International Day of Disabled Persons December 3rd, 2014

WHEREAS there are over 1 billion people living in the world with some form of disability;

Persons with disabilities not only face physical barriers but also social, economic and attitudinal barriers. Persons with disabilities are the world's largest minority group. Persons with disabilities and the issue of disability has remained largely invisible in the mainstream development frameworks and its processes;

On March 11, 2010 Canada ratified the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, with Nova Scotia providing its support. The theme of the 2014 International Day of Persons with Disabilities is 'Sustainable Development: The Promise of Technology';

The aim of this theme is to work to harness the power of technology to promote inclusion and accessibility to help realize the full and equal participation of persons with disabilities in society and shape the future of sustainable development for all!

THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Mayor Mike Savage, on behalf of Halifax Regional Council, do hereby proclaim, December 3, 2014 as "International Day of Disabled Persons" in Halifax and that 'ability starts here' in Nova Scotia through the 'power of participation of Persons with Disabilities.
