



2011 - 2012 - 2013- 2014 Holiday Weekend Data



Summary Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) motor vehicle accidents (MVA's), **Impaired Driving charges** and Suspensions over the nine holiday periods during the calendar years were reviewed. In the past four years Impaired **Driving charges were** higher over the Natal Day and Labour Day weekends and the Remembrance Day period had the most **Impaired Driving** Suspensions. MVA's increased over the Remembrance Day and Natal Day periods while the Labour Day and **Christmas periods show** the least in MVA's. Analyzing this data enables HRM Policing to be specific in their approach for targeted enforcement, providing day of week, time of day information for officer action.

In November 2015 The RCMP Division HQ hosted MADD Canada and Irving Oil who are teaming up to promote safe and sober driving through the 2015 Project Red Ribbon Campaign. With travel and celebrations plentiful over the holiday season, risks caused by impaired drivers are higher than normal. Halifax District initiatives for the upcoming holiday season include focussed impaired driving enforcement locations with optimum enforcement times based on the previous 4 years of data for December, December 4th National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day, Operation Christmas and the MADD Red Ribbon Campaign.
