An Act to Amend Chapter 52 of the Acts of 1963, the Halifax City Charter, and an Act to Amend the Law Relating to the City of Halifax

Be it enacted by the Governor and Assembly as follows:

1 In this Act

(a) "City" means the City of Halifax;

(b) "Council" means the City Council of the City.

2 Section 7 of Chapter 52 of the Acts of 1963, the Halifax City Charter, is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

7 The boundaries of the City of Halifax are as set out on a certain plan entitled, "Halifax Nova Scotia -City Boundaries - Ward Boundaries", dated March 3, 1969 showing the boundaries of the City bordered in red, filed at City Hall, Halifax, Nova Scotia, as Plan No. TT-9-17515, and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the shore of Bedford Basin at that point where the northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property, the said northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property being intended to be the Dowell-Crosby boundary line, intersects the said shore of Bedford Basin;

THENCE westerly along the said northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property to the eastern boundary of Bicentennial Drive;

THENCE southerly and southwesterly along the eastern boundary of Bicentennial Drive to the northern boundary of lands granted to Balgar Gebhart, Conrad Bragg, Adam Isler and Christian Pytch;

THENCE westerly along the northern boundary of the aforementioned Grants to the northwestern corner of the Christian Pytch Grant;

THENCE southerly along the western boundary of the Christian Pytch Grant and the western boundary of the John Kuntse Grant to the southwestern corner of the John Kuntse Grant;

THENCE southwesterly in a straight line to the Canal Bridge, so-called, on a former portion of the Prospect Road; THENCE southeasterly following the course of the brook to Long Lake;

THENCE southeasterly along the southwestern shore of Long Lake to the intersection of the said shore with the prolongation southwesterly of the northwestern boundary of the former T. J. Wallace property, said northwestern boundary being the southeastern boundary of the former Imperial Government property;

THENCE southerly in a straight line to a point on the southern boundary of Sambro Road, said point being six hundred feet (600') measured westerly along the southern boundary of the said Sambro Road from the centre line of Rocking Stone Road;

THENCE southwesterly along the southern and southeastern boundary of the said Sambro Road to the intersection of the southeastern boundary of the Sambro Road and the southeastern boundary of the Leiblin Park Subdivision;

THENCE southeasterly parallel to the southwestern boundary of the Spryfield Lots to the southeastern boundary of the Henry Leiblin Grant, being Lot No. 4 of the Spryfield Lots;

THENCE northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of the Henry Leiblin Grant to a point where a line running from Crown Stake No. 1887 northwesterly and parallel to the southwestern boundary of the Spryfield Lots intersects the said southeastern boundary of the Henry Leiblin Grant;

THENCE southeasterly along the said line running parallel to the southwestern boundary of the Spryfield Lots to Crown Stake No. 1887, being the most westerly corner of land granted to Mary D. Purcell;

THENCE southeasterly along the southwestern boundary of said land granted to Mary D. Purcell to the most southerly corner thereof;

THENCE northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of the said Mary D. Purcell Grant to the Herring Cove Road, said point also being on the southeastern boundary of the Parkmoor Subdivision;

THENCE northeasterly on the prolongation of the aforementioned line to the most southerly angle of the Martin Purcell Grant;

THENCE northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of the Martin Purcell Grant to the southeastern corner thereof, being on MacIntosh Run;

THENCE in a northeasterly direction by a straight line to the most southerly corner of the William Russel Grant;

THENCE northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of the William Russel Grant to the shore of Halifax Harbour; THENCE northeasterly into Halifax Harbour to a point at Latitude 44°-36'-37" N, Longitude 63°-33'-35" W, said point being on the existing boundary of the City of Halifax;

THENCE easterly to a point at Latitude 44°-35'-39" N, Longitude 63°-33'-15" W;

THENCE northeasterly to a point at Latitude  $44^{\circ}-37'-40''$  N, Longitude  $63^{\circ}-32'-53''$  W;

