SUBJECT:	Advanced Funding Approval for the Proposed 2015/16 Capital Budget

## <u>ORIGIN</u>

This report originates from the Approved 2014-15 Project Budget and the preliminary 2015-16 Capital Budget.

## LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Charter, section 93(1) – The Council shall make estimates of the sums that are required by the Municipality for the fiscal year; Halifax Charter, section 79(1) – Specifies areas that the Council may expend money required by the Municipality.

## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council:

Approve advanced capital funding to project account CR990002, Municipal Operations State of Good Repair, for 2015/16 in the amount of \$2,100,000 as per the Financial Implications of this report.

## BACKGROUND

Early approval of project CR990002, Municipal Operations – State of Good Repair, is desirable as it enables staff to tender items on a timely basis, in advance of the peak construction season. This account includes activities such as: concrete sidewalks, drainage projects, bridges, guiderails, retaining walls and concrete curbs.

### DISCUSSION

The present timing of the approval of HRM's Capital Program Budget reduces staff's ability to take advantage of early year tendering. This is significant for three reasons:

- 1. Being able to take advantage of historically lower tendered prices from contractors for projects tendered early in the year;
- 2. Being able to make full use of the peak construction period to implement projects which are sensitive to time and weather;
- 3. Being able to tender projects that require longer lead time to order customized material; reducing or eliminating delays in construction.

Advanced approval of Project CR990002, Municipal Operations – State of Good Repair, will address the above issues and enable staff to get a much earlier start on tendering, contract awards and carrying out the necessary work. The project is of a high priority nature based on existing infrastructure conditions and is of a seasonal nature making an early start advantageous.

The normal public tendering process will still apply to this project.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The requested advanced funding amount is \$2,100,000 for Project CR990002, Municipal Operations – State of Good Repair, and, if approved, will become part of the approved 2015/16 Capital Budget. The funding source for this project will be debt or Capital from Operating.

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

There is no community engagement associated with this report.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no environmental implications associated with this report.

## ALTERNATIVES

Delay the recommendation and defer to the approval of the 2015/16 Capital Budget. This is not recommended for the reasons outlined in the body of the report.
