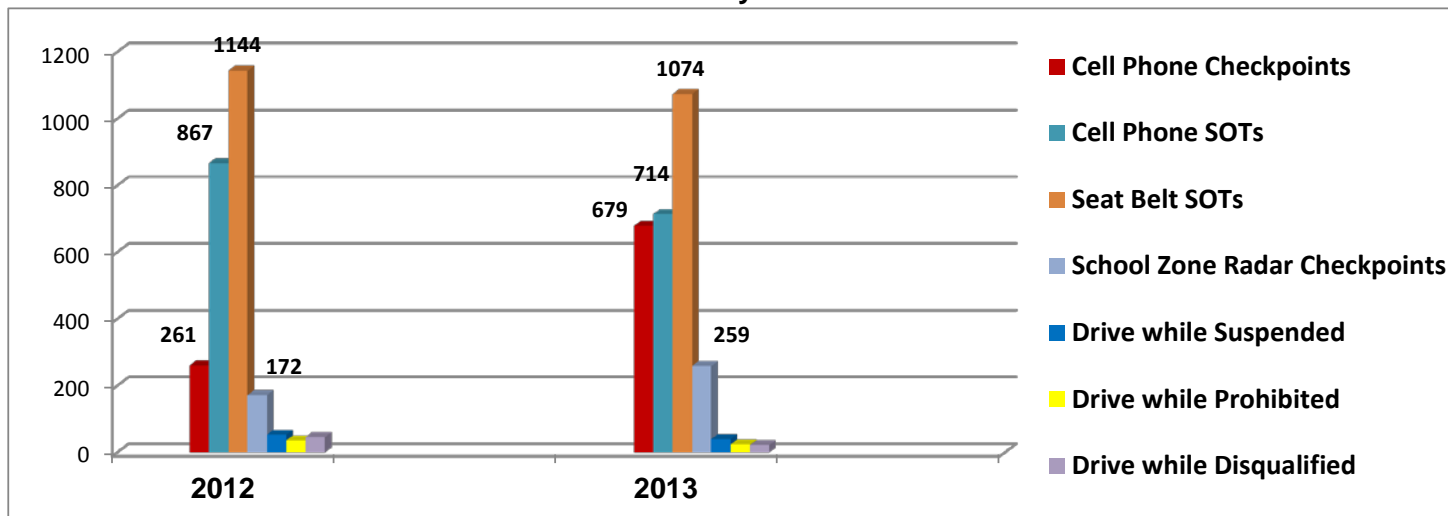

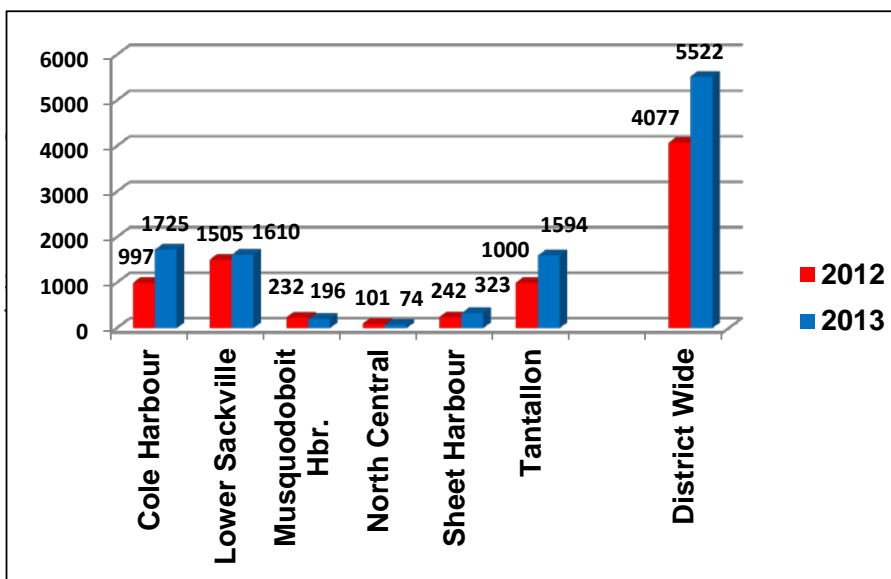

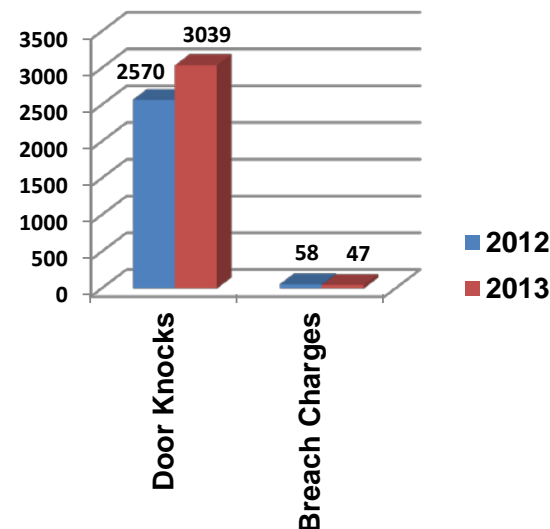
Road Safety

From January 1st - December 31st, 2013 Hfx. District experienced 679 Cell Phone checkpoints, a +160% increase over the same period last year contributing to a -18% decrease in the number of Cell Phone SOTs issued. During the same period Hfx. District experienced 259 radar enforcement checkpoints held within the school zones, a +51% increase over the same period last year.

Foot Patrols

In the 2013 calendar year, Halifax District experienced a total of 5522 foot patrols resulting in a +35% increase over the 2012 calendar year. The Cole Harbour coverage area had the largest difference with a +73% in 2013 over the 2012 calendar year.