THENCE northerly to a point at Latitude 44°-38'-41" N, Longitude 63°-33'-21" W;

THENCE northerly to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-00" N, Longitude 63°-33'-44" W;

THENCE northerly to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-40" N, Longitude 63°-34'-29" W;

THENCE northwesterly to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-51" N, Longitude 63°-35'-09" W;

THENCE northwesterly to a point at Latitude 44°-40'-28" N, Longitude 63°-35'-38" W;

THENCE northwesterly to a point at Latitude 44°-40'-37" N, Longitude 63°-36'-35" W;

THENCE northwesterly to a point at Latitude 44°-41'-00" N, Longitude 63°-37'-33" W;

THENCE southwesterly to a point distant three hundred feet (300') measured at a right angle to the shore of Bedford Basin on the line running from a point at Latitude 44°-41'-00" N, Longitude 63°-37'-33" W to the point where the centre line of the most westerly roadway of the Fairview Overpass meets the original centre line of the Bedford Highway;

THENCE generally northwardly parallel to and distant eastwardly three hundred feet (300') from the western shore of Bedford Basin to the prolongation easterly of the said northern boundary line of the Fernleigh Property;

THENCE westwardly along the said prolongation easterly of the northern boundary line of the Fernleigh Property three hundred feet (300') more or less to the place of beginning.

### AND ALSO

Beginning at the point where the northwestern boundary of the Bicentennial Highway is intersected by the eastern boundary line of the Nova Scotia Light and Power Company Limited right-of-way;

THENCE following the course of the aforementioned right-of-way in a northerly direction for a distance of one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two feet (1822') more or less or to the prolongation of the northern boundary of Moirs property line, said boundary being the former

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northern boundary line of the W.A. Hendry Grant;

THENCE following the aforesaid prolongation of the Moirs north boundary line in a westerly direction for approximately one thousand two hundred and fifty feet (1250') more or less or to the easterly shore of Washmill Lake;

THENCE at 90° to the prolongation of the northern boundary line of Moirs property in a northerly direction for a distance of four thousand one hundred and fifty feet (4150') more or less or to the prolongation westerly of the northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property the said Fernleigh property line being intended to be the Dowell-Crosby boundary line;

THENCE following the prolongation of the aforementioned northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property in an easterly direction for a distance of one thousand two hundred and twenty feet (1220') more or less crossing Kearney Lake and the Nova Scotia Light and Power Company Limited rightof-way to the intersection of the said eastern boundary line of the before mentioned Nova Scotia Light and Power Company Limited right-of-way and the northern boundary of the Fernleigh property;

THENCE following the before mentioned northern boundary line of the Fernleigh property in an easterly direction for a distance of seven hundred and eighty-nine feet (789') more or less or to the western boundary line of the Bicentennial Highway;

THENCE following the before mentioned northwestern boundary line of the Bicentennial Highway in a general southwesterly direction for a distance of six thousand eight hundred and thirty feet (6830') to its point of beginning.

3 Sections 8, 9 and 10 of said Chapter 52 are repealed and the following substituted therefor:

8 The City is divided into ten wards, the boundaries of which are as follows:

#### WARD ONE

COMMENCING at the point where the centre line of South Street is intersected by the prolongation southwardly of the centre line of Summer Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of South Street to the North West Arm and thence continuing westwardly along the prolongation westwardly of the said centre line of South Street to its intersection with a line running from a point at Latitude 44°-37'-53" N, Longitude 63°-35'-50" W, to the point where the Headwall at the northwestern end of the North West Arm is intersected by the centre line of a culvert;

THENCE southwardly to said point at Latitude 44°-37'-53" N, Longitude 63°-35'-50" W; THENCE continuing southwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-36'-37" N, Longitude 63°-33'-35" W;

THENCE eastwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-36'-39" N, Longitude 63°-33'-15" W;

THENCE northeastwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-37'-40" N, Longitude 63°-32'-53" W;

