Halifax Regional Police Environmental Scan of Preliminary Crime Statistics 3rd Quarter 2010

Total City Wide Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences reported in the third quarter of 2010 show an increase of 301 reported offences or a % of change = 5.62% compared to the third quarter of 2009. Drugs for third quarter 2010 show an increase of 40 offences or a % of change = 26.32 % compared to third quarter 2009.

Property offences account for 49% of reported C.C.C. offences, while crimes against persons account for 14.5% and other criminal code offences account for 36.5%.

Property Crimes

Property crime shows an increase of 30 reported offences or 1.1% of change.

Stolen motor vehicles increased by 10 offences or a % of change = 10%.

Break and Enters decreased by 11 offences or a % of change = -2.63%.

Fraud increased by 26 offences or a % of change = 10%.

Violent Crimes

Violent crimes has experienced an increase in the third quarter of 2010 over 2009 by 64 offences or a % of change = 8.4%.

Robberies decreased by 9 offences or a % of change = -12.3%.

Homicides remained unchanged, reporting 1 in the third quarter of 2010 and 1 in third quarter 2009. Attempt murders are up by 3 offence.

Assaults increased by 62 offences. Assaults account for 90% of violent crimes in the third quarter of 2010.

Other Criminal Code

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc). Counterfeiting currency offences have increased by 16 in the third quarter of 2010 over 2009, and wilful damage under \$5000 has increased by 29 offences in 2010 over 2009.

Prostitution offences decreased by 4 offences in the third quarter of 2010 over 2009.

Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection.

Fail to Appear and bail violations have increased by 101 offences in the third quarter of 2010 over 2009.

HRP Integrated Traffic teamed up with Safety Services Nova Scotia to assist them with their School Bus Safety Awareness Week campaign October 18-22. Members were tasked with conducting check points in Halifax, Dartmouth and Bedford where we handed out literature to motorists and reminded them to use even greater caution while in the areas where school buses frequented during pick up and drop off times.

Both members of our accident investigation/reconstruction unit attended refresher courses in Debert October 25-28.

On October 12 and 13, traffic officers combined efforts with Service Nova Scotia officers and conducted motor vehicle compliance check points. Several unfit cars were inspected and removed from the roadways.

Traffic officers on motorcycles assisted with the annual March Against Violence in north end Dartmouth.

Traffic members conducted a road check point in conjunction with the federal "Operation Impact" program on October 8. This is a nation-wide event during the Thanksgiving weekend that specifically targets the

correction of poor or dangerous driving habits of the motoring public through enforcement. During our traffic point, 39 SOTs were issued for offences mainly related to failing to wear seat belts and cell phone use.
