Website: www.police.halifax.ns.ca The monthly traffic theme for January was Driving for Conditions. GO # 15-2655, there were 29 entries added to the file.

There were 4 tickets issued for S.184 (4) snow covered windows along with 5 SOT's for driving too fast for conditions. Several stops were also completed where verbal warnings provided and drivers cleared the snow from the windows.

Traffic members continued to monitor crosswalks and generated new files for 2015. Some were new 2015 files for existing crosswalks and a few new area's added. The new files are 15-3384 Robie/Spg Rd, 15-3383 Windmill/Grove, 15-3521 Ian Forsyth School, 15-10227 and 10278 Nantucket/Wyse and 15-10392 Victoria/Thistle.

There were 43 special checks completed at these crosswalks in January and as a result 10 SOTS were issued in relation to intersection violations and other verbal warnings provided.

15-3196 HCR special check for school bus infractions. Ten special checks were completed and 16 tickets were issued; 11 of these were directly related to school bus infractions (passing school bus) and others were document related.

15-2374 At request of HRM Traffic Authority special checks were conducted on Windmill Rd at Ralston as cars not obeying "no right turn" signs on Windmill in right lane. Numerous checks were completed and 25 SOTS issued for vehicles using right turn lane to continue straight through. This information was posted to our traffic facebook page and linked to HRP Facebook as well and was read by over 7,000 people. This information was also provided to Burnside News for them to pass on to business in the

There were 8 information/educational based Facebook postings added to Traffic Cop page in January.

Assaults with a Weapon Causing Bodily Harm accounted for 14% of the total Assaults in 2014 compared to 18% in 2013 and experienced a -10% decrease over the same period last year.

All forms of Sexual Assaults combined accounted for 12% of the total Assaults in 2014 compared to 10% in 2013 and experienced a +32% increase over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Residence) accounted for 48% of the total Break & Enters in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 50% in 2013 and experienced a -2% decrease in 2014 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Other) accounted for 18% of the total Break & Enters in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 17% in 2013 and experienced a +5% increase in 2014 over the same period last year.

Break & Enter (Business) accounted for 27% of the total Break & Enters in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 31% in 2013 and experienced a -10% decrease in 2014 over the same period last year.

Theft – other under \$5000 accounted for 68% of the total Theft Under \$5000 in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 54% in 2013 and experienced a -8% decrease in 2014 over the same period last year.

Theft From Motor Vehicle accounted for 28% of the total Theft Under \$5000 in the 4th quarter of 2014 compared to 31% in 2013 and experienced a -34% decrease over the same period last year.

Possession of Stolen Goods experienced a 304% increase in the 4th quarter of 2014.





# 4th Quarter 2014 Reported Crime Distribution by Division




### Crimes Against Persons 4th Quarter Comparison 2013-2014








### Crimes Against Property 4th Quarter Comparison 2013-2014



Environmental Scan of 2014 4th Quarter

Total District Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

<u>Total Criminal Code</u> offences in the 4th quarter of 2014 show a **decrease** of -111 or -2.8% compared to the 4th quarter in 2013.

<u>Drugs</u> for the 4th quarter of 2014 **decreased** by -1 or -0.52% compared to the 4th quarter of 2013.

In the 4th quarter <u>Property offences</u> count for 49% of Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 14% and Other Criminal Code offences account for 37%.

#### 4th Quarter comparison between 2013 and 2014:

#### **Property Crimes**

Overall Property Crime decreased by -331 or -14.92%.

Stolen Motor Vehicles **decreased** by -7 or -8.86%.

Break and Enters *increased* by +1 or 0.49%.

Fraud incidents *increased* by +1 or +0.42%.

#### **Violent Crimes**

Overall Violent Crime increased by +30 or +5.91%.

Robberies **decreased** by -15 or -28.8%.

Homicides decreased by -2 or -100%

Attempted Murders decreased by -1 or -16.6%.

Assaults *increased* by +54 or +12.3%.

Assaults accounted for 91% of reported violent crimes in the 4th quarter of 2014.

#### Criminal Other

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (i.e. arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting currency etc.)

Offensive Weapons increased by +19 in the 4th quarter of 2014 or by +48.7%.

Prostitution offences *increased* by +8 or +72.7% compared to the 4th quarter of 2013.

Environmental Scan of 2014 Calendar Year

Total District Criminal Code Offences/Drugs

Total Criminal Code offences in 2014 show an increase of +304 or +1.93% compared to 2013.

Drugs for 2014 increased by +129 or +17.97 compared to 2013.

In 2014 <u>Property offences</u> count for 51% of Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 13% and Other Criminal Code offences account for 36%.

#### Calendar Year comparison between 2013 and 2014:

#### **Property Crimes**

Overall Property Crime **decreased** by -47 or -0.57%.

Stolen Motor Vehicles **decreased** by -64 or -20.13%.

Break and Enters **decreased** by -113 or -12.44%.

Fraud incidents *increased* by +57 or +5.8%.

#### **Violent Crimes**

Overall Violent Crime **decreased** by -53 or -2.41%.

Robberies decreased by -48 or -24.62%.

Homicides **decreased** by -2 or -33.33%

Attempted Murders **decreased** by -6 or -21.43%.

Assaults *increased* by +1 or +0.05%.

Assaults accounted for 90% of reported violent crimes in 2014.

#### Criminal Other

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (i.e. arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting currency etc.)

Offensive Weapons increased by +61 in 2014 or by +29.61%.

Prostitution offences *increased* by +7 or +15.91% in 2014 compared to 2013.

# HRM Policing Services Environmental Scan 4th Quarter 2014

#### **Total HRM Criminal Code Offences/Drugs**

Total Criminal Code offences reported in the fourth quarter of 2014 show a **decrease** of -154 reported offences or a **decrease** of -2.95% compared to the fourth quarter of 2013. Drugs in the fourth quarter of 2014 show a **decrease** of -11 offences or a **decrease** of -3.40% compared to the fourth quarter of 2013.

Property offences account for 50% of the reported Total Criminal Code offences, while crimes against Persons account for 13% and Criminal Other offences account for 37%.

#### **Property Crimes**

Property crime shows a decrease of -356 reported offences or -12.34%.

Stolen motor vehicles **decreased** by **-14** offences or **-11.11%**.

Break and Enters decreased by -7 offences or -2.23%.

Frauds **increased** by +9 offences or +2.89%.

#### **Violent Crimes**

Violent crime has experienced an **increase** in the fourth quarter of 2014 compared to 2013 by +11 offences or a change of +1.62%.

Robberies decreased by -20 offences or a change of -31.25%.

Homicides decreased by -2 incidents in 2014 compared to the fourth quarter of 2013 or -100%.

Attempted murders **decreased** by **-1** offence in the fourth quarter of 2014 or a change of **-12.5%**.

Assaults **increased** by **+40** offences or a change of **+6.77%**. Assaults accounted for **92%** of violent crimes in the fourth quarter of 2014.

#### **Criminal Other**

Includes prostitution, gaming/betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences (arson, property damage, indecent acts, counterfeiting, etc) has **increased** by **+191** or **+11.51%**.

Prostitution offences increased by 8 offences in the fourth quarter of 2014 over 2013 or +61.54%.

Please note offences such as drug and prostitution are sensitive to directed enforcement and detection.
