



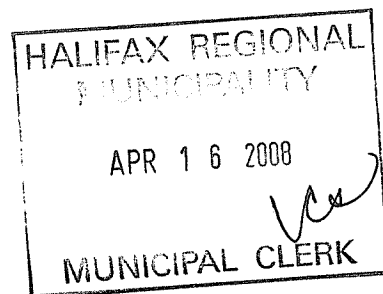


Your Worship,

This year's Battle of the Atlantic Parade and Ceremony honouring the men and women who gave their lives in wartime service on and over the Atlantic will occur at 11:00 AM Sunday, 4 May 2008. The ceremony will consist of a military parade and a brief religious service at the Halifax Memorial (Sailors' Memorial) in Point Pleasant Park. In addition, wreath laying will occur at the Halifax Memorial, and just off Point Pleasant Park by one of our Maritime Coastal Defence Vessels.

In conjunction with the ceremony, it is also planned to have an aircraft from Canadian Forces Base Greenwood conduct a symbolic fly-past. We are planning to have an Aurora long-range patrol aircraft overhead, during a wreath laying by a Sea King helicopter over the water adjacent to Point Pleasant Park. As such, it is requested that the Halifax Regional Municipality grant permission for the Canadian Forces to fly an Aurora long-range patrol aircraft over Point Pleasant Park as per the enclosed diagram, (routed from sea off the harbour approaches and turning inland to fly directly over the Halifax Memorial) at an altitude of 500 feet above the highest obstacles. This event will occur at approximately 10:59 AM on Sunday, 4 May 2008.

