
Nova Scotia's Medal of Bravery

Nominations are now open for Nova Scotia's Medal of Bravery which recognizes citizens who have gone above and beyond, risking their lives protecting the life or property of others.




Crime Trends - HRM Wide

Crime Against Property - General Occurrences (HRM)







Comstat Incidents - HRP



Comstat Overview

Comstat incidents comprise break and enters, mischief property damage, thefts from vehicles, thefts of vehicles, robbery, weapon-related offences, assault causing bodily harm, assault with a weapon, aggravated assault and drug-related offences.

Central Division

The most recent Comstat period saw a notable increase in drug-related incidents which is a result of increased proactive work by officers over the past three weeks. There was an increase noted in mischief-related incidents with several incidents of graffiti throughout Central Division, as well as a rash of vehicles having their tires slashed in the Chebucto Road area. Theft from motor vehicle incidents declined slightly and a suspect was charged during this period for several related incidents over the past few months of thefts from vehicles at area parks including Point Pleasant Park. The proactive area of focus for this period will be in the Uptown area.

East Division

Overall, East Division saw a decrease of 3 incidents or 3.85% in total persons /property offences. This decrease is mainly attributed a decrease in robbery, theft from motor vehicle and theft of motor vehicle offences throughout the division. Charges were laid in relation to a commercial break and enter in the Burnside area that was also linked to a break and enter in the Bayers Lake area in West Division. Charges were also laid in relation to a robbery in north-end Dartmouth.

West Division

West Division saw an increase in property-related crimes this period. The majority of the increase came from thefts from motor vehicles and property damage (smashed car windows); however, on January 17, a suspect known for this behaviour was apprehended and incidents have since decreased. Proactive work will focus on mischief/property damage and thefts from motor vehicles in the Fairview/Clayton Park area.





Firearms Discharged




