The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Invocation being led by Councillor Fougere.

7. CONSIDERATION OF DEFERRED BUSINESS

7.1 <u>Councillor Sloane - Acquisition of Theodore Tugboat and Intellectual</u>
<u>Property Rights</u>

MOVED by Councillor Sloane, seconded by Councillor Goucher, that Council endorse the use of the monies that have been collected, and held in trust by HRM, to develop a business plan for the acquisition of Theodore Tugboat.

Councillor Sloane noted donated monies for Theodore are being held in trust by HRM. The Councillor stated she is requesting endorsement of a business plan for Theodore which will cost approximately \$10,000.00. The Councillor advised the fund contains \$6,200.00 and she is requesting an additional amount from HRM (\$3,800.00).

Councillor Goucher stated the Halifax Tugboat Society requested the members of Council bring forth a request for the amount that is held in trust as well as an additional \$3,800.00 to fund up to a maximum of \$10,000.00. The Councillor stated the Society was not asking for support in the purchase of the tugboat but rather support up to a maximum of \$10,000.00 to allow the committee to do a business plan to see if they are in a position to move forward.

Without a vote being taken on the motion before Council, the following motion was placed.

- 9.1.1 Construction and Demolition Sites Setbacks and Liners

• A report from Councillor Jim Smith, Chair, Solid Waste Resource Advisory Committee, dated February 11, 2003, on the above noted, was before Council.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Councillor Streatch declared a conflict of interest due to a family business connection and left his seat.

Mr. Jim Bauld, Diversion Planning Coordinator, Solid Waste Resources, outlined the staff report.

MOVED by Councillor Smith, seconded by Councillor Goucher, that the setbacks from Construction and Demolition (C&D) facilities to parks/wilderness areas, operating quarries and to water courses/lakes, and Nova Scotia Department of Environment and Labour Liner requirements for C&D disposal facilities be maintained at the status quo.

Councillor Warshick noted the distances from watercourses as well as parks and quarries and placed the following motion.

MOVED by Councillor Warshick, seconded by Councillor Sloane, that the setbacks from Construction and Demolition (C&D) facilities and the Nova Scotia Department of Environment and Labour Liner requirements for C&D disposal facilities for water courses/lakes be maintained at the status quo and the separation distance from operating quarries and parks/wilderness areas be referred back to the Solid Waste Resource Advisory Committee. MOTION DEFEATED.

9.2.3 One Year Extension of Request for Proposal 01-116, Composting of Separately Collected Leaf and Yard Waste Composting

Mr. Jim Bauld, Diversion Planning Coordinator, Solid Waste Resources, outlined the staff report.

In response to Councillor Smith, Mr. Bauld advised staff were recommending a one year extension to provide the ability to negotiate with New Era and Miller for leaf and yard waste collection starting in the spring and fall.

MOVED by Councillor Smith, seconded by Councillor Hetherington, that Halifax Regional Council authorize staff to prepare the appropriate documentation for an extension of contract RFP 01-116 with Kel Ann Organics for the receipt and processing of separately collected leaf and yard waste for the period covering July 1,2003 to June 30, 2004 for a total lump sum price of \$57,750.00 plus applicable HST. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

9.2.4 <u>Case 00540: Municipal Planning Strategy and Land Use By-Law</u> amendment - Corner of Chester Avenue and Connolly Street, Halifax
