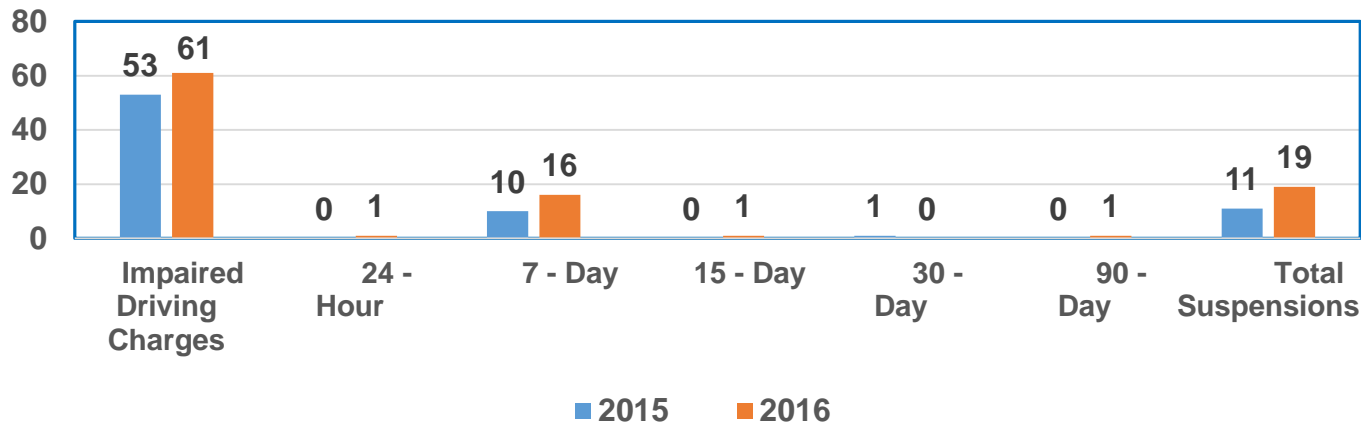

Impaired Driving - June

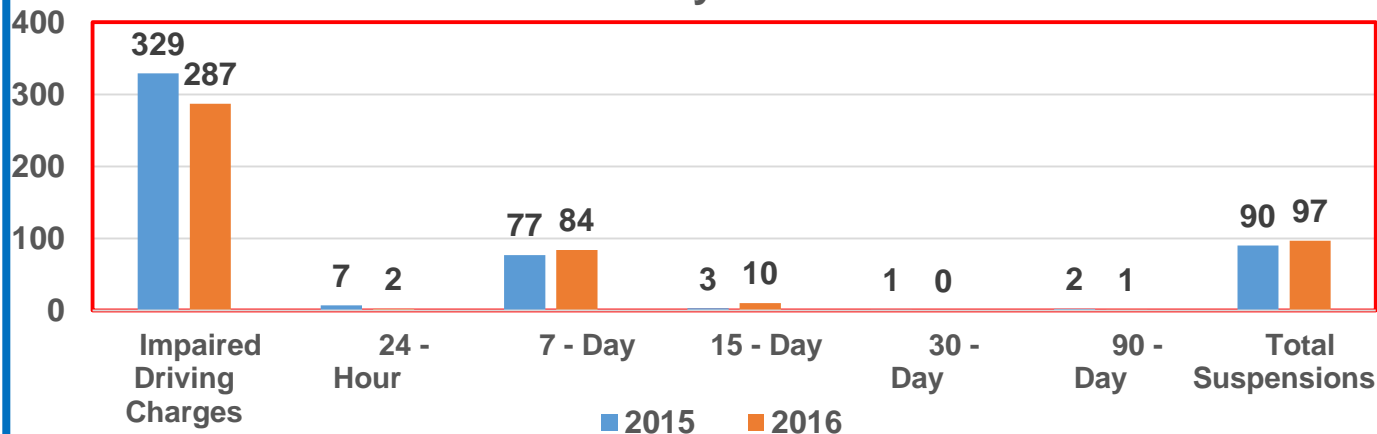


Summary

Impaired Driving - June

In June 2016, HRM Police charged 61 individuals with Impaired Driving, a +15% increase and issued 19 Impaired Driving suspensions, a +73% increase compared to June 2015. The highest breathalyzer reading recorded in June 2016 was 340mg./100ml.

Impaired Driving January - June

From January 1st - June 30th 2016, HRM police charged 287 individuals with Impaired Driving, a -13% decrease. Of those charged, ages were from 18 years to 71. An additional 97 Impaired Driving suspensions were issued, an +8% increase when compared to January 1st - June 30th, 2015.

Joe and *The Push for Change* team visited Halifax July 1-9, participating in a number of events including a community barbeque in North Dartmouth hosted by the United Way.

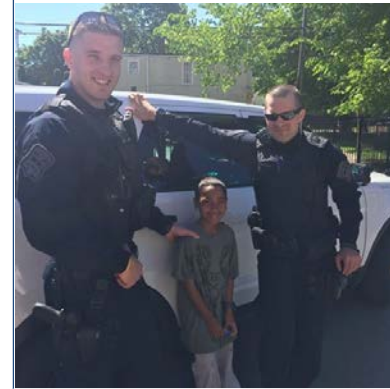
