## Highlanders Freedom of the City <br> August 22, 2014

The Halifax Regional Municipality in the Province of Nova Scotia brings greetings and good wishes to the $78^{\text {th }}$ Highlanders on this $22^{\text {nd }}$ day of August 2014.

The 78 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Highlanders and Royal Artillery at the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site of Canada under the direction of the Halifax Citadel Regimental Association have continued to play an important role in Halifax's tradition by promoting its long and proud military history to our citizens and visitors alike.

In recognition of their continued service, I am pleased to read the following Proclamation:
The 78th Highlanders and Royal Artillery have served the Halifax Regional Municipality, surrounding communities, and the Province of Nova Scotia, through their continued efforts in living history while in garrison at the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site of Canada, and by bringing this living history to areas within the region; and

The $7^{\text {d }}$ Highlanders have carried the image and the goodwill messages from the Halifax Regional Municipality and the Province of Nova Scotia from coast to coast in the USA, Canada and overseas; and