From January 1st - December 31st 2013, Hfx. District experienced 3039 "door knocks" or a +18% increase over the same period last year resulting in a -19% decrease in breach charges.

Summary

Crime Reduction

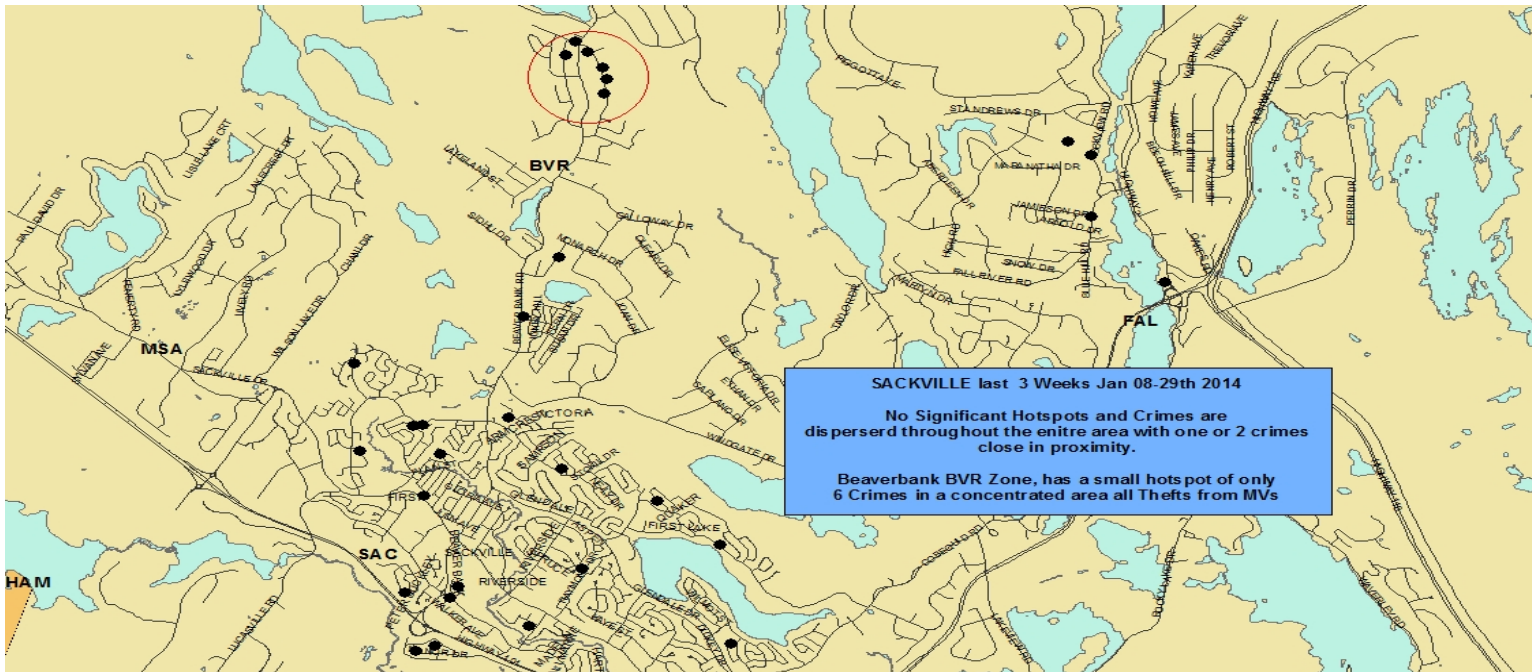
Crime continues on the downward trend through the continuing efforts of everyone in Hfx. District. For the second Comstat in a row this year a -5% decrease was noted for overall Comstat crimes. Crime monitored at Comstat from 2011 compared to 2013 delivered a -23% decrease overall for Property Crime and a -21% reduction for Persons Crime in Hfx. District areas. Increases in self generated work and targeted enforcement as outcomes specific to problem areas for 2013 are all contributing factors in the holistic approach to Crime Reduction.

