HRM Update



Natural Gas and the Environment

- Natural Gas plays an important part in reducing HRM's greenhouse gas emissions to achieve targets in the Community Energy Plan
- Customer conversions from heating oil and electricity drive reductions in GHG emissions:
 - Oil to natural gas conversions reduce GHG emissions by 2.5 4.5 tonnes per customer/year
 - In 2015, CO₂ emissions in HRM were reduced by 200,000 tonnes
 - In the last 10 years, CO₂ emissions in HRM have been reduced by 1.1 million tonnes



2015 Update

- Activated 561 new customers in 2015 for a total of 6,283
 - 369 Residential
 - 192 Commercial
- Installed 23 km of new pipeline mains and 408 distribution service lines
- 72 Halifax municipal buildings currently using natural gas
 - 38 HRM buildings
 - 34 HRSB schools
- Heritage Gas has been experiencing some loss of RC1 commercial customers in 2015 due to low propane prices relative to natural gas



2016 Plans

- Target to activate over 350 new customers:
 - Focus on residential in-fill and new construction
 - Several large new commercial customers
- Customer Retention Plan for RC1 commercial customers:
 - Received interim approval from the NSUARB to reduce the Base Energy Charge for RC1 commercial customers utilizing 500 to 4,999 GJs annually
 - Final hearing in July
 - Contracting for lower cost natural gas for 2016 and beyond
 - Over 15% lower gas costs in 2016-17 vs. 2014-15 and 2015-16
 - Reducing operating expenses and capital spending
- 6 km of new mains planned

Natural Gas Supply and Pricing

- Declining offshore supply
- Pipeline constraints in the Northeast
- On-shore natural gas development moratorium
- Competing energy sources have experienced price declines
 - Propane pricing has fallen, driven by shale gas and oil production in the major North American shale basins
 - The cost of heating oil has also declined with the significant reduction in the price of oil



Natural Gas Future Supply

- Northeast North America has enormous natural gas reserves
- Pipeline build-outs will provide access to these reserves and provide direct benefits to Maritime gas consumers
- Local natural gas storage will lower natural gas prices and volatility and enhance security of supply



Natural Gas Future Pricing

- Heritage Gas anticipated the change in the market and took steps beginning in 2014 to secure lower cost, stable gas supply from other supply basins beginning this year:
 - 50% of 2016-17 winter supply sourced from Western Canada at lower price than local sources
 - 15-year contract on the Atlantic Bridge Pipeline to source gas from the United States (2017)
 - Long-term contract with Alton storage facility near Stewiacke
 (~2019)
- Changes in the market and action by Heritage Gas are expected to reduce gas prices by over 15% for this coming winter relative to recent prior years.



Working Together

Opportunities to Work Together

Natural Gas and the Community Energy Plan:

- Natural gas can be a 'bridge fuel' to renewable energy and to help HRM achieve GHG reduction targets
- Availability of natural gas is important to HRM businesses with interest in environmental issues (38% Very Important/48% Important But Not Critical)

 *(CRA: 2014 Halifax Community Energy Plan Study)

Innovative ways to expand the natural gas system in HRM:

- Heating system conversion cost is a key barrier for homeowners
- Use Local Improvement Charges/Property Assessed Clean Energy financing programs to improve energy efficiency of homes, generate renewable energy, or reduce GHGs

Opportunities to Work Together

- Halifax Transit CNG
- Subdivision By-law changes
- Cogswell Interchange District Energy
- Renewable Natural Gas:
 - Landfill gas
 - Biogas from organics processing (anaerobic digestion)
 - Farm-based biogas

Summary

- Heritage Gas is making investments in natural gas transportation and storage assets to ensure Nova Scotians can continue to benefit from an energy source that is:
 - Competitively priced vs. other energy fuels
 - Cleaner burning than other fossil fuels
- Heritage Gas appreciates the continued support from HRM:
 - Helping homeowners convert to natural gas through LIC/PACE financing programs
 - Expand the availability of natural gas for residents of HRM through revisions to the Subdivision By-law
