGHT AVENUE AND BAYERS ROAD

Alderman Macdonald referred to the vacant land North of the Edgewood School at the corner of Connaught Avenue and Bayers Road, and he asked if consideration could be given to making the land available for a building lot if the School Board has no further interest in it.

It was agreed to refer the matter to the City Manager to inquire into the siting of the lot and the future plans for its use.

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REQUEST FOR ACCOMMODATION - LARGER FAMILIES

Alderman Breen referred to the case of a City employee with a family of six, presently living in City-owned Emergency Shelters, who has been refused admittance into the Mulgrave Park Housing Project because of the income limitation, and he asked if there is any agency to which such a person could be directed.

His Worship the Mayor pointed out that the Welfare Department of the City does try to help such cases to locate accommodation, and are sometimes successful.

Alderman Connolly: "Everybody knows that the man with six children cannot locate in a private dwelling, because of the high rents, unless it is in a run-down slum area where he would get assistance from some agency like the City of Halifax."

His Worship the Mayor: "This is why, at the Redevelopment Committee, Aldermen Connolly and Breen, we have instructed the City Manager to examine our sources of information on the volume of these cases, so that when we get into a new housing policy, we will have the kind of reliable statistics from which to plan more public housing to the extent it is necessary. We may have to take a census on this particular area of housing needs."

SMOKE NUISANCE - OXFORD SCHOOL

Alderman Ferguson requested action by the Commissioner of Works to check on the smoke nuisance being caused by the heating plant of the largest building of Oxford School.

MAYORS CONVENTION - PROGRAMME

Alderman Trainor asked if the Members of Council could be supplied with a copy of the Programme of the Mayors' Convention before it opens.

His Worship the Mayor said that a supply was expected shortly and copies will be sent to all Members if possible, but that the Executive Director had advised him that all local delegates would receive their copies of the programme at the time they registered.

SALARY NEGOTIATIONS - HALIFAX POLICE ATHLETIC AND SOCIAL CLUB

His Worship the Mayor advised the meeting that the City Manager wished to present another matter which is not on the Agenda.

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MOVED by Alderman O'Brien, seconded by Alderman Ferguson, that the matter be considered. Motion passed.

City Manager: "Your Worship, the matter of the Police negotiations is partly covered by a Resolution passed by Council. The Resolution reading as follows:

<u>WHEREAS</u> the Halifax Police Athletic and Social Club, hereinafter called the Club, has applied to the City Council of the City of Halifax to obtain certain collective bargaining rights on behalf of the Constables of the Police Force of the City of Halifax with respect to the matter of Salaries;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> at a subsequent meeting attended by representatives of the Club and representatives of the City Council of the City of Halifax, it was agreed that the terms and conditions hereinafter set out would form a basis for negotiations between the Club and the City;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> it was considered desirable that such terms and conditions should be incorporated as a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Halifax in the minutes of the City Council;

Now, therefore, be it resolved as follows:

- The following terms and conditions shall form a basis for negotiation between the Club and the City Council of the City of Halifax with reference to the matter of salaries of Constables of the Police Force of the City of Halifax;
- All requests for an adjustment in the pay of Police Constables shall be submitted by the Club in writing to the City Council not later than September 1st in any year;
- 3) Upon receipt of such a request, the Committee of the City Council will meet with representatives of the Club and consider such request within fourteen days of receipt by the City of such request, and such Committee will report a recommendation to the City Council within forty-five days from the date of receipt by the City of such request;
- 4) Should such Committee and the City and the Club be unable to agree on a salary adjustment for the Constables within thirty days of such report, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Conciliation consisting of a representative of the City, a representative of the Club, and a Chairman to be

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appointed jointly by the two representatives.

"Then it goes on with the procedure of the Board of Conciliation and how the Board shall operate.

