SUBJECT: Release of Funds - Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Fund

ORIGIN

The Springfield Lake Recreation Association, who manages the Weir Field in Sackville on behalf of the HRM, is requesting up to \$27,000 from the Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Q124 to replace and upgrade amenities of the artificial surface.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that:

- 1. Council approve an increase in Capital Project CP300791 Weir Field Upgrades, in the amount of \$27,000 with funding from the Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Fund, Q124, to cover the cost of capital maintenance and other related expenditures for this asset as outlined in the discussion section of this report.
- 2. Council approve an unbudgeted withdrawal from Reserve Q124 Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Fund.

BACKGROUND

On June 13, 2003, the Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Fund was implemented to provide a financial vehicle for the allocation of funds to offset the costs of future upgrading, repairs, or replacement of the artificial turf field and amenities at the Weir Field in Upper Sackville. The field and facilities are currently managed by the Springfield Lake Recreation Association, through a management agreement with the Halifax Regional Municipality.

The source of funding for this reserve has been 75% of all user fees from the artificial turf facilities located at the Weir Field in Upper Sackville. These funds shall be transferred by the Association to HRM on a quarterly basis.

DISCUSSION

The Reserve is primarily intended to provide some funding for the replacement and upgrading of the artificial surface on the Weir Property. The expected time frame for field upgrading or replacement is 10 to 12 years. To date the Reserve has accumulated \$205,384 after seven (7) years of operation.

Funds from this Reserve should also be available to either fully offset the replacement or upgrading of amenities of the artificial surfaces. The cost of replacement has been estimated to be \$450,000 to \$500,000. It is anticipated that the Reserve Fund will generate up to \$300,000 for the turf replacement. The remaining funds could be available through the Provincial Development Facility Fund or through the Municipality's Capital Funding Program.

To ensure the integrity of the facility, Springfield Lake Recreation Association has identified the following needs: re-keying the facility, installing netting, extending the fencing, and paving the gravel area between the field and parking lot. The cost of this work is estimated at \$27,000.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Funds are available through an increase in the budget of Capital Account CP300791 Weir Field Upgrades with funding of \$27,000 from Upper Sackville Turf Capital Reserve Fund, Q124.
