INFORMATION REPORT

ORIGIN

This report originates from staff.

BACKGROUND

On July 15, 2003, HRM Council passed a resolution that HRM enter in an Agreement with Dexter Construction Company Limited for: (a) the design, planning, engineering, procurement, construction and commissioning of the Sewage Collection Systems, Roads and Outfalls and Diffusers forming part of the Halifax Harbour Solutions Project in each of Halifax, Dartmouth and Herring Cove; (b) the procurement, construction and commissioning of the Mengoni Avenue Site Expansion for a price not to exceed \$116,164,000, plus taxes and inflation, and on the terms and conditions reviewed by Council on July 15, 2003, and (c) Halifax Harbour Advisory Committee be authorized to review and approve the final form of the Agreement before it is executed on behalf of HRM. This report provides a status update of progress with the sewage collection system portion of the Harbour Solutions Project.

DISCUSSION

The Halifax Harbour Advisory Committee met on August 11, 2003, and passed a resolution that HRM enter into Project Agreements for the Halifax Harbour Solutions Project substantially in the form of the August 7, 2003, drafts presented to and reviewed by the Halifax Harbour Advisory Committee for a price not to exceed \$115,694,000 plus inflation and taxes.

The Project Agreements consisted of five agreements with Dexter Construction Company Limited, namely an Infrastructure Development Agreement, Halifax License, Dartmouth License, Herring Cove License, and Mengoni Avenue Site License. The Infrastructure Development Agreement covers the Collection Systems, Roads and Outfalls and Diffusers for the three sewage treatment plants, and the Mengoni Avenue Site Expansion.

Staff finalised the agreements and the final Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) will be no more than \$115,694,000 plus inflation and taxes. These agreements were executed on August 15, 2003.

The effective date of the contract occurs once Dexter Construction has bonds and insurance in place which will be no later than August 29, 2003, unless agreed to by HRM. Staff anticipates further contract savings as a result of the final cost of bonds and insurance being less than the capped amounts in the GMP.

While administrative and design work is already well under way by Dexter, construction can begin once HRM has reviewed the plans and manuals required by the contract. HRM has 10 days after the effective date of the contract for the review. Staff is committed to completing the review rapidly to allow construction to commence as close to the effective date as possible.

The following summary shows the draft construction schedule for the next year by reflecting the month in which each construction component is starting. It should be noted that discussions and refinements of this schedule are continually ongoing and that HRM still needs to review the traffic management plan.
