SUBJECT: TAC Foundation Request For Annual Funding Contribution

INFORMATION REPORT

ORIGIN

Regional Council Meeting of September 14, 2004.

BACKGROUND

At the Regional Council Meeting held on September 14, 2004, Councillor Reg Rankin asked for a staff report on a request from the Transportation Association of Canada for an annual funding contribution towards a new educational initiative called the TAC Foundation. This report is in response to that request.

DISCUSSION

As presented in the attached information outline from the Transportation Association of Canada (TAC), Canada's social and economic development as a nation depends on a safe, efficient, effective and environmentally and financially sustainable transportation system.

There is mounting evidence that Canada will face a critical shortage of professionals working in the transportation field. The number of new students entering the fields of engineering, mathematics and the physical sciences is dwindling. To maintain and enhance Canada's competitiveness, there is acknowledgement that we need to ensure that Canada's transportation system remains efficient and is able to adapt to the new challenges of tomorrow.

The TAC Foundation was thus created to support the educational and research needs of the Canadian Transportation Industry. It is a program whereby scholarships and fellowships are made available to students attending educational establishments who are enrolled in transportation-related disciplines. To sustain the viability of this scholarship program, TAC is asking all participant members to consider making a financial contribution to the program.

Level of funding participation: Within the program, there are five differing levels of funding contribution available. Platinum: \$50,000 or \$10,000 for 5 years; Gold: \$25,000 or \$5000 for 5 years; Silver: \$15,000 or \$3000 for 5 years; Bronze: \$1,000 or more; and Friend: Other contribution.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

No specific budget provision has been made in the 2004/05 Operating Budget for participation in the subject TAC Foundation Program. However, Public Works & Transportation Services has cost-shared with TAC in the past on a number of specific TAC sponsored programs and staff see the subject Foundation Program as being similar. As such, provision can be made within the Traffic & Transportation Services Operating Budget over the next five years to provide for a five year annual silver level contribution towards this program.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT POLICIES / BUSINESS PLAN

This report complies with the Municipality's Multi-Year Financial Strategy, the approved Operating, Capital and Reserve budgets, policies and procedures regarding withdrawals from the utilization of Capital and Operating reserves, as well as any relevant legislation.


That's why the Transportation Association of Canada Foundation (TAC Foundation) was created. Our mandate is to support the educational and research needs of the Canadian transportation industry.
















You can be a part of this vision for transportation by giving to the TAC Foundation today!

Key areas are:

 - 4. program management

Annual Funding Program

that will grow from the existing TAC Scholarship program. Donors can contribute smaller gifts towards the program fund or name scholarships for larger gifts. Our target is to reach an annual funding level of \$100,000 per year in five years.

Endowment Fund

that will be built up over time to create a capital pool from which interest and dividends can be used to support the Foundation's programs. The target is to build an endowment fund of \$2,000,000 within five years.