THENCE northwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-38'-41" N, Longitude 63°-33'-21" W;

THENCE continuing northwardly to the point of intersection of the eastwardly prolongation of the centre line of Morris Street and a line running from the said point at Latitude 44°-38'-41" N, Longitude 63°-33'-21"W, to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-00" N, Longitude 63°-33'-44" W;

THENCE westwardly along the said prolongation eastwardly of the centre line of Morris Street to the centre line of Morris Street;

THENCE continuing westwardly along the said centre line of Morris Street to the centre line of University Avenue;

THENCE continuing westwardly along the said centre line of University Avenue to the intersection of the said centre line of University Avenue with the aforesaid prolongation southwardly of the centre line of Summer Street;

THENCE southwardly along the aforesaid prolongation southwardly of the centre line of Summer Street to the place of beginning.

The above described boundaries being shown bordered in green on said Plan No. TT-9-17515.

# WARD TWO

COMMENCING at the point where the centre line of South Street is intersected by the prolongation southwardly of the centre line of Summer Street;

THENCE northwardly along the said prolongation southwardly of the centre line of Summer Street and continuing northwardly along the centre line of Summer Street to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Trollope Street;

THENCE northeastwardly along the said centre line of Trollope Street to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Cogswell Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Cogswell Street and continuing westwardly along the centre line of Quinpool Road to a point opposite the entrance to the public baths at Horseshoe Island, said point being on a line at a right angle to the line running from a point at Latitude 44°-57'-33"N, Longitude 63°-35'-50"W to the point where the Headwall at the northwestern end of the North West Arm is intersected by the centre line of a culvert;

THENCE southwestwardly through the said entrance to the public baths at Horseshoe Island to the said point on a line running from Latitude 44°-37'-53"N, Longitude 63°-35'-30"W to the point where the Headwall at the northwestern end of the North West Arm is intersected by the centre line of a culvert;

THENCE southeastwardly along the aforementioned line to a point where it is intersected by the prolongation westwardly of the said centre line of South Street;

THENCE eastwardly along the aforesaid prolongation westwardly of the centre line of South Street and continuing eastwardly along the centre line of South Street to the place of beginning.

The above described boundaries being shown bordered in green on said plan No.TT-9-17515.

### WARD THREE

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Gottingen Street to the centre line of Bloomfield Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Bloomfield Street to the centre line of Fuller Terrace;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Fuller Terrace to the centre line of Ontario Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Ontario Street to the centre line of Agricola Street;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Agricola Street to the centre line of North Park Street;

THENCE continuing southwardly along the said centre line of North Park Street to the centre line of Trollope Street;

THENCE southwestwardly along the said centre line of Trollope Street to the centre line of Summer Street; THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Summer Street to the centre line of University Avenue;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of University Avenue to the centre line of Morris Street;

THENCE continuing eastwardly along the said centre line of Morris Street and continuing eastwardly along the prolongation eastwardly of the said centre line of Morris Street to the point where it is intersected by a line running from a point at Latitude 44°-38'-41", Longitude 63°-33'-21"W to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-00"N, Longitude 63°-33'-44"W;

THENCE northwardly along the aforesaid course to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-00"N, Longitude 63°-33'-44" W;

THENCE northwestwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-40"N, Longitude 63°-34'-29"W;

THENCE continuing northwestwardly along the aforesaid line running from a point at Latitude 44°-39'-40'N, Longitude 63°-34'-29"N to the place of beginning.

The above described boundaries being shown bordered in green on said plan No.TT-9-17515.

