SUBJECT: Economic Action Plan – Extension on Project Completion Dates

ORIGIN

On December 2, 2010, the Federal Government announced an extension to the Economic Action Plan (EAP) deadline of March 31, 2011 to October 31, 2011.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council approve the resolution to request extensions to the March 31, 2011 deadline for funding of projects under the Federal Government's Economic Action Plan, included with this report as Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

The Government of Canada's Economic Action Plan (EAP) provided funding for projects that were construction ready and could be substantially completed by March 31, 2011.

The Infrastructure Stimulus Fund (ISF) targeted \$4-billion for the rehabilitation and construction of new projects. An additional \$500 million was approved under the Recreational Infrastructure Canada Program (RInC).

HRM has applied for and received \$22 million in Federal and Provincial contributions for eleven projects under ISF, and \$1.9 million in Federal contributions for five projects under RInC. The total value of the work, including HRM contributions, is \$38.9 million.

Under the terms of the Contribution Agreements for both ISF and RInC, all projects need to be completed by March 31, 2011.

On December 2, 2010, the Federal Government extended the deadline for the work to be completed to **October 31, 2011.** Approximately 10 per cent of the 23,000 infrastructure projects across Canada will likely miss the original deadline of March 31, 2011.

DISCUSSION

While the majority of the HRM funds are currently spent and the remainder COULD be spent by March 31, 2011, there are a number of projects that will benefit from a seven month extension to October 31, 2011. Extending the deadline for completion is significant because it allows another construction season to complete projects.

To qualify for an extension, projects must have begun work and incurred eligible costs by March 31, 2011, and a Council resolution is required which commits to finishing the projects and accepting responsibility for any costs incurred beyond October 31, 2011.

In addition, a forecast of project expenses that will be spent and federal funding that will be claimed by March 31, 2011; a forecast of how much will be incurred between April 1 and October 31, 2011; and a detailed construction schedule signed by a professional engineer, are required. Staff can provide this information if the resolution is approved by Council.

Amended Contribution Agreements will be prepared by the Canada/Nova Scotia Infrastructure Secretariat and must be signed no later than February 28, 2011.

This extension does <u>not</u> apply to projects that are funded under the National Historic Sites of Canada Cost Sharing Program. This program funds the Public Gardens bandstand and the Memorial (Dingle) Tower projects.

ISF Project Summary

Notes

Washmill Lake Court Underpass

This report does <u>not</u> deal with this project. Budget availability and a request for an extension to complete the Washmill Lake Court Underpass project, is the subject of a separate report to Regional Council.

It is proposed to request a deadline extension on three other ISF projects for the reasons described below:

¹ - Staff is currently negotiating with our funding partners regarding opportunities to re-allocate un-spent funds.

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<u>Burnside North Trunk Sewer</u> - An extension would allow final landscaping and slope construction to be completed in spring conditions.

<u>Point Pleasant Park Upgrades</u> - an extension would allow concrete and other work to be carried out in the spring at a reduced cost.

<u>Ernst Mill Bridge</u> - Although the work is completed, there is a dispute with the contractor that could delay submitting the final claim beyond March 31, 2011.

RInC Project Summary

The following table summarizes the status of projects that are funded by the RInC program:

Sport Court Upgrades	\$ 750,000	Acrylic Coating and asphalt delayed due to weather
Centennial Pool Renovations	\$3,000,000	Under construction. Project delayed and behind schedule
Dartmouth Sportsplex	\$ 960,000	Under construction, on schedule, and within budget
Portland Hills Trail	\$ 600,000	Under construction, on schedule, and within budget

It is proposed to request deadline extensions on three of the RInC projects for the reasons described below:

Bedford Lions Pool

The spray coat, solar panels, and landscaping cannot be completed until spring, 2011.

Sport Court Upgrades

Acrylic Coating and asphalt were delayed and cannot be completed until spring, 2011.

Centennial Pool

The project was delayed due to coordination with current programming and cannot be completed by March 31, 2011.

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BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

There are no budget implications. HRM's portion is included in previous year's budgets. The recommendation to extend the project deadline will ensure HRM leverages as much external funding as possible, and take full advantage of the terms outlined in the contribution agreement.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT POLICIES/BUSINESS PLAN

This report complies with the Municipality's Multi-Year Financial Strategy, the approved Operating, Project and Reserve budgets, policies and procedures regarding withdrawals from the utilization of Project and Operating reserves, as well as any relevant legislation.

Not applicable.

ALTERNATIVES

Council could decide to not request extensions to ISF projects. This is not recommended for the reasons outlined in this report.

WHEREAS the federal and provincial governments will make a one-time extension of the deadline for funding of projects under the Infrastructure Stimulus Fund and the Building Canada Fund – Communities Top-Up from March 31, 2011 to October 31, 2011;

AND WHEREAS the Halifax Regional Municipality has asked the provincial government for an extension to federal and provincial funding to October 31, 2011 for the following projects:
