


## CANADIAN HIVIAIDS AWARENESS WEEK WORLD AIDS DAY NOVEMBER 24 - DECEMBER 1, 2002 PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) estimates that more tan 40 million people are infected with the Human immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) world-wide:
- WHEREAS
  UNAIDS has called upon governments, organizations and individuals to recognize the week of November 24 to December 1, 2002 as HIV/AIDS Awareness Week and World AIDS Day with the theme "Stigma and Discrimination," the goals of which are:
  - to raise awareness of HIV/AIDS, challenge discrimination towards those affected of infected with HIV/AIDS;
  - to challenge stigma and discrimination based on gender, sexual orientation, culture, ethnicity and race as it relates to HIV/AIDS, and
  - to promote and support HIV prevention efforts.
- WHEREAS Health Canada estimates that almost 50,000 Canadians are currently living with HIV/AIDS and 15,000 Canadians are unaware they are infected.
- WHEREAS the number of Canadians living with HIV/AIDS continues to increase with approximately 4,2000 new infections each year;
- WHEREAS in the absence of a cure or vaccine, education is our only defense against HIV/AIDS, and
- WHEREAS Canadian HIV/AIDS Awareness Week and World AIDS Day offer an opportunity to enhance tolerance and understanding while communication prevention information about the epidemic,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, I, Peter J. Kelly, Mayor of the Hallfax Regional Municipality, do hereby proclaim November 24 to December 1, 2002 Canadian HIV/AIDS Awareness Week and December 1, 2002 World AIDS Day for the Halifax Regional Municipality.
