INFORMATION REPORT

<u>ORIGIN</u>

Motion of Regional Council – May 14, 2013:

MOVED by Councillor Outhit, seconded by Councillor Craig that Regional Council: 1. Dissolve the Youth Advisory Committee established in 2006 but no longer officially functioning, in order to adopt a more effective way of engaging with Youth across HRM. 2. Direct staff of Community Recreation Services to continue to engage youth, both in their communities and online, to better understand the current trends and issues of youth across HRM; and further direct staff to provide semi-annual reports to the Community Planning and Economic Development Standing Committee regarding trends and issues, best practices, and actions taken. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

The information obtained through this youth engagement project will be used by staff to recommend various types of youth programming. Such programs may include recreational programming, promotion of employment opportunities, and/or police services (i.e., crime prevention), and expenditures for such programs are permitted pursuant to sections 79(1)(k), (m) and (d) of the *HRM Charter* respectively.

BACKGROUND

On May 14, 2013, Regional Council passed a motion requesting Community & Recreation Services to provide the Community Planning & Economic Development Standing Committee (CP&ED) with a Youth Engagement Report semi-annually outlining youth trends and issues, best practices, and actions taken.

DISCUSSION

Youth Engagement Report

The following report outlines current youth (ages 13 to 18 years old) programming by Community Recreation & Culture from September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013.

Youth Program Summary

A seasonal list of Youth Programs offered by Community Recreation & Culture (CR&C) is provided in Appendix A.

Most youth programming takes place in the fall, winter and summer. Spring is typically a slow time due to school exams, proms, etc.

Appendix A only contains information about programs run by Community Recreation & Culture (CR&C). This report does not contain information on youth programming from the Halifax Regional Libraries (HRL), Multi-District Facilities (MDF), Facility Lease Agreements (FLA), Halifax Regional Police (HRP) or the RCMP. It does not include grant funding that is given to youth serving organizations (i.e., The Boys & Girls Club). It is staff's desire to have this information and will examine how to access this data for inclusion in future reports.

It should also be noted that financially disadvantaged youth can access the Canadian Tire Jump Start/Rec Kids Program to participate in recreational, sport, art, cultural and physical activity programs. Currently the program funds participation in registered, non-profit organizations. Jumpstart/RecKids currently provides up to \$200 per child per family per HRM fiscal year towards registrations fees. This funding is accessed via application to and based on the limits of the Jumpstart/RecKids Program.

Trends

The following section captures comments and observations by staff about trends that are developing in the youth culture.

Health & Wellness

• Youth are talking about sex, whether it is jokes, issues with their significant other, or discussions when the health nurses come to speak to them at drop-in programs or at school.

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Gender-Neutral Movement

• The "Gender neutral" concept is a hot topic with youth. Many Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgendered (LGBT) youth face discrimination when they enter or exit gendersegregated washrooms. The term 'inclusion' is expanding from just including people with differing physical abilities to also include gender differences as well. This is a newer concept in HRM and some high schools are starting the process of implementing them.

An example of a "Gender-Neutral" space is an area free of explicit or implicit reference to gender or sex. The most common area is a gender-neutral washroom. This is a washroom where the signage is visibly identified with open, inclusive language, not just male or female. It's evident that these facilities are void of gender identity and have accommodations that are especially sensitive to the needs of a greater range of people. Some people are not comfortable using male or

female-designated washrooms.

The availability of gender-neutral washrooms is also a privacy issue in the broadest sense. Singleperson, gender-neutral washrooms provide privacy to any individual who requires it, no matter their reasons. They are the best solution to ensure access and to eliminate barriers for all persons, no matter what their gender, ability, health status, or shyness.

Currently, HRM is reviewing how to incorporate Gender-Neutral facilities for youth. Most recreational facilities have an accessible washroom



available to all citizens. By simply updating the signage in our facilities, we can denote these washrooms as gender-neutral without drawing attention to it. Typically, a simple sign (as seen above) that tells the public that a washroom is assessable and open to both genders will be effective.

Employment Trends

• Youth are looking for part time jobs right now and are asking for help on how to look, what to do, and how to apply, etc.

HRM currently has several youth leadership programs that offer training and guidance in resume creation and job search. For the youth who have dropped out of school and are struggling to gain meaningful employment, HRM's Youth Live Program gives those youth the skills and guidance to gain meaningful employment.

Youth Programming Trends

- Youth love food; it is one of the main draws to most youth programs.
- Do-it-yourself crafts, cooking, computers and gaming are popular at drop in centres.

- Youth do not like being forced to do specific activities; a choice between different activities is important.
- Youth enjoy and take more pride in a program if they can have input into the planning.
- Youth like free programs and those that do not require commitment each week (drop in). Youth love the freedom of being able to just hang out and not be in a highly structured program.

HRM currently offers many drop-in programs that meet the criteria above. Most of these programs are run on Friday nights, offering youth a chance to play sports (open gym) or a safe place to hang out with friends (Youth Centres).