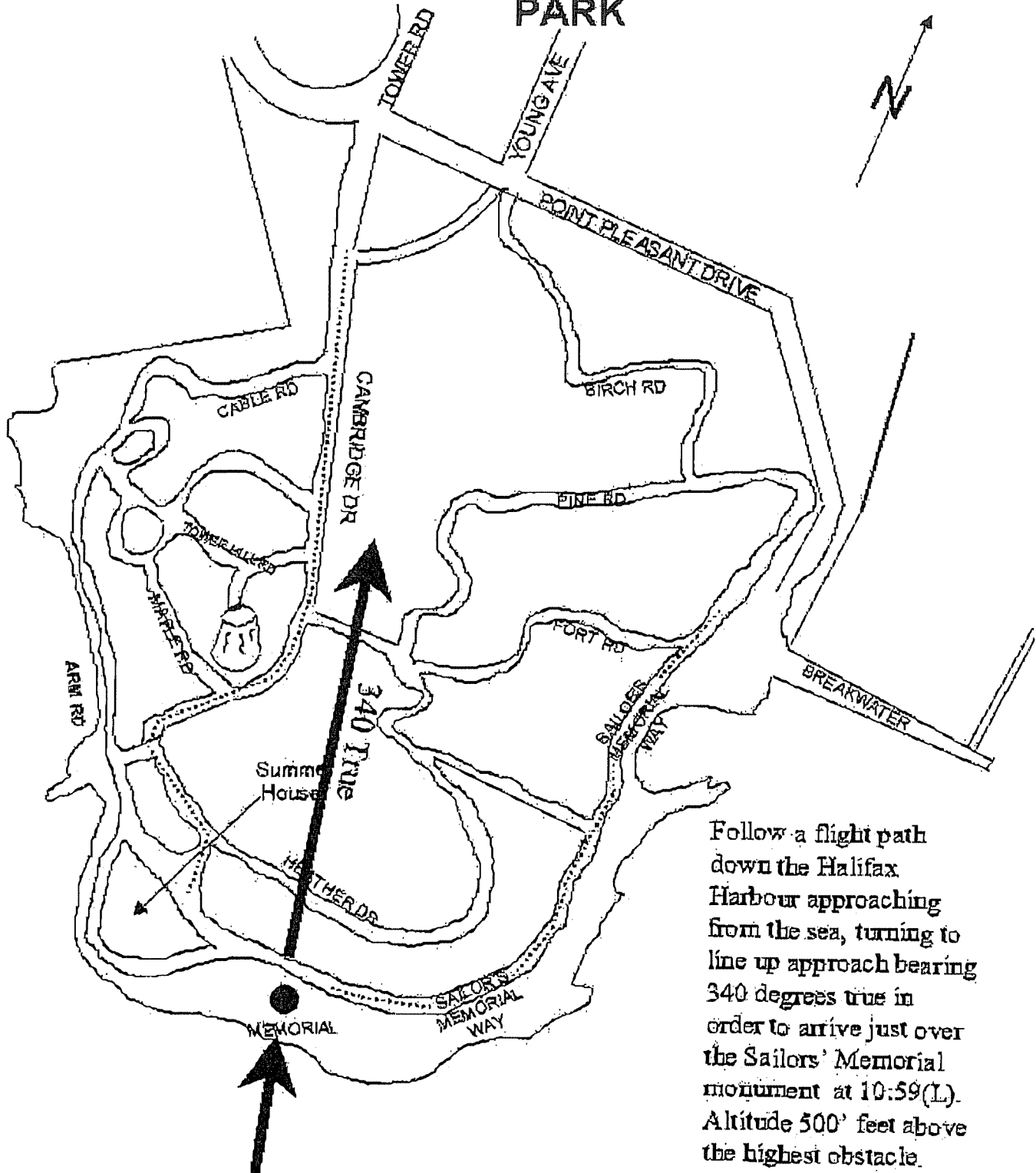

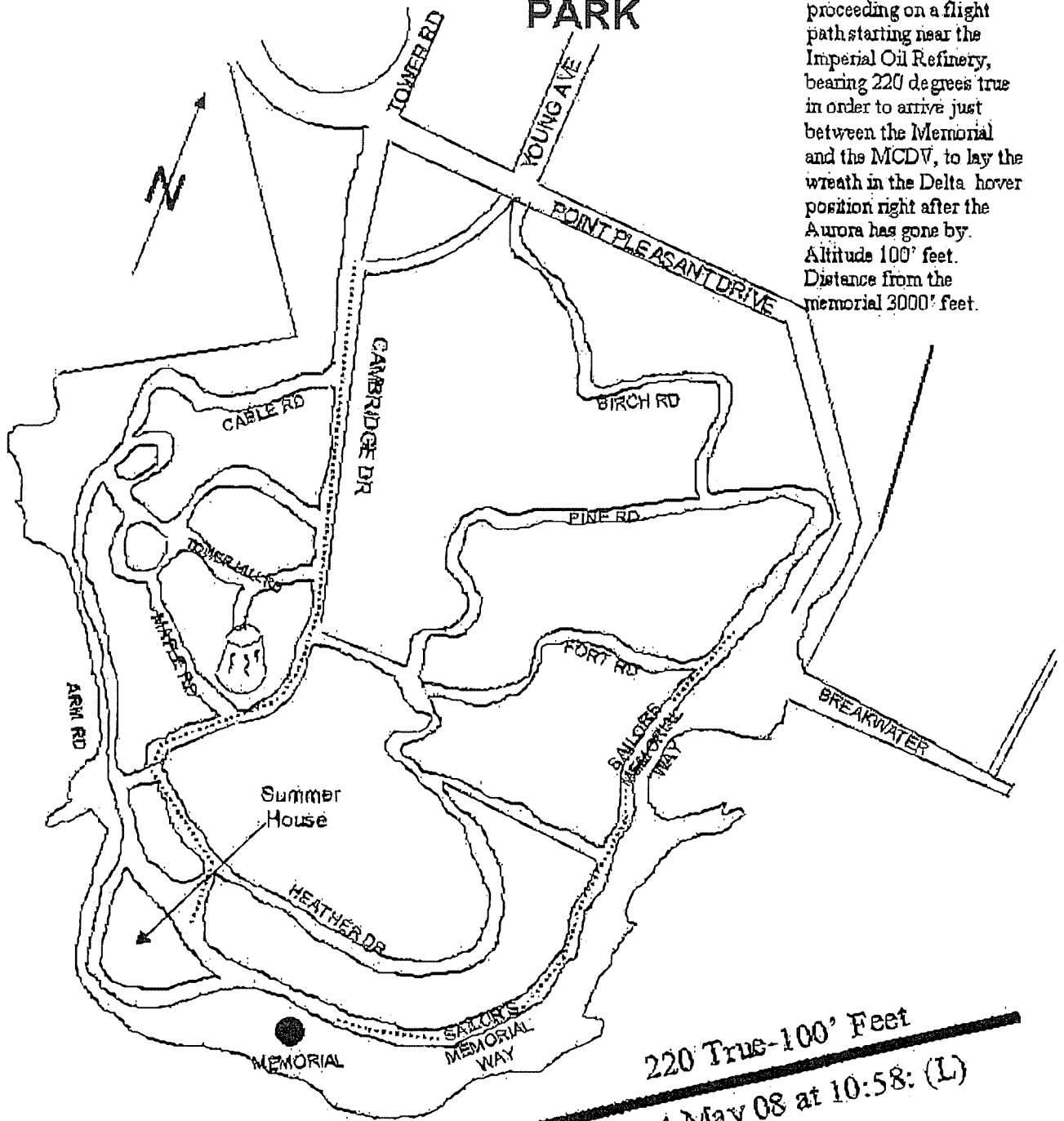
POINT PLEASANT PARK



Follow a flight path down the Halifax Harbour approaching from the sea, turning to line up approach bearing 340 degrees true in order to arrive just over the Sailors' Memorial monument at 10:59(L). Altitude 500' feet above the highest obstacle.

POINT PLEASANT PARK

While the Aurora makes its approach to Point Pleasant Park, begin proceeding on a flight path starting near the Imperial Oil Refinery, bearing 220 degrees true in order to arrive just between the Memorial and the MCDV, to lay the wreath in the Delta hover position right after the Aurora has gone by. Altitude 100' feet. Distance from the memorial 3000' feet.
