## **ORIGIN**

Proposed 2003/04 Capital Budget Account CB200516 for Integrated Dispatch and Telecommunications Project.

## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that RFP 03-150 - Architectural Design Services - Phase I Integrated Telecommunications and Dispatch Centre be awarded to the highest ranking evaluated proposal, John Doucet Architects Limited for a cost of \$91,500, plus net HST for a total of \$97,382.54 from Capital Account CB200516, with funding authorized as per the Budget Implications section of this report, and pending Council approval of the 2003/04 Capital Budget.

### **BACKGROUND**

In keeping with Council's mission to ensure that HRM Programs and services contribute to the high quality of life in the community and in support of safe communities and excellence in service delivery, staff have undertaken a number of related projects. These projects will form an important foundation piece for the **Integrated City** and include:

- ► The CAD/RMS (computer Aided dispatch/Records Management) Project
- **▶** The Civic Address Project
- ► The TMR (Trunk Mobile Radio) Project
- ► The IDTC (Integrated Dispatch Telecommunications) Project

Phase I of the Integrated Dispatch Telecommunications Centre will see the design and build out of the last remaining undeveloped section of the main floor of the Eric Spicer Municipal Building at 21 Mount Hope Avenue, Dartmouth. The facility will provide a new home for HRM existing 911 Centre as well as provide capacity to allow HRM to carry out all emergency call taking and dispatch services for Fire and Emergency Services, Regional Police Services and our partners in the RCMP. In addition, the facility will provide the space required to adequately provide for redundant systems required for 911, security systems and the future expansion that is likely to be required in a growing community.

It is expected the design and construction phase will be completed in May 2004 and the timing of the Records Management System and the Computer Assisted Dispatch projects have been adjusted to coincide with the construction phase.

The combined elements of this project will become an important cornerstone of the Integrated City.

An evaluation team consisting of staff of Real Property and Asset Management, Recreation Culture and Heritage, and Procurement evaluated the proposal on the following basis:

Attachment "A" provides the detailed breakdown of the total scoring and fees. Proposals were evaluated on the basis of combined fees for Phase I (emergency dispatch build out) and Phase II (non emergency dispatch build out) of the project. However, this contract award is only for Phase I work identified in the 2003/04 Capital Budget. Award of the Phase II consulting work is contingent upon Council approval of future year budget submissions. At that time HRM has the option, but is not obligated, to award the second phase to the current successful proponent. This is a fixed price award.
