Re: **Traffic Division Update - January 1-September 30, 2011**

Traffic monthly theme for September was "Operation School Safety Zone and Crosswalk Safety".

Our theme for the month of October is "Seatbelt Enforcement".

During the month of September, Traffic officers participated in the following events:

1. September 2 – Traffic members assisted with an on-going program that continues to establish a partnership with a group from the IWK known as "Child Safety Link ". On this date, members conducted a road check point and flagged vehicles whose occupants included children. The purpose was so that experts from the IWK could inspect and educate the operators of these vehicles in the proper method of securing children in their vehicles.
2. September 10 - Traffic members assisted a group from the Canadian Military who had bicycled from Greenwood to Halifax to honour one of their fallen comrades who lost his life in Afghanistan. The organization is known as "Boomer's Legacy" and is an annual event.
3. September 11 - Traffic officers conducted and motorcycle escort for nearly 400 motorcyclists who had gathered at Dartmouth Crossing to recognize the 10th anniversary of the 911 disaster in New York.
4. September 16 and 18 - Traffic motorcycle officers assisted with the Rick Hanson Relay as the participants travelled from Cole Harbour to St. Mary's University and then out to the Canada Games Centre. On the 18th the replay was escorted to the Bedford town limits and turned over to the RCMP.

5. September 22 - Motorcycle members provided an escort to participants in the "Sears Ride for Childhood Cancer" as they concluded their cross country bicycle ride. They were escorted from Sackville to St. Margaret's Bay and around Peggy's Cove and back into the city where it concluded at Point Pleasant Park and the Atlantic Ocean.