"The point that arises here — as you know, the City Manager was instructed to commence negotiations with the various Unions and Associations; and, for the purpose, I held an exploratory meeting with the Solicitor for the Police Association and representatives of the Police Association. However, in my background reading to try and acquaint myself with the facts as outlined for procedures here, I found that this Resolution of Council named a Committee of Council to do the negotiating and, thereby, took the responsibility away from the City Manager because the Police Association is not a Labor Union. Section 119-A (i), I'm speaking from memory, says that the Manager shall be responsible for negotiating on behalf of the City with Labor Unions; but this is not a Labor Union.

"However, during the course of my discussions with Police, we did reach this agreement, that they were prepared to negotiate with me but only if the Council were prepared to designate me as the person to do the negotiating, so that they might proceed under Item No.4 to keep the Resolution still in order. They don't want the Resolution changed incidentally; but under Item No.4 it says, just to recall to your memory, that their request first must be in writing by September 1st; the Committee of the City Council will meet within fourteen days of that request and the Committee would report a recommendation to the City Council within forty-five days of the request and then Item No.4 ---if unable to agree on salary within thirty days of such report, the matter would be referred to the Conciliation Board.

"Now, the Association states that it has agreed with the City, that inasmuch as the Payne-Ross Report was under consideration, this term could be extended; and they are prepared to negotiate with me on Item No.4 before proceeding to conciliation. Only in the case of deadlock with me would they wish conciliation."

Alderman O'Brien advised that the sub-committee had been appointed

and met with the Police Club; had reported to Council and referred the Police request to Payne-Ross Limited.

MOVED by Alderman O'Brien, seconded by Alderman Trainor, that the City Manager be designated to complete negotiations with the Police Club. Motion passed.

Alderman Trainor suggested to the City Manager that some of the salaries paid in other cities across Canada and also reported in the local newspaper are not quite in line with the reporting system through the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities.

The City Manager replied that such figures do not bear scrutiny when official reports are at hand.

RECREATION AREA ON CITY PRISON LAND

His Worship the Mayor referred to the fact that the Recreation Commission was concerned about the sale of land on the Prison Property to the Provincial Government for a Trade School.

The Commission was of the opinion that Council had granted it the use of the land for recreation purposes.

The Council in July of 1959 granted the Commission temporary use of the land and in October of 1960 it was agreed to sell the land in question to the Province for the School.

His Worship the Mayor felt that until such time as a Development Plan of the City was at hand, that recreation sites would be of a temporary nature except such places as the Commons which is a long established one. When the Plan is submitted, recreation areas would be placed on permanent sites as compared to the present procedure.

Alderman O'Brien suggested that the Commission should be consulted in future before any land, presently being used, is disposed of to which His Worship the Mayor agreed.

COMMISSIONS UNDER CONTROL OF CITY MANAGER

Alderman Ferguson suggested that all the Commissions except the School Board should come under the control of the City Manager for administrative purposes.

His Worship the Mayor contended that the administrative officers of the Commission would be responsible to the Manager while the policy formulating body would still operate. He then read Section 119-A-K of the City Charter having to do with the City Manager's powers and duties concerning Boards and Commissions operating. He suggested that the Section may need some rewording with respect to the relationship between the City Manager and the administrative officers of the various Boards and Commissions cutside of the School Board and presumably the Public Service Commission.

PUBLICITY - MAYORS' CONVENTION

Alderman DeWolf requested that publicity be given to the forthcoming Mayors' Convention so that all delegates will be given a warm reception when they arrive in the City. He suggested a badge for the City delegates so visitors could refer to them for information.

His Worship the Mayor advised that appropriate Committees have been set up to look after such matters as transportation, welcoming and badges are in the hands of Messrs. Charlton and Mooney. He contended that much publicity would be given to the forthcoming convention by press, radio and television during the next week.

EXTENSION OF RENT CONTROL TILL JUNE 30, 1961

The City Manager suggested that Rent Control be extended to June 30th so that time would be made available to process a report on the matter of the continuance or discontinuance of Rent Control and whether the scope and powers of the Rental Authority are wide enough to efficiently administer Rent Control.

MOVED by Alderman Abbott, seconded by Alderman Trainor, that Rent Control be continued to June 30, 1961. Motion passed.
