




January - April 2012 - 2015 Comparison

Summary

Comstat

Halifax District continues to have a positive impact with their Crime Reduction Strategy. This line graph shows comparisons for January to April of the four years including 2012 to 2015. The District has seen consistent reductions in Comstat targeted crime in both the Eastern Shore and Urban Areas with the Eastern Shore having a peak in 2013 of 34 Break & Enters down to 13 for the same period in 2015 and the Urban area having a peak in Theft from M.V.'s in 2014 of 339 plummeting to 106 in 2015. Comstat targeted crimes for the most part have been on the downturn and it is anticipated that this levelling period will continue.



Highlights 2014/2015 Community Policing Engagement – Interaction Halifax District

Hybrid Hub – Multi Agency, evidence based approach for Youth at Risk –up and running in the urban core of Halifax District.

Global Tours: Approximately 80 Grade 9 Students from many Cole Harbour Communities come together for 3 or 4 days to obtain an understanding of each others cultural differences prior to joining the same High Schools.

Halifax District RCMP Co-op class: High school credit program run by the RCMP for students all over HRM in grades 11 and 12 interested in a career in the RCMP.

North Preston RCMP Core Group: Community consultative group meets every 2 months to discuss public safety issues & crime prevention initiatives relative to North Preston.

Diversity Talks- Given to various Schools across HRM.

Cyberbullying – Talks delivered at schools across HRM.

Citizens on Patrol – COP's in all of Halifax District assist with Community Events, Operation Hawkeye, obtaining Radar Data from Radar Trailers.

Seniors Police Academy – May and June each year six week program.

Halifax District Stetsons and Spurs: Operating out of Lower Sackville, Tantallon, Cole Harbour and East Preston, the Stetsons and Spurs participate alongside regular members in several community events each year.

TrySport: A sport program developed to introduce the youth from the Preston area to sports not traditionally played within their communities and provides youth opportunity to interact with RCMP in non operational environment.

Radar Display Boards – COPs in Sackville recently acquired new technology to have portable radar's display on a laptop computer – streamlines the requirement to move trailer around.