<u>Technology / Internet Trends</u>

- Use of laptops/computers in the local library is important for youth who do not have access at home.
- There is a negative trend amongst youth of oversharing personal information online. This is mainly due to the use of social media today. This trend is causing more issues for youth like cyber bullying, peer to peer conflict, etc.
- Youth today are always "connected" and therefore are not learning/using the skills of good verbal communication/conflict management.
- Most youth have access to smart phones that grant them immediate access to the internet.
- Teens are into gaming. The latest buzz has been with the new generation consoles such as PS4 and Xbox One.

HRM currently maintains a youth website (<u>www.hrmyouth.ca</u>), which helps to get the word out to youth about its programs and events. Linked to this website is a Facebook page (Facebook.com/hrmyouth) and twitter account (@hrmyouth). CR&C uses these tools to reach out and connect with youth online. We gain feedback about our programs and events. As technology advances, the municipality needs to stay up-to-date on the current trends in order to stay connected to the youth in our communities.

Emerging Issues

The following section covers "hot topics" identified by youth as issues in their communities. Staff has collected this information by engaging youth in our programs, at special events and trade shows.

Self-Image & the Media

Youth are concerned about the negative impacts the media has on how youth feel about themselves. One example is how pop icons show off their bodies and draw too much unhealthy attention from everyone. These trends cause unhealthy pressures and most youth struggle to stop focusing on it.

Rural Communities

The *After the Bell* pilot program has been successfully implemented in four (4) rural communities:

- Musquodoboit Valley (Meagher's Grant)
- Prospect Road
- St. Margaret's Bay
- Sheet Harbour Community

One teen stated that "having this program in my community means that my mom doesn't have to drive me all the way to Middle Musquodoboit all the time for activities," said a student at Musquodoboit Rural High School. "She doesn't have to leave work early or waste gas to get me there." In one rural community, participants indicated that they are also committed to other afterschool activities. It was suggested that the program be expanded to allow more males into the *After the Bell* programs.

HRM has partnered with other community organizations in Sheet Harbour in order to apply for a Rural Youth Leadership Grant. After successfully receiving this grant, HRM and community organizations held a youth-led forum at the local High School. This youth engagement forum surveyed youth and common themes were identified. The Community Recreation Coordinator (CRC) will continue to work with the teens and other community partners (i.e., Chamber of Commerce) to pursue potential themes identified such as creating access to multi-purpose space.

Safety

Safety is important to all youth. They want safe & welcoming places to hang out with friends.

Accessible Programs & Transportation

Accessible programs are an issue. (An example is that transportation to get to the Adventure Earth Centre is difficult for many youth who want to participate in environmental programming.) Rural transportation is an issue for all youth living in those areas. They have difficulty finding work and getting around in their own communities. CR&C is taking steps to make our programs more accessible for all youth. One such step is the expansion of the Adventure Earth Centre programming. By having other locations for this program to run, we are able to reach out to youth who were not able to easily access these programs. Further work continues on this expansion.

Focus Areas for Youth Engagement

Feedback from youth has identified the following six (6) specific focus areas for Youth Engagement:

- Art Programming
- Health & Well Being: Physical Activity & Active Transportation
- Youth Events
- Youth Friendly Spaces & Places
- Leadership Training and Youth Employment
- Going Green: Environmentally Friendly Region

These areas were identified as important through focus groups and HRM's Youth Engagement Strategy. Our goal is to gain a more detailed breakdown of each of these various areas. This information will help to influence what CR&C offers to youth.

Staff's initial engagement with youth was obtained at the Teens Now Talk Youth XPO in November 2013. CR&C staff had a booth at this event. Youth from schools in the Halifax Regional School Board area came to this event. The booth offered information on recreation and the arts. Staff also had the youth participate in a survey to help rank the information below using a method called Dotmocracy. This method helps capture the opinions of large groups in a fast way. A flip chart was set up with the 6 topics. The youth were then asked to place a sticky dot on the topic they felt HRM should focus attention.

The youth who attended this expo represented all districts in HRM. There was also a diverse representation of cultures and academic backgrounds. The engagement obtained feedback from Junior High & High School age students:

6. Youth Friendly Spaces & Places

It became obvious during the event that the Junior High Students (who came the first day of the expo) were very interested in Art Programming. This needs to be explored further to break down the exact type of Art Programming they are interested in. High School students attended the second day of the expo. They voted and advised staff that they are more interested in Health & Well Being (Physical Activity & Active Transportation). More details are needed, but it seems these two topics are currently the priority areas for youth in HRM.

Next Steps

Staff will continue to collect and expand upon seasonal youth data generated from the programs and events offered by CR&C and other youth service providers in HRM. An internal "Youth Engagement Staff Committee" will be formed and will meet quarterly to review the seasonal youth data, discuss emerging trends and issues related to youth in the Halifax Regional Municipality.

Staff will analyze each of the Focus Areas to find out more specific information about each topic and will create a group of action items for each area. This will be provided in future reports to CPED.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Staff engaged youth to complete this report. Staff gained feedback from youth on the trends and issues presented in this report by visiting existing youth programs and events. Staff also attended the Teens Now Talk Youth XPO in November where staff engaged with over 600 youth.
