SUBJECT:

Public Transit Funding: Update and Funding Allocation

ORIGIN

On February 1, 2007, the Transit Funding Agreement between Halifax Regional Municipality and the Province of Nova Scotia was signed, providing for the transfer of federal funding to the municipality. Under the terms of this agreement, HRM must submit a list of capital projects selected for funding under the program, along with a list of all capital projects eligible for funding. On March 6, 2007, Council approved the funding allocation for the 2006/07 fiscal year.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Regional Council:

- 1) approve the three year list of Transit Funding projects as per Attachment A; and
- 2) approve the reduction of the 2007-08 gross capital budget by \$2,977,000 and the corresponding realignment of projects as per Attachment B.

BACKGROUND

On November 24, 2006, the Province of Nova Scotia and the Government of Canada signed a bilateral agreement to transfer Public Transit Funding to municipalities within Nova Scotia. On February 1, 2007, HRM signed a municipal funding agreement with the Province. That agreement formalised the criteria and requirements, and details the responsibilities of the partners.

On March 6, 2007, Council approved a list of eligible projects for the 2006-07 fiscal year and selected projects for funding under the program (as shown in Attachment C). This list was submitted to the Infrastructure Secretariat, who administers the program, and HRM has received \$10,889,128 for the 2006-07 fiscal year. What is now required is: a list of capital projects put forward for funding in the fiscal years 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2009-10; and a list of all projects eligible under the Public Transit funding program.

Strategic Transit Agreement Highlights

The following is a brief summary of terms and conditions contained within the Transit Funding agreement.

Municipal Requirements:

- that funds result in net incremental capital spending on Public Transit Infrastructure in 2006/07 and do not clawback any current capital funding
- that annual capital spending on transit will not fall below \$6.9 million in 2006/07
- to provide access to records related to funded projects as requested
- to comply with the communications protocol outlined
- to retain title to the resulting infrastructure for at least 10 years
- to invest any funds received in advance of the Municipality incurring and paying Eligible Costs in accordance with Section 100 of the Municipal Government Act
- to provide a Transit Strategy document, as approved by Council, incorporating Transportation Demand Management measures

Reporting:

- HRM will provide a capital budget, including a list of proposed capital projects, with eligible projects identified prior to fund transfer
- an annual expenditure report will be provided each year by July 31, which must include a report on amounts held by the Municipality at year end to be spent on Eligible Projects.

Eligible Projects include:

- rapid transit infrastructure
- rolling stock

- intelligent transport systems
- related capital infrastructure
- accessible transit

Eligible Costs include:

- capital costs
- fees to professionals
- environmental assessments

DISCUSSION

HRM is expecting to receive approximately \$24 million over the next 3 years under the Public Transit Funding Agreement, with \$8.02 million anticipated in 2007/08, \$7.97 million in 2008/09, and \$7.92 million in 2009/10. Funding is conditional upon HRM's full compliance with all terms of the agreement.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

In the 2007/08 capital budget, funding under the Transit Funding program were estimated at \$11.0 million. Recent information indicates that the amount received in 2007/08 will be \$8.02 million.

To accommodate this change, staff is recommending that capital spending be reduced in 2007/08 to offset the reduced level of funding.

HRM still expects to receive \$24 million over the next 3 years through the Public Transit Funding program. Reduced capital spending in 2007/08 will be offset by increased spending in future years and those projects that are scheduled for reduced funding in 2007/08 will receive additional funding in 2008/09 and 2009/10 (see Attachment D).

The recommended reduction will delay the replacement of six conventional transit buses. This delay will likely cause an increase in maintenance and operational costs as the service life of six buses due for replacement will need to be extended. The recommended reduction will not impact

the Conventional Transit Expansion program.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT POLICIES / BUSINESS PLAN

This report complies with the Municipality's Multi-Year Financial Strategy, the approved Operating, Capital and Reserve budgets, policies and procedures regarding withdrawals from the utilization of Capital and Operating reserves, as well as any relevant legislation. Approval of this report will result in a reduction in the Approved Capital Budget.

ALTERNATIVES

Council could select different projects from the eligible projects list (Attachment B) for inclusion under this program.

Council could also look for alternative sources of funding to make up for the shortfall from the Public Transit Funding program in 2007/08. Staff does not recommend this approach as the total Transit capital budget over the 3 year period is essentially unaffected. Using alternative funding sources could negatively impact other capital projects.
