Background – Rate Increase

- Last rate increase was October 2005 based on fuel costs which were at an all time high of \$1.40 per litre. Shortly afterward fuel prices began to decline.
- Industry submitted a proposal on June 24, 2011, requesting a general rate increase of 10%. This proposal increased a 10 km taxi trip to \$19.47.
- Staff considered the industry's proposal and a 5 year
 CPI increase at 8.9%

Rate Increase

- Rate Increase 8.9% rate increase included a drop rate of \$3.09, which required a rounding up to \$3.10. This created a new blended rate of 9.07% equating to a 10km trip costing \$19.49
- Rate increase of 9.07% reflected on Cruise Ship, Airport and Limousine rates
- Additionally

Extra Passenger Rate - increases from \$.50 to \$.70 New - Bridge Toll fee of \$.80



Background- Extension of Zones

- June 17, 2008, Regional Council defeated a motion to eliminate zones however there was approval to open zones from Friday 11:00 p.m. to Saturday 3:00 a.m. and Saturday 11:00 p.m. to Sunday 3:00 a.m.
- Subsequently, September of 2009 and January of 2010, Regional Council considered amending zoning legislation. Both the September recommendation to extend the open zones to seven days a week and the January recommendation to eliminate zones were not approved.
- Council has repeatedly decided not to eliminate zones



Background- Extension of Zones

- In 2010 Dr. Don Clairmont and the Mayor's Round Table Report on Violence indicated that an absence of transportation in the downtown was contributing to a lack of public safety.
- Current zone restrictions remain an obstacle to enhancing public safety. Staff are therefore recommending the zone hours be extended in accordance with HRP's request.

 Assaults in the core since 2008 have declined with the introduction of the original zone extensions. It is expected that a further extension of the zones would reduce the calls.



General Amendments

- Recovery of costs for cleaning or repairs to vehicle caused by passenger
- Taxi roof light illumination turned off when not available for service
- Allow the licensing of 5 or more passenger door vehicles
- Allow existing owners to put names on waiting list for other zones if they have appropriate driver license



General Amendments

- Re-application waiting period for terminated conditional drivers licenses reduced to six months from one year
- Steamer Trunk rate removed
- Multiple taxi and limousine driver licenses consolidated into a single driver license with a 2 year term
- Smoking no longer permitted in vehicles for hire
- Conditional licenses issued to owners awaiting completion of National Certification and/or Criminal Record Reports
- Allow winter rims on vehicles for a specified period of time
- Corporate owned owner licenses become non transferable
- Allow the licensed airport drivers to charge the fares set out by the Halifax Stanfield International Airport
