Neptune is here today at a key turning point for our region. As HRM looks toward strengthening the regional core – and as new cultural policy recommendations and funding mechanisms are brought forward -- we congratulate the Committee for its foresight.

You are helping to create bright future for professional arts organizations in HRM.

The recommendations of the *Special Arts and Cultural Advisory Committee (SACAC)* that were endorsed by the *Community Planning and Economic Development Standing Committee (CPED)* before being brought to Council as a Whole, are a major step forward.

As an anchor professional arts organization in the region, Neptune wholeheartedly endorses the recommendation that a long-awaited professional arts organization grant program be created.

We encourage council members to give HRM staff the resources they need to examine the full slate of recommendations made by the Advisory Committee, so that these recommendations can be harmonized with other HRM corporate initiatives.

Within the context of these proposals, Neptune supports the recommendation that existing tax exemption for non-profit organization arts facilities be brought under the umbrella of an Arts HRM organization.

Neptune is a partner in achieving the goals of our region – from attracting jobs and new businesses to HRM – to making the city a more liveable and diverse place to live and invest in.

But just for a moment, we want to you to imagine the unimaginable – a world without Neptune. Without us – more than \$ 9 million in regional economic activity, hundreds of jobs in the cultural sector and beyond, and vital outreach programs and community infrastructure, would simply not exist.

The \$900,000 in support that we leverage annually from other levels of government and from the corporate sector benefits local artists and community members alike.

We're committed to bringing HRM a high rate of return for its investment. We've demonstrated fiscal responsibility in the face of significant economic challenges – and we've forged ahead year after year, to create a nationally acclaimed season of plays that is the pride of our patrons and community supporters. At the same time, our annual school tour and the Neptune Theatre School touch the lives of thousands of HRM families and students.
