ORIGIN

2007-2008 Operation Budget

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Council award Tender No.07-037, for Two (2) Rapid Deployment Inflatable Shelters to Dynamic Air Shelter Ltd. for material and services specified, for a Total Tender Price of \$146,240.37 (net HST included) with funding from Operational Account No. F181-6701 - USAR Project/Equipment Purchase as outlined in the Budget Implications section of this report.

BACKGROUND

These inflatable shelters are part of the equipment cache for Canada Task Force 5. The Federal Government entered into partnership with 4 municipalities and 1 province to provide Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) capabilities that could respond regionally as well as nationally to disaster sites. These 5 teams, Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto, Manitoba and Halifax are required to be able to support themselves in the field for 72 hours, initial deployment and up to 10 days with re supply. The shelters are required for housing the various components of the team at a disaster site, including Command and Communications, Medical, Logistics, Barracks and Cook house. The Halifax Team is expected to be ready for deployment by late 2009 with a complement of 65 persons.

This program, under Public Safety Canada, is cost shared 75/25 with the municipality responsible for the 25%. When development of the team is advanced there is an Ongoing and Maintenance program to provide funding for the programs sustainment. Equipment is purchased through application to the Joint Emergency Preparedness Program (JEPP) which has funds set aside specifically for this USAR program. Equipment requirements have been established by Public Safety Canada and the participating teams. Purchases under JEPP are made by the municipality and the costs are submitted to the Federal Government prior to April 1 for reimbursement of the 75%.

DISCUSSION

Tenders were publicly advertised on February 7 and February 10, 2007 and closed on February 14, 2007. Bids were received from the following company:

Four other bids were disqualified after review by staff as they do not meet specifications for these units. These were from K&D Pratt, Micmac Fire & Safety Ltd., Atlantic Aero Marine Supply and Manufacturing Ltd., and Century Vallen.

The recommendation to award this tender was delayed since March, 2007, so that funding would be secured in both 2007-2008 operating budget and through JEPP. Since the close of this tender an additional shelter is required for a total of three (3). Dynamic Air Shelter Ltd. agrees to hold their pricing and provide an additional shelter for \$48,746.79 net HST included for a total tender amount of \$146,240.37.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Based on the lowest tendered price, meeting specifications, of \$146,240.37, including net HST, funding is available in the 2007/2008 Fire Operating budget from Operations Account No. F181-6701 - USAR Project/Equipment Purchase. The budget availability has been confirmed by Financial Services.

This procurement was estimated at \$146,240.37 in the 2007/2008 Operations budget. Remaining funds will be used for future USAR requirements.

As a result of cost sharing from Public Safety Canada, Joint Emergency Preparedness Program (JEPP), the net cost to Operations Account No. F181-6701 - USAR Project/Equipment Purchase is \$36,560.09. This project satisfies the requirements under the JEPP program, and the pre- approved federal contribution of \$109,680.28 will be transferred into this account.
