


**EPILEPSY MONTH
MARCH, 2002**


PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS** Epilepsy is a seizure disorder involving abnormal electrical discharges from the brain and in 50% of the cases the cause is unknown, and treatment and prevention are not easily determined; and
- WHEREAS** Approximately 9,500 Nova Scotians have epilepsy and 75 percent of all incidences of epilepsy begin in childhood ; and
- WHEREAS** Modern drug therapy allows half of all people who live with epilepsy to lead seizure free lives but lack of knowledge and understanding of the disorder may result in discrimination and prejudice against those who have epilepsy; and
- WHEREAS** The Epilepsy Association of Nova Scotia is a provincial health organization providing support for people with epilepsy, promoting awareness, advocacy and understanding, and encouraging research into the causes, treatment and prevention of epilepsy.

THEREFORE, I, Peter J. Kelly, Mayor of the Halifax Regional Municipality, do hereby proclaim March, 2002, as **EPILEPSY MONTH** in the Halifax Regional Municipality to help increase public awareness of the effects of this common neurological condition upon those who live with epilepsy.