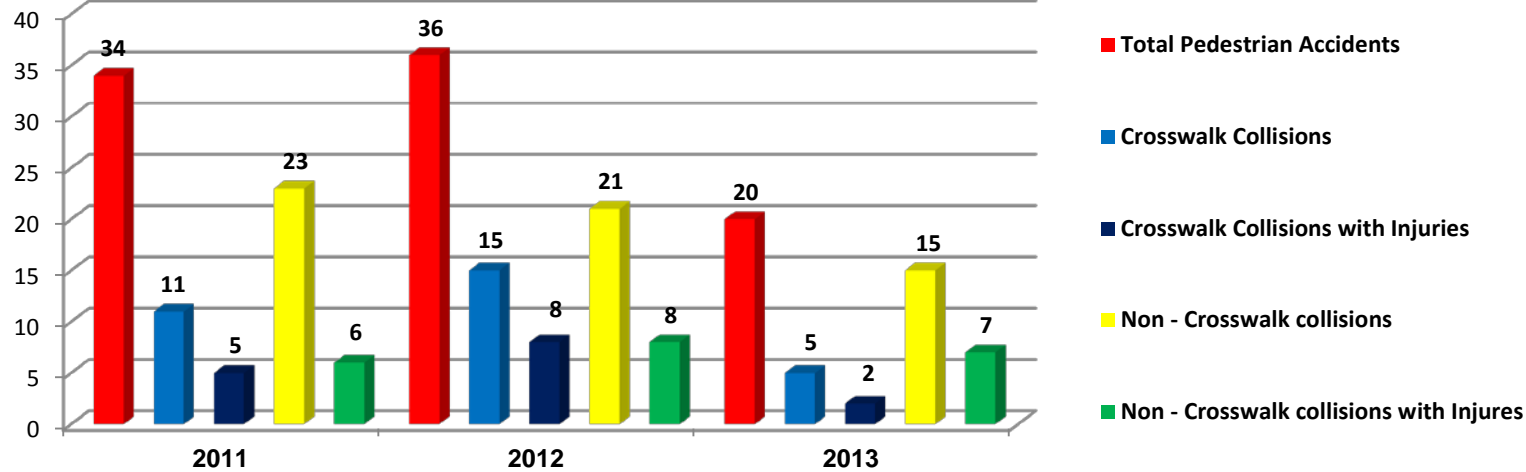

Pedestrian Accidents



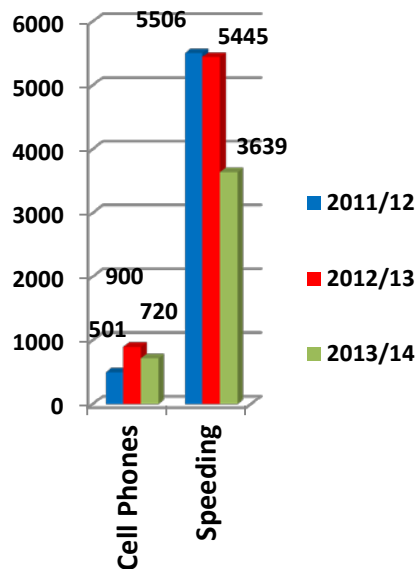
Summary

Pedestrian Accidents

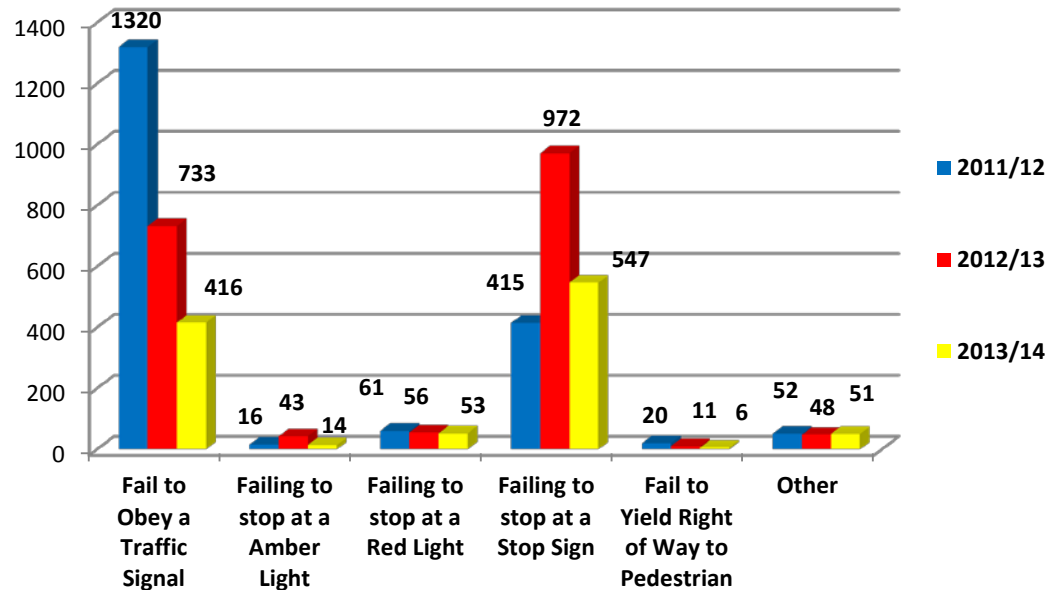
In the 2013 calendar year, Hfx. District had a total of twenty pedestrian accidents, a -44% decrease compared to 2012. Five were in a crosswalk, the remaining fifteen in parking lots, roadside or crossing outside of a crosswalk. Seven of these incidents resulted in one fatality and six with minor injuries. Three have occurred in January - February, 2014 with one fatality and one minor injury.

Distracted Driving

A 41% increase in checkpoints was experienced in 2013/14. From March 2013 - February 2014, the District experienced a -22% decrease in Cell Phone SOTs as well as a -33% decrease in Speeding SOTs when compared to the same period in 2012/13.

Intersection SOTs

A -42% decrease in the number of Intersection related SOTs was experienced within Hfx. District March 2013 to February 28th, 2014 when compared to the same period in 2012/13.