# WARD FOUR

COMMENCING at the point where the centre line of Agricola Street is intersected by the centre line of North Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of North Street to the centre line of Robie Street;

THENCE northwardly along the centre line of Robie Street to the centre line of Almon Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Almon Street to the centre line of Windsor Street;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Windsor Street to the centre line of Summit Street;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Summit Street to the centre line of Connolly Street;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Connolly Street to the centre line of Chebucto Road;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Chebucto Road to the centre line of Connaught Avenue;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Connaught Avenue to the centre line of Quinpool Road;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Quinpool Road to the centre line of Cogswell Street; THENCE continuing eastwardly along the said centre line of Cogswell Street to the centre line of North Park Street;

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of North Park Street to the centre line of Agricola Street;

THENCE continuing northwardly along the said centre line of Agricola Street to the place of beginning.

The above described boundaries being shown bordered in green on said plan No.TT-9-17515.

### WARD FIVE

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Agricola Street to the centre line of Ontario Street;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Ontario Street to the centre line of Fuller Terrace;

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Fuller Terrace to the centre line of Bloomfield Street;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Bloomfield Street to the centre line of Gottingen Street;

THENCE southwardly along the said centre line of Gottingen Street to the centre line of North Street aforesaid;

THENCE eastwardly along the centre line of North Street and continuing eastwardly along the prolongation eastwardly of the centre line of North Street to the point where it intersects a line running from a point at Latitude 44°-39'-40"N, Longitude 63°-34'-29"W, to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-51"N, Longitude 63°-35'-09"W;

THENCE northwestwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-39'-51"N, Longitude 63°-35'-09"W;

THENCE northwestwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-40'-28"N, Longitude 63°-35'-38"W;

THENCE northwestwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-40'-37"N, Longitude 63°-36'-35'W;

THENCE northwestwardly to a point at Latitude 44°-41'-00"N, Longitude 63°-37'-33"W;

THENCE southwestwardly along the said line running from a point at Latitude 44°-41'-00"N, Longitude 63°-37'-33" to the point where the centre line of the most westerly roadway of the Fairview Overpass is intersected by the original centre line of the Bedford Highway, to the place of beginning.

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Chebucto Road to the centre line of Connolly Street; THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Connolly Street to the centre line of Summit Street;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Summit Street to the said centre line of Windsor Street;

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Windsor Street to the centre line of Almon Street;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Almon Street to the centre line of Robie Street;

THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Robie Street;

THENCE continuing northwardly along the prolongation northwardly of the centre line of Robie Street to the point where it is intersected by a line running from a point at Latitude 44°-41'-00"N, Longitude 63°-37'-33"W to the point where the centre line of the most westerly roadway of the Fairview Overpass is intersected by the original centre line of the Bedford Highway;

THENCE southwestwardly along the aforesaid course to the place of beginning.

THENCE southwardly, northwestwardly, southwardly, westwardly and northwardly along the various courses of Long Lake to the point where it is intersected by the prolongation southwestwardly of the northwestern boundary line of the former T.J. Wallace property, said northwestern boundary being the southeastern boundary line of the former Imperial Government property;

THENCE southwardly in a straight line to a point on the southern boundary line of Sambro Road, said point being distant six hundred feet (600') from the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Rocking Stone Road;

THENCE southwestwardly along the southern and southeastern boundary line of the said Sambro Road to the point where it is intersected by the southeastern boundary of the Leiblin Park Subdivision;

THENCE southeastwardly parallel to the southwestern boundary line of the Spryfield Lots to the southeastern boundary line of the Henry Leiblin Grant, being Lot #4 of the Spryfield Lots;

THENCE northeastwardly along the said southeastern boundary line of the Henry Leiblin Grant to the point where it is intersected by a line running northwestwardly from Crown Stake No.1887 and parallel to the said southwestern boundary line of the Spryfield Lots;

THENCE southeastwardly along the southeastern boundary line of the Spryfield Lots aforesaid to Crown Stake No.1887, being the most westwardly corner of land granted to Mary D. Purcell;

THENCE southeastwardly along the southwestern boundary line of said land granted to Mary D. Purcell to the most southerly corner thereof;

THENCE northeastwardly along the southeastern boundary line of the said Mary D. Purcell Grant to the Herring Cove Road, said point also being on the southeastern boundary of the Parkmoor Subdivision;

