Streets Inside the Core Area; Lexington Court and Wilshire Close -

Central Region

ORIGIN

The 2007/08 Capital Budget.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Council award Tender No. 07-276, New Paving of Subdivision Streets Inside the Core Area; Lexington Court and Wilshire Close - Central Region to Dexter Construction Company Limited for a Total Tender Price of \$173,967.58 (net HST included) with funding from Capital Account No. CXU00715, New Paving of Subdivision Streets Inside the Core Area, as outlined in the Budget Implications section of this report.

BACKGROUND

The Approved 2007/08 Capital Budget includes funds for the paving of Lexington Court and Wilshire Close.

DISCUSSION

Tenders were called on August 29, 2007 and closed on September 6, 2007. Bids were received from the following companies:

The scope of work for this tender generally consists of the installation of new asphalt, shoulder gravels and associated reinstatement.

It is anticipated that work will commence within two weeks of the tender award and take three weeks to complete.

This is a **UNIT PRICE** contract and the cost will be dependent upon the actual quantities measured and approved by the HRM Project Manager.

The installation of new paving is subject to Local Improvement Charges. Local Improvement Charges will be based on a charge per foot of frontage and will be recovered by way of frontage charges to the abutting property owners.

Property owners on Lexington Court were successfully petitioned for paving in 2003 at a proposed rate of \$20.00 per linear foot. Due to the higher cost of asphalt and construction, the cost of paving has increased and therefore, it is anticipated LIC rates will be higher than on this petition. Councillor Meade has requested that the right to petition be waived and that the property owners will be responsible for paying the Local Improvement Charges associated with installation of new paving. All property owners on Lexington Court have been notified in writing of Councillor Meade's decision. The property owners on Wilshire Close were successfully petitioned in 2005 at an interim rate of \$30.00 per linear foot.

On April 25, 2006, Halifax Regional Council approved a blended actual costs approach in determining the rate of Local Improvement Charges. The rate will be set once the tenders have been completed and the final costs determined.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Based on the lowest tendered price of \$173,967.58, including net HST, funding is available in the Approved 2007/08 Capital Budget from Account No. CXU00715 - New Paving of Subdivision Streets Inside the Core Area. The budget availability has been confirmed by Financial Services.



Re: Paving of Wilshire Court- Stillwater Lake Limits Buckingham Drive to Cul-de-sac

In order to facilitate the process used to determine which streets are to be included in future Cost Sharing Programs for the consideration by the Nova Scotia Department of Transportation and Public Works (NSDOT&PW) and HRM Council, we are attaching a survey.

The purpose of this survey is to ascertain if there is sufficient support from property owners regarding the proposed paving of Wilshire Court. If NSDOT&PW and HRM Council approve this project, paving will be subject to Local Improvement Charges as stated in By-Law Number S-400. The Local Improvement Charges will be based on 50% of the actual cost invoiced by NSDOT&PW. Therefore the frontage charge will vary from year to year.

Final billings for all Local Improvement Projects are payable over a 10 year period, with the first installment due 30 days after the billing date. Installments are due on the anniversary date of the original billing, until the full debt is paid. This billing may also be paid in full at any time if the abutter so desires. The unpaid balance is subject to an interest charge at the rate of 2% above the Municipality's bankers Prime Rate of Interest at the time the project is approved by Halifax Regional Council.

If you are in agreement to pay the interim rate of \$30.00 per linear foot frontage of your property for paving please sign and return the attached agreement by **May 27, 2005** to:

<u>Paving - Lexington Court - Stillwater Lake</u> <u>Limits from Abbey Road to end</u>

The property owners on Lexington Court were successfully petitioned for paving in 2003 at a proposed LIC rate of \$20.00 per linear foot. Unfortunately, due to the high cost of asphalt and construction, the Local Improvement Rate at this time could be as high as \$30.00 per linear foot.

Councillor Meade has decided not to repetition the residents since Lexington Court has been on the paving list for a number of years and HRM has received many phone calls requesting the paving be completed ASAP. Pursuant to the Municipal Government Act and HRM Local Improvement Policy, the Councillor for the area has the right to waive the petition process with Council's approval. Councillor Meade is choosing to exercise this right. Therefore; the property owners will be responsible for paying the Local Improvement Charges associated with installation of the new paving. On April 25, 2006, Halifax Regional Council approved a blended actual costs approach in setting the LIC. The rate will be set once all tenders have been completed and final cost is known.

The Local Improvement Charge amount payable may, at the option of the owner of the property, be paid in equal annual installments for a period not exceeding ten years. Installments are due on the anniversary date of the original billing, until the full debt is paid. This billing may also be paid in full at any time, without interest penalty, if the abutter so desires. The unpaid balance is subject to an interest rate based on the maximum of the prime rate as set by the Royal Bank of Canada plus 2% at time of notification.