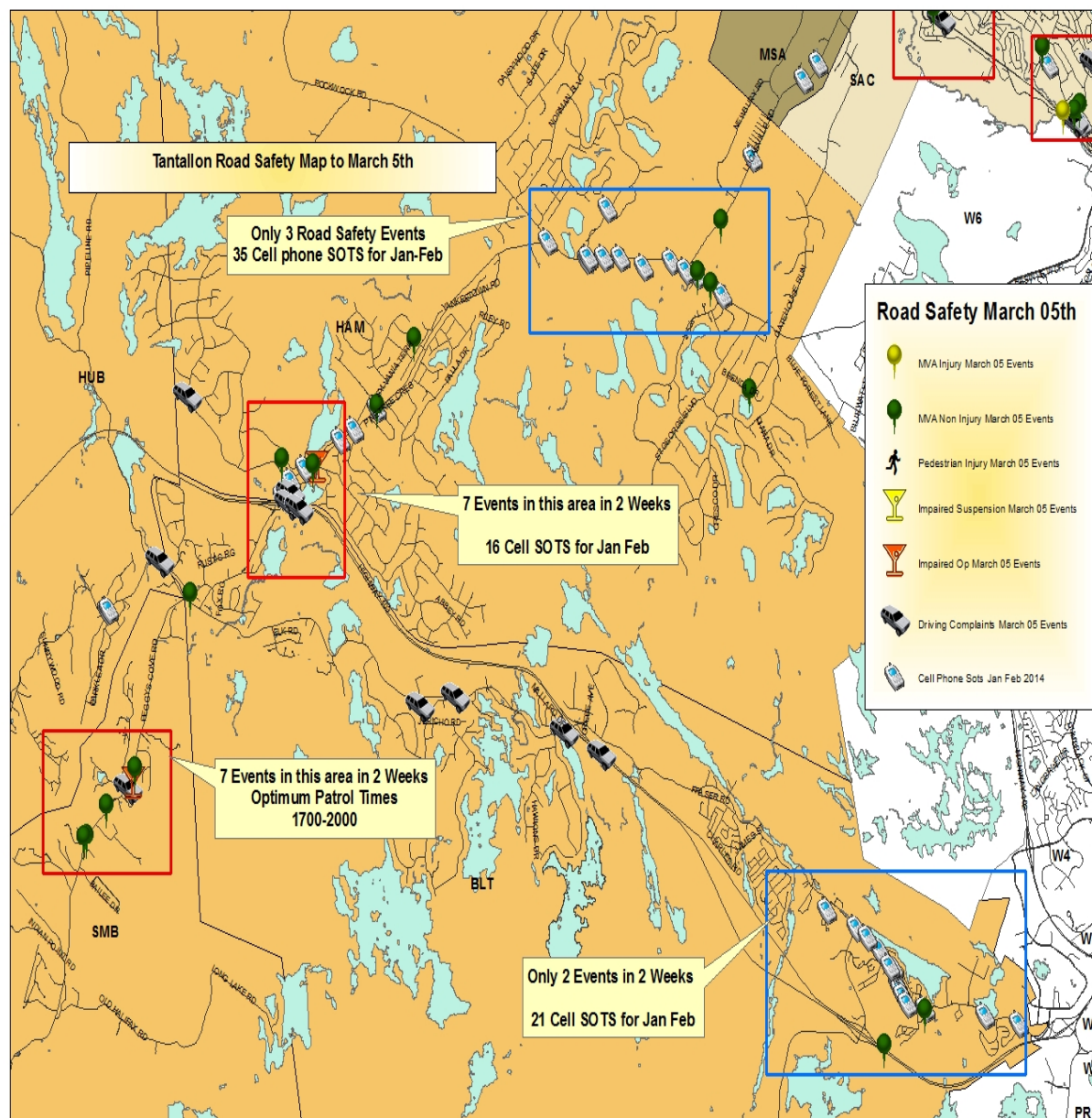

Summary

Road Safety

Halifax District continues to have targeted enforcement and patrols out of Comstat. The map shown depicts events such as Motor Vehicle Accidents, Injury and Non-Injury, Impaired Driving Charge or Suspension events as well as Public Driving Complaints. The highest concentration of these are within the red outlined boxes and is for the two week period of February 18th to March 4th, 2014 (the last Comstat period). The blue outline boxes show cell phone Summary Office Tickets issued in the first two months of 2014. The RCMP NS Road Safety Calendar lists Inattentive/Distracted Driving such as cell phones/text messaging, as well as distractions in vehicles as the priority for March, 2014. Targeted enforcement focus and public education has lead to a decrease in actual collisions and chargeable opportunities. In absence of a Crime Hotspot, the District will be making road safety the priority for March.
