Deadman's Island- Update

INFORMATION REPORT

ORIGIN

Request by Councillor Mosher for update on project.

DISCUSSION:

Staff from Tourism, Culture and Heritage and the Parks and Recreation business units have been assisting the Deadman's Island Committee for two years. The project has four parts: Organization, Communication, Site Development and Historic Designation.

- The committee is organized and meeting on a quarterly basis with staff.
- A professional research study has been completed that provides information for communication of key messages related to the War of 1812.
- A public pathway to Deadman's Island was designed and recently completed. This work was funded by the Heritage & Cultural Tourism Reserve.
- An application has been prepared and submitted to the National Historic Sites and Monuments Board. It is our understanding that it will be reviewed this Fall.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

There is a 2002- 2003 Capital Budget allocation for the Public Access project of \$85,000 within the Heritage & Cultural Tourism Reserve. The trail development portion of this project has been completed.