THENCE northeastwardly along the prolongation of the aforementioned line to the most southerly angle of the Martin Purcell Grant;

THENCE northeastwardly along the southeastern boundary of the Martin Purcell Grant to the southeastern corner thereof, being on MacIntosh Run; THENCE continuing southwardly, eastwardly, northwardly, southeastwardly and northwardly along the various courses of the shore of Long Lake to the boundary line of the Armdale School Section;

THENCE eastwardly along the said boundary line of the Armdale and Jollimore School Sections to the centre line of the Herring Cove Road;

THENCE southeastwardly and southwardly along the centre line of the Herring Cove Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Glenora Avenue;

THENCE southeastwardly along the said centre line of Glenora Avenue to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Bridgeview Drive;

THENCE southwestwardly along the said centre line of Bridgeview Drive to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Seaview Drive;

THENCE southeastwardly to the northwestern corner of the Highway crusher property;

THENCE southeastwardly and southwardly along the western boundary line of the Highway crusher property to the centre line of the Williams Lake Road;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of the Williams Lake Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Parkhill Road and continuing eastwardly along the said centre line of Parkhill Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Milton Drive;

THENCE southeastwardly along the said centre line of Milton Drive to the shore of the North West Arm;

THENCE continuing southeastwardly along the prolongation southeastwardly of the centre line of Milton Drive aforesaid to a line running from a point at Latitude 44°-37'-53" N, Longitude 63°-35'-50" W, to a point at Latitude 44°-36'-37" N, Longitude 63°-33'-35" W;

THENCE northwestwardly along said line to a point at Latitude 44°-37'-53" N, Longitude 63°-35'-50" W;

THENCE continuing northwestwardly to a point opposite the Public Baths at Horse Shoe Island, said point being on a line running from Latitude 44°-37'-53" N, Longitude 63°-35'-50" W, to the point where the Headwall at the northwestern end of the North West Arm is intersected by the centre line of culvert;

THENCE northeastwardly at a right angle to the aforementioned course and through the entrance to the Public Baths to the centre line of Quinpool Road;

THENCE southeastwardly and eastwardly along the said centre line of Quinpool Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Connaught Avenue; THENCE northwardly along the said centre line of Connaught Avenue to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Chebucto Road;

THENCE westwardly along the said centre line of Chebucto Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Mumford Road;

THENCE northwestwardly and westwardly along the said centre line of Mumford Road to the point where it is intersected by the centre line of Dutch Village Road;

THENCE southwardly and southeastwardly along the said centre line of Dutch Village Road to the place of beginning.

COMMENCING at the point where the centre line of Dutch Village Road is intersected by the centre line of Rufus Avenue;

THENCE southwardly along the said western boundary line of the John Kuntse Grant to the southwestern corner thereof;

THENCE southwestwardly along a straight line running to the Canal Bridge on a former portion of the Prospect Road to the centre line of the St. Margaret's Bay Road;

THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of the St. Margaret's Bay Road to the southern boundary line of lands of the Public Service Commission;

THENCE northeastwardly to the point where the eastern boundary line of other lands of the Public Service Commission is intersected by the centre line of the Nova Scotia Power Commission right-of-way;

THENCE southeastwardly and eastwardly along the said centre line of the Nova Scotia Power Commission right-ofway to the centre line of Dutch Village Road;

THENCE northwestwardly and northwardly along the said centre line of Dutch Village Road to the centre line of Mumford Road;

THENCE eastwardly and southeastwardly along the said centre line of Mumford Road to the centre line of Chebucto Road; THENCE eastwardly along the said centre line of Chebucto Road to the prolongation southwardly of the centre line of George Dauphinee Avenue;

THENCE northwardly along the said prolongation southwardly of the centre line of George Dauphinee Avenue and continuing northwardly along the centre line of George Dauphinee Avenue to the centre line of Bayers Road;
