CNSIP Funding Reallocation

ORIGIN

This report originates with staff.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Regional Council approve the CNSIP funding reallocation as per the Discussion Section of this report; and

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to ensure that HRM leverages the maximum amount of federal and provincial funds possible under the Canada-Nova Scotia Infrastructure Program (CNSIP). To do this, it is necessary to reallocate funding amongst already approved projects to align funding with actual spending opportunities/project timelines.

The Mainland Common Recreation Facility is a project within the Canada-Nova Scotia Infrastructure Program (CNSIP). Under the current agreement, approved Federal and Provincial funding is \$2.7 million. HRM needs to spend just over \$4 million to receive this funding. The program requirements state that all funds must be spent by March 31, 2008. This is no longer possible for the Mainland Common Project, which has been progressing at a slower pace than anticipated due to extra time requirements to ensure the facility design supports community expectations and to bring the building program into line with the needs of the 2011 Canada Winter Games.

Community Development and Transportation and Public Works staff currently estimate that HRM can spend approximately \$2.1 million on this project by March 31, 2008, allowing a maximum Federal and Provincial contribution to the project of \$1.4 million.

In addition, as all other projects within CNSIP complete, HRM staff are currently estimating that an additional \$762,000 of funding will need to be reallocated within the existing CNSIP project list due to some projects being delivered with savings (this program closed to new projects on December 31, 2005).

DISCUSSION

CNSIP

To maintain CNSIP involvement in the Mainland Common Project, staff are recommending that the project be segregated into two phases:

Phase 1 Site Development: to provide for site design and site construction for a new recreation facility in the Clayton Park area of HRM.

Phase 2 Facility Construction: to provide for the design and construction of a new recreation facility in the Clayton Park area of HRM. In addition to replacing the existing Northcliffe Recreation Facility which is too small for the growing population of this area, this facility will include a swimming pool, a fitness centre, a gymnasium, community meeting space, a café, and other amenities. The Mainland Common Recreation Centre will be a significant part of the 2011 Canada Winter Games legacy.

Upon receiving appropriate approvals from Regional Council and the CNSIP Management Committee, staff will execute a series of funding swaps. These swaps will provide HRM with the flexibility to retain all available CNSIP funding and maintain the overall integrity of the projects on the approved CNSIP list.

It is important to note that this is not new funding, nor does it add funding to any of the projects, with the exception of the Herring Cove Water and Sewer Project. This reallocation will maintain the integrity of the Mainland Common Recreation Centre as currently approved in the HRM Capital Budget.

It is also important to note that the exact amount of CNSIP funding surplus to be reallocated will be adjusted as projects are finalized and closed. As amounts are finalized, staff will adjust the funding reallocation appropriately while adhering to the principles presented in this report.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

There are no budget implications associated with the recommendations. The recommendation reallocates existing funding to support the requirements of the existing projects.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT POLICIES / BUSINESS PLAN

This report complies with the Municipality's Multi-Year Financial Strategy, the approved Operating, Capital and Reserve budgets, policies and procedures regarding withdrawals from the utilization of Capital and Operating reserves, as well as any relevant legislation.

ALTERNATIVES

There are no viable alternatives. If funding is not reallocated, HRM faces significant risk of losing the funding. The funding lost would then have to be allocated from other projects within the HRM Capital Budget to maintain the integrity of the Mainland Common Recreation Facility.
